A Husband And Wife's Service In Lionism – This Time Not Together But Successively

Our previous articles have profiled Lion spouses and family members who have served together or as fathers and sons continuing the tradition. This month we focus on a husband and wife who never served in Lionism together, but who nonetheless formed an eternal bond with selfless community service and continuation of a legacy.

In 1963, Eugene Taylor and his wife, Nancy, bought a lot and built a home on Blymire Road, less than one block from Dallastown Lions Park. At the time, little did they know how much that park would come to mean in their lives. They raised their children and were happy that the park and its play equipment were so close by.

Gene worked as a draftsman and estimator for engineering and construction companies. This put him in contact with another Dallastown Lion, Robert Schmuck, who coincidentally lived about two blocks away and, with his wife Linda, was raising his young son at the same time. With their common interests, Bob eventually got Gene to join the Dallastown Lions Club.

Gene's passion was the park, which has always been Dallastown Lions Club's signature project. In addition to park maintenance and other service projects, Gene served two terms as club president, first in 1988-1989, and second from 2001-2002. He also served as Zone Chair from 2002-2003.

All the while Nancy, like other Lion wives, was not involved in Lions. But times were changing, and Dallastown Lions Club accepted its first woman member in 1995. Like many men at the time, Gene's initial reaction was that women did not belong in Lions Clubs, but he soon changed his mind. That first woman member located a company which was getting rid of filing cabinet, and she arranged a deal where the Lions Club was able to sell and deliver the filing cabinets to schools and businesses, netting the club around \$15,000.00 in profit. From that point on, Gene judged the women in Lions not on their identity but their ability. But it was still "his thing," Nancy commented when ask why she never tried to join at that time.

Sadly, Gene passed away unexpectedly in June of 2008. By this time Nancy had retired from elementary school teaching. She knew the people in the Dallastown Lions Club and saw that she could make a contribution to keep Gene's legacy alive.

Not only were women actively involved in the Dallastown Lion Club, but Nancy saw that two had been Presidents. She joined shortly thereafter. Since joining, Nancy has gone through the ranks, culminating in her service as President in the 2012-2013 year. She now serves on the Nominating and Scholarship Committees, and also on the Park Committee, because like Gene, she feels that our signature project is to keep our park available for our community. With her dogs Mazie and Jake, she frequently "patrols" the park, keeping eye out for downed tree branches and anything else that needs to be attended to.

Gene and Nancy's story should be a precious lesson for all Lions. Remember to keep in touch with the families and spouses of members who have gone before us, for who knows Lionism and our community service better than a spouse and the family of our Lions?





The best way to get him items is to send pictures as JPEG files (they don't look as good if he takes them from your PDF), and text as either a Word document or a Rich Text Format (rtf) file. He cannot open WordPerfect or Microsoft Publisher files, and please watch your Word settings so they don't come to his Mac in the infamous winmail.dat format.
