# Three Generations of Smiths Serving in New Freedom

When Ed and Shirley Smith moved to New Freedom from the Pittsburgh area in 1973, they probably had no idea that they were relocating to the service area of one of the most active Lions Clubs in our District. They were not given much time to settle quietly into their new surroundings, as Ed was recruited for the New Freedom Lions Club by Richard Gallenton, who happened to be the seller of their new home.



Ed joined the New Freedom Lions Club almost immediately and over a 25+ year period he has served as Tail Twister, President (twice), three terms as Secretary, and he ran the "cook shack" at the carnival grounds.

Shirley did not shy away from helping with Lions Club activities.

Then, in March of 1979, the New Freedom Lioness Club was formed and she joined it a year later. Over the course of her 37 years of service, Shirley has served in every office in the club except Treasurer and Secretary. As they rotated through the ranks of the Lions and Lioness Clubs, Ed and Shirley found themselves serving as their respective club Presidents at the same time on at least one occasion. In addition to their service in Lionism, Shirley is involved in both the VFW and American Legion Auxiliaries, and both she and Ed have volunteered with food banks at the Southern York County Pantry and helped at local libraries. Shirley is most passionate about advocating her support for New Life Center for Mothers and Children, and is always active in their picnic, balloon release and flower garden.

Ed and Shirley's son Tim met and subsequently married Mindy. Mindy grew up in the Glen Burnie, Maryland, area, where she watched and helped her father in the local Rotary Club and the Glen Burnie Improvement Association, a nonprofit organization which held an annual carnival and conducted other activities to support local recreation. Even though Tim had never joined the Lions Club, he helped with many activities when needed. Shirley introduced Mindy to the Lioness Club, and she

immediately got involved in the fundraising aspects of the club, especially the Christmas Bazar in November, Sweetheart Bingo in February and Indoor Yard Sale in March. She has served as an officer from the beginning, with three terms as President among her other offices held.

Tim and Mindy have three daughters, Kristen, Kristy and Katie. All three daughters watched their grandmother, grandfather and mother serve the community and are following as third generation Lionesses. Kristen joined at age sixteen and has served in the Lioness Club for nine years. Kristy and Katie, who are twins, also joined two years ago at age sixteen.

Involvement with the Lions and the Lioness Clubs gives three generations of talented and motivated people a wonderful opportunity to work together to serve their community.

So when you see the New Freedom Lions and Lionesses in action, you can bet at least one Smith is there giving of themselves for the betterment of others. And it all started, literally, when the grandparents bought their home in a new area and a Lion made that initial and important contact. 14-C were outstanding! By viewing the posters, one can easily see the amount of research, thought, time and creative talent that was dedicated into each poster. But we need more clubs to be participating and giving this incredible opportunity to our youth.

Encourage a member from your Lions Club to offer this opportunity to a classroom of children, a Scout Troop, a sports team, a Sunday school class, a Youth group, etc., to participate in the Peace Poster Contest. Some of our Lions Clubs and schools have made it a tradition which both groups look forward to each year. And, also, it is a wonderful way to make a connection with your community, along with giving young people the opportunity to express their vision of world peace.

The theme of the 2017-2018 Peace Poster Contest is "The Future of Peace." Students ages 11, 12, or 13 as of November 15 are eligible to participate. Each poster is judged on originality, artistic merit, and expression of the theme. Posters advance through several judging levels: local, district, multiple district, and international. At the international level, judges from the art, peace, youth, education and media communities select one grand

prize winner and 23 merit award winners. One international grand prize winner will receive \$5000 and a trip to a special award ceremony at the International Convention. Each of the 23 merit award winners will receive a cash award of \$500 and a certificate of achievement.

Lions Clubs around the world are also encouraged to sponsor students in the Lions International Essay contest. This essay contest was created to offer an opportunity to visually impaired young people to express their feelings about world peace. The theme of the 2017-2018 International Essay Contest is also "The Future of Peace." Students who are visually impaired and who are ages 11, 12, or 13 as of November 15 are eligible to participate.
