Message from the District Governor

To our Lions family-

On April 22nd at our 2017 14-C District Convention, I believe we saw a little insight into the future of Lions Clubs and District 14-C. Not only



did we have a spectacular turnout for the convention, 14-C members also participated in our first ever District "Dining in the Dark" fundraising event for Leader Dogs for the Blind. Photos are included in this newsletter.

It was just a couple years ago discussions were held whether 14-C

should cease holding District Conventions due to low attendance. I am pleased to report this year's attendance was up 33% from the convention average. The "Dining in the Dark" dinner was a great success with the convention attendees not only enjoying a wonderful meal, but experiencing, however briefly, what it feels like to either be visually impaired or blind. Performing a simple task such as eating a meal, I had difficulty attempting to butter a roll (more butter was on my sleeve than the roll), something I never have given a second thought. Experiences such as this increase our awareness of the day-to-day activities those who have vision difficulties must deal with. Lion Kevin Turnbaugh spoke on his appreciation to Leader Dog for partnering him with his service dog, Harpo.

My highlight of the day was hosting our very

special guests, Past International Director Cindy and PDG Tom Gregg. PID Cindy was the Keynote Speaker during the convention and also gave an inspiring speech following our dinner, along with leading a seminar on Women and Families in Lions. This year I have been promoting families and generations of Lions serving. PID Cindy and PDG Tom are excellent examples of dedication and passion, and thankfully they are freely willing to share their knowledge with us.

Three Leo members from York College and three from Apple City Leo Club attended and assisted with the convention. One of the Centennial Service Projects was donating 100 children's books to the York Hospital Pediatric Unit. These books were delivered to the hospital by all six Leo's with their advisors. They approached me at the conclusion of the day to thank the Lions of District 14-C for allowing them to participate in the activities. No, Leo's we thank you!

The primary purpose of Lions gathering at a District Convention is to choose our future leaders. First Vice District Governor Dennis Cope, Second Vice District Governor Lisa Griffie, and Zone Chair Steve Shipman were elected to lead us into the beginning of our second century of serving, and asked for our support.

We thank Convention Chair PDG Shirley Starner and her committee for a fantastic job organizing this year's convention.

I wrote that I had an insight into the future of Lions. Between our Leos, the new District leadership, and the momentum 14-C clubs have developed, I believe District 14-C's future is very bright.

The District was indeed honored to welcome PID Cindy and PDG Tom Gregg to share us in the celebration. PID Cindy is the first female elected as International Director from Pennsylvania. They have a son, daughter, and son-in-law who are all Lions, and 3-year-old grandson who is a future Lion.

In addition to Governor Kerry's report, it is worth noting that a total of \$2800 was collected and donated to Lions Clubs International Foundation in memory of PDG Noah Krout. A plaque was presented to his widow, Lion Becky Krout.

In commemoration of the 100th Anniversary of Lions Clubs International, a Rising Sun Redbud tree was planted at Wyndham Gardens in York, the convention site this year.

The convention concluded with a "Dining in the Dark" dinner. The purpose was for all attendees to develop a keen awareness of a visually impaired person experiences. Simulated eyeglass conditions were provided by Fore Sight Vision, and blindfolds were contributed by Leader Dog School for the Blind.

Ballot Question

To be voted upon May 21, 2017 at Seven Springs Mountain Resort, Champion, PA

THE FOLLOWING RESOLUTION CONCERNS THE BY-LAWS. (THIS AMENDMENT TO THE BY-LAWS REQUIRES A MAJORITY VOTE TO ADOPT.)

A RESOLUTION TO PROVIDE A CHANGE IN THE DISTRIBUTION OF UNUSED FUNDS FOR THE DISTRICT GOVERNORS INTERNATIONAL EXPENSE FUNDS AS LISTED IN ARTICLE VI, SECTION 5. IF APPROVED, THE LAST SENTENCE IN ARTICLE VI, SECTION 5, WILL BE REVISED TO REFLECT A RETURN OF UNUSED FUNDS TO THE GENERAL ADMINISTRATIVE ACCOUNT.

THIS REVISION IS TO CHANGE THE POLICY OF ROLLING OVER UNUSED FUNDS IN THE DISTRICT GOVERNORS INTERNATIONAL EXPENSE FUND.

BE IT RESOLVED, that Article VI, Section 5, will have a revised last sentence that will read as follows: Any unused funds will be returned to the General administrative account for purposes of meeting the operating budget.

SHALL THIS RESOLUTION BE ADOPTED? _____ YES _____ NO

“I’ll join the Lion’s Club, but I won’t ever have time to...”

We were both recently fortunate and honored to hear Past International Director Cindy Gregg, from Belle Vernon, PA, the featured speaker at our District 14-C Convention on April 22, 2017. The story of her meteoric rise from joining her Lions Club in 2000 to election as an International Director only 13 years later, and her continuing activities, is one which must be shared with those Lions and Lionesses who were unable to attend.



PID Cindy grew up surrounded by Lions. Her father and mother were Lions. Her husband Tom is a Lion, having served in many offices at different levels and achieving recognition as a Progressive Melvin Jones Fellow. Her son became a Lion. For twenty-five years,

Cindy, a school music teacher, followed the path we have often seen with women, that of following along to meetings and helping with every project, but “never having the time” to join the local Lions Club herself.

All that changed in 2000, when Cindy’s daughter, a charter Leo at the local high school, needed to sponsor someone into Lions membership to obtain an achievement award. Mom naturally stepped forward, and the rest, as we say, is history. So now that Cindy was finally a Lion, she expected to be a “backbencher” who could just continue to help others and work on projects behind the scenes. Soon after joining, her club had their election and needed a second vice-president. Cindy decided that would be OK, as it would give her a few years to learn more about things. But fate had other ideas. The first-vice president did not show up for installation and the President resigned due to employment responsibilities, so Cindy found herself as President of the Rostraver Township Lions Club nine months after joining.

The woman with no time to do things then became a district governor, council chairperson, district MERL & LCIF Coordinator, chaired the Woman’s Action Committee and served as vice-chair of the Service Activities Committee. With her retirement from teaching in 2010, she thought

maybe she finally had some time to do more. This led to her election to a two-year term as a director of Lions Clubs International at the association’s 96th International Convention in Hamburg, Germany in 2013.

Today PID Cindy is “content” to serve as the GMT leader for Constitutional Area 1-B (Ohio, PA, VA & West Virginia), is a group leader for District Governor Elect School in Chicago and the 2016 USA/Canada Lions Leadership Forum Seminar Committee. She is also a presenter and moderator for Lions forums and conventions throughout the area. Her non-Lion activities include numerous professional and community organizations, including the Arts Education Collaborative Leadership Institute, National Associate for Music Education, and the American Orff-Schulwerk Association.



In recognition of her service, she has received Club Excellence and Leadership Awards, six President’s Medals, International President’s Certificates of Appreciation, the Certified Guiding Lion Medal, the Joseph L. Wroblewski Award, a Progressive Lions of Pennsylvania Fellowship, the Carl Shoemaker and Ross DiMarco Fellowships, and the Ambassador of Good Will, which is the highest award in Lionism. She is also a Progressive Melvin Jones Fellow, and her district established the Kidsight Fellowship in her name this year.

Along with her other family members in Lionism, the woman with no time has climbed many mountains and made major contributions to solving the problems Lions Clubs face. Her story should be an inspiration to all of us who initially think, “I can’t do this”.

Secretary New Officer Reporting

Current secretaries: Please remember that your 2017 – 2018 club officers must be reported now. Are you having problems reporting your 2017-18 new officers? Try this.

1. Sign in to your MyLCI
2. On your club’s “Home” Page; Click on “Enter next year’s officers” under “My Tasks”
3. Click “Select Term“ (Unless you are using special club officer titles, there is no need to use “Officer Types” or “Add Local Title”)
4. Click “Next Year”
5. Click “Add Officer” for the office position to listed (i.e., “Club President”)
6. Under the window “Assign Officer” click “Select Member”
7. Locate and click on the member’s name. (The name will appear in the “Selected Member” window)
8. Click “Save.” Not clicking on “Save” will result in not recording the entry and require redoing it.
9. Click on “Go back to Officers” to do the next officer position or “Go to home page” to do another task or sign out.
10. Congratulations! You have finished your new officers reporting.
11. BUT WAIT. There is more. This year each club is asked to assign a “Club LCIF Coordinator”, which needs to be reported under the new officers entries.
12. You are no longer required to send a list of officers to the PA Lions office, as they, like our leaders, now collect the information from your MyLCI report. Your job just keeps getting easier.

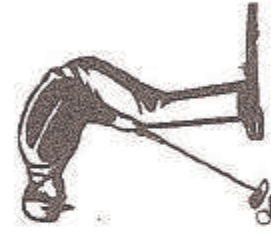
