COMMUNITY RALLIES FOR TARA

Tara Garman is an energetic seven-year-old girl who lives in Cumberland County. Last May, Tara was diagnosed with Juvenile Batten Disease. This disease is a neurodegenerative disease with no known treatment or cure. It



is fatal and progressive in nature and will take away Tara's ability to speak, move, see, remember and eat one by one.

Prior to receiving an experimental stem cell transplant at Duke University in Durham, North Carolina, in December, Tara had chemo treatments. Although the long term outcome is uncertain, Tara's parents believe this was the best option to save her high level of function and quality of life. The transplant required her to remain in the hospital for at least 8 weeks. Following her stay in the hospital, Tara and her mother stayed at the Ronald McDonald House for 4 months so she could go for her daily clinic visits. They are home but still need to make occasional trips for treatments.

Not only were these two ladies away from their family for 4 months, Tara's mother had left her nursing job so she could be with Tara. This means one less paycheck during treatments. Tara's parents are willing to sell their cars and home—whatever it takes to help their little girl.

The community has rallied around Tara and her family to help with the cost of the transplant and living expenses when she and her mother stay in North Carolina.

Numerous fundraisers have been planned; some have been completed; some are ongoing.




