2017 MD-14 STATE CONVENTION

Ballot Question

To be voted upon May 21, 2017 at Seven Springs Mountain Resort, Champion, PA

THE FOLLOWING RESOLUTION CONCERNS THE BY-LAWS. (THIS AMENDMENT TO THE BY-LAWS REQUIRES A MAJORITY VOTE TO ADOPT.)

A RESOLUTION TO PROVIDE A CHANGE IN THE DISTRIBUTION OF UNUSED FUNDS FOR THE DISTRICT GOVERNORS INTERNATIONAL EXPENSE FUNDS AS LISTED IN ARTICLE VI, SECTION 5. IF APPROVED, THE LAST SENTENCE IN ARTICLE VI, SECTION 5, WILL BE REVISED TO REFLECT A RETURN OF UNUSED FUNDS TO THE GENERAL ADMINISTRATIVE ACCOUNT.

THIS REVISION IS TO CHANGE THE POLICY OF ROLLING OVER UNUSED FUNDS IN THE DISTRICT GOVERNORS INTERNATIONAL EXPENSE FUND.

BE IT RESOLVED, that Article VI, Section 5, will have a revised last sentence that will read as follows: Any unused funds will be returned to the General administrative account for purposes of meeting the operating budget.

Families Together In Lionism: The Freelands Of Plainfield

This month we are pleased to highlight another hardworking volunteer Lions couple. We had a lot of Lions to choose from. As we searched through the northern end of our district, we came upon Jill and Lamar “Peck” Freeland from the Plainfield Lions Club.

Lion Jill is currently serving in her second term as President, having rotated through the ranks on both occasions. Her husband, Lion Lamar, has been through the officer rotation four or five times and has also served as a zone chairperson.

Jill grew up in Sunbury, while Lamar hails from Newport. Both met while at Bloomsburg College, married 57 years ago, and went together to the Carlisle Area School district, where she spent her career in elementary education and he taught business classes at the high school. Lamar was introduced to Lionism by Jill’s elementary school principal, who had been active in the Newville Lions Club and was then forming the Plainfield Lions Club in 1959.

Lamar’s teaching and coaching responsibilities took priority in life, and he was unable to remain active with Plainfield until shortly before his retirement from teaching, about 20 years ago. Like other “Lion wives” of the time, Jill always could be counted on to help out with Lions fundraising and community projects, and she also enjoyed traveling with Lamar to everything from zone meetings to International Conventions. Finally, about 10 years ago, she, along with two other “Plainfield wives”, joined the Lions Club herself. She and the other women were welcomed without any issues, and her service continues through this day.

Lionism gives Jill and Lamar the service activity they can work on together throughout their retirement. Though neither has served in district level offices, both enjoy working on district projects. Jill has been involved with the vision screening program from the beginning. She is very pleased with the start of the program and hopeful for its expansion and success in the future. District, state, and International activities have also given them many, many friends whose companionship they have enjoyed over the years.

The Freelands’ story is an example of how each Lions Club can look at their own spouses and families for potential new members. If you show them someone with whom they have something in common, they might just become members. Events

LCIF Report: Memorializing PDG Noah

Now is the time of year for Lions Clubs in District 14-C to make decisions to help those in need and to recognize club members with a Melvin Jones Fellowship. As a District we are \$7,000 + under last year's donations. Even though the District Coordinator could not get out to clubs, there should not be a need for a visit to stimulate the club's giving. Remember the slogan – *Where's There's a Need, There's a Lion*.

On a positive note, PDG Noah's family requested memorial donations be made to LCIF in lieu of flowers, etc. At this point, Memorial gifts to LCIF total \$1845. At the recent Cabinet meeting, we had 5 raffle baskets which added another \$288 to the total. The District Governor will name two MJF at the request of PDG Noah's spouse, Becky.

One Lions club and one Lioness club contributed to the memorial. I would suggest other clubs contribute a memorial gift to LCIF. PDG Noah was an outstanding Lion, with much enthusiasm not only for LCIF but all Lions in general.

Be a 100% Contributing Club

Beginning this year, all monies received for Contributing Member Pins are eligible for MJF credit. Another suggestion would be to make your club a 100% Contributing Member Club. A club could do this for any of the three categories of Contributing Member Pins. This would probably be controlled by the number of members in the club. This would be a great way for a club to contribute to LCIF and also have each member receive a Contributing Member Pin.

When a club contributes to LCIF, my suggestion would be in two ways – Area of Greatest Need or to the Measles Initiative. The Measles program continues to strive to reduce the number of Measles cases and /or deaths throughout the world.

Two mothers who have lost sons to heroin addiction shared their heartbreaking stories. Several people who are currently in recovery programs and family members of persons struggling with addictions described how their lives have been impacted by Heroin. Questions were taken from the audience.
