- PDG George Reisinger presented changes to the nomination procedure adopted by LCI
- PCC Gus and Lion Gail Fridenvalds presented information on diabetes awareness
- DG Dennis Cope shared information on LCI's *Global Action Team* structure, reporting service using MyLCI, and District 14-C's hurricane relief effort.
- PDG Kerry McKnight reported on LCIF contributions of over \$15,000 to date.
- PDG George Hilsinger gave an update on plans for the District Convention - April 14, 2017, at Liberty Mountain Resort; reminded clubs to submit nominations for the Pa. Counsellors. Distinguished Service Award; and reported on grants and donations to the Northeast Pa. Lions Service Foundation.
- Lion Louanna Bare reported that District 14-C was a top donor to Bacon Lodge last year and encouraged club donations through the 500 Club program
- Lion Lana McCaulley presented information on scholarships available through the Lions International Pin Traders Association
- PDG Al Hayes promoted the LCI Convention in Las Vegas and the Pa. Lions State Convention in State College.



Patricia first became involved when she was sponsored about ten years ago to join the Jacobus Lionesses Club by a longtime friend and fellow church member, Charlene Shearer. Unfortunately, her time was limited and while she participated in many of their activities, she did not feel she could commit to service as an officer.




Only a few years after Patricia became a Lioness, Terry was invited to a meeting of the Jacobus Lions Club by a neighbor. He was impressed by the club's activities and felt that this was a good way to serve his community.

Soon thereafter, Patricia decided to transfer her membership to the Jacobus Lions Club so that she and Terry could work together. They currently co-chair the 4th of

July Blast, which is a day-long community event in Jacobus Park, featuring bingo, baseball, barbecue chicken, children's games, a salute to the military, ending, naturally, with a grand fireworks display. Their responsibilities for this are year-round and accelerate with committee meetings beginning around February of each year and involve coordinating all these activities, plus obtaining sponsorships, items for a silent auction and bookings for music groups and other vendors. In addition to the "blast" they also serve together delivering Christmas cheer baskets, scanning tickets at the York Fair and cleaning up during adopt-a- highway.

Patricia also serves as club chaplain and is chair of the scholarship committee. Terry is the current Secretary, while previously going "through the ranks" as Vice-President and

Like other Lions we have profiled in the past, Patricia, though now retired, spent her career in elementary education, primarily as a kindergarten and first grade teacher. She recently had an interesting experience while substituting in a local school district. One of her young students was diagnosed with poor eyesight but was delayed in getting an examination and corrective lenses due to a situation with the family. Patricia mentioned to his teacher that the Lions Club was available to help. While the situation was resolved without the Lions Club's assistance, the teacher told Patricia that when she was a young girl her first pair of glasses came from the Lions Club, and she may not have even pursued a teaching career had it not been for the Lion's help with her eyesight problems.

As noted at the beginning, Patricia is also the District Chair of the Peace Poster project, having taken it over 3 years ago at the request of PDG Noah Krout. Students aged 11-13 are encouraged to express their vision of world peace through creating a poster, which is then judged through various levels and can ultimately advance to International recognition. Patricia would like to see each club have a volunteer to seek out their local schools and youth groups to encourage involvement. She welcomes the opportunity to speak at any club meeting to promote the program and provide information to Lions.

Patricia and Terry are always helping each other with their projects and looking for ways to help their community. They are another example of Lions who were recruited by a friend or neighbor to help with the wonderful things we do. As we look for new members, remember Patricia and Terry's story, and you may get more than just a member — you may get a Lion leader.

DG Dennis told the story of his time spent with Past International Director and Melvin Jones Fellow William "Bill" E. Anderson, a member of the Penn Township Lions Club of District 14-C for many years until his passing in 2004. PID Bill made a significant impact on DG Dennis' decision to move forward in leadership roles.

As a final step to his transition as the 14-C District Governor, Dennis kept with tradition and decided to have Mr. Anderson's widow, Hanover Lion Jake Anderson, pull the Elect ribbon from the badge.

And so, it is now official.
