The Peace Poster kits have been redesigned for this special anniversary. The theme for 2017-2018 is **"The Future of Peace."** Approximately 600,000 children from over 75 countries participate in the contest, annually. This past year in our district, we had over 100 students participate-which is incredible! But, wouldn't it be outstanding if for this year, we could increase the number by 50 children!!!!!! I know we have a lot of untapped talent with very creative ideas just waiting to be discovered!

More information about the Peace Poster Contest is available on the LCI website along with information about how to order the Peace Poster kit. You can also order by calling Club Supplies Sales at (630)571-5466 or 1-800-710-7822. Remember one kit must be purchased for each group your club sponsors. The deadline for ordering the kit is October 1, 2017.

Lions Clubs around the world are also encouraged to sponsor students in the Lions International Essay Contest. This essay contest was created to offer an opportunity to visually impaired young people to express their feeling about world peace. The theme of the 2017-2018 International Essay Contest is **"The Future of Peace."** Students who are visually impaired and who are ages 11, 12, or 13 on November 15 are eligible to participate. Your club can **create and foster a spirit of understanding among the peoples of the world** (one of our Lions Club International Objectives) by encouraging and sponsoring a group of youth to participate in the Peace Poster Contest.

Stokes Project Update

In July, District Governor Dennis sent out a request for donations to help purchase specialized eyeglasses for Mr. Dudley Stokes. Mr. Stokes's family requested help from the Lions because these specialized lenses cost approximately \$5,000 per pair, and Mr. Stokes was in need of at least two lenses.

The response from individual Lions and from our Lions clubs was incredible! Donations to the Red Basket website jumped from 24% of goal to 41%, which equates to approximately \$2,500. In addition, 21 Lions clubs, 2 Lioness clubs, and 3 individuals made donations to District 14-C totaling \$4,700 in support of this project.

Because of the Lions' support, Mr. Stokes has received his first lens, and a second one has been ordered. In an email to DG Dennis, Mr. Stokes's son wrote, "He (Mr. Stokes) has found them to be extremely effective, without any period for adaptation. My sister-in-law said when he first came home, he looked at my mother's face and couldn't believe how clear she looked. This is a wonderful outcome, and we are very grateful for the efforts of the Lions clubs that helped make this possible."



District Governor's Challenge Program

This year, there will be no points contest for our clubs. Instead, every club, every club President, every club Secretary, and every club Treasurer has the opportunity to be recognized for helping the district achieve its goals for the year (see the August newsletter for a listing of the District Goals). Through the *District Governor's Challenge Program*, clubs can earn either a bronze, silver, or gold medal, and club officers will earn a certificate of recognition by meeting specific criteria. The criteria for earning medals and certificates are listed below ...

Club Challenge — Clubs that meet the following criteria will be recognized at the August 2018 Cabinet meeting with either a Bronze, Silver or Gold Award:

- Achieve net membership growth by June 30, 2018: Bronze +1; Silver +2; Gold 3 or more.
- Contribute to the District Governor's Projects Fund: Bronze at least \$15 per member; Silver at least \$20 per member; Gold at least \$25 per member
- Participate in the district-wide same-day service project.
- Have no outstanding balance with LCI, MD-14, or District 14-C that goes without payment for more than 120 days.
- Have representation at the District Convention equal to or greater than the number of delegates awarded to the club: Bronze - number of eligible delegates; Silver - number of eligible delegates +1; Gold - number of eligible delegates +2 or more
- Report 2018-2019 club officers (including Leo advisors) to LCI prior to June 1, 2018.

Club President's Challenge — Club Presidents who meet the following criteria will be recognized at the August 2018 cabinet meeting:

- Each of the following club officers complete officer training offered by either LCI or Lions University for his/her position: President, 1st Vice-President, Secretary, Treasurer.
- Attend all District Cabinet meetings and District Convention.
- Attend all Zone Advisory meetings.
- Sponsor 1 new member.

Club Secretary's Challenge — Club Secretaries who meet the following criteria will be recognized at the August 2018 cabinet meeting:

- Complete Club Secretary training offered by either LCI or Lions University.
- Attend all District Cabinet meetings and District Convention.
- Attend all Zone Advisory meetings.
- Make sure club information in MyLCI is updated at least once each quarter.
- Sponsor 1 new member.

Club Treasurer's Challenge — Club Treasurers who meet the following criteria will be recognized at the August 2018 cabinet meeting:

- · Complete Club Treasurer training offered by either LCI or Lions University.
- Attend the District Convention.
- Make sure the club has no outstanding balance with LCI, MD-14, or District 14-C that goes without payment for more than 120 days.
- Sponsor 1 new member.

Thank You for Your Service!

Employee Identification Number (EIN) - A "Must Have" for Every Club

Our clubs don't have employees, but each of our clubs is still required to have an Internal Revenue Service (IRS) issued Employee Identification Number, or EIN. This is a reminder to club Treasurers that each club should have its own EIN and file a yearly report (Form 990) with the IRS.

An EIN allows clubs to avoid paying federal tax on earned income. Clubs *should not* use the EIN assigned to the PA State Council of Lions Clubs and/or Lions Clubs International.

Clubs that fail to file the proper forms risk having their taxexempt status revoked. If this has happened to your club, you may request reinstatement of tax-exempt status. The forms and procedures needed to do this can be found by clicking on this link.

The State Office is working with LCI's Legal Division on obtaining pertinent information on this matter and will share what it obtains with members of State Council, Vice District Governors, and the PA International Family. In the meantime, if you have a questions or need more information on this smatter, please contact David Kingsbury, Staff Attorney, in LCI's Legal Division, at 630.468.6732 or david.kingsbury@lionsclubs.org.

The exemption from paying federal taxes is different from the exemption clubs have, through MD-14, from paying state sales tax on taxable items the club purchases for club business. Clubs must, however, pay sales tax to the state for items they sell to the public that qualify for the state sales tax.

The Northeast Pennsylvania Lions Service Foundation is now accepting applications for grants. We have funds to help your club support the following types of projects, services and treatments: Baby Monitors for Deaf Parents; Cataract Surgeries; Corneal Transplants; Guide Dogs; Hearing Aids; Magnification Equipment; Sign Language Instruction; Special Contacts/Glasses; Speech Therapy; Talking Computer Software; Vision Therapy and Vision Screening.

The NEPA Lions Service Foundation serves Lions Clubs in nine Northeastern PA districts including District C. Lion Robert Dickson of the New Freedom Lions Club and Lion George Hilsinger of the Jacksonville Lions Club currently serve on the board of the Lions Service Foundation. They are both available to make brief presentations to your club on how the Northeast Pennsylvania Lions Eye Bank became the Northeast Pennsylvania Lions Service Foundation and what the Foundation can do to help your club. This year we are again asking our clubs to donate money toward the *District Governor's Project Fund*. Clubs must donate to meet the criteria needed to receive a "Club Challenge" medal under the *District Governor's Challenge Program:* bronze - \$15 per member; silver - \$20 per member; gold - \$25 per member.

This year's projects are as follows, along with the percentage of each donation that will be allocated to the projects: Beacon Lodge - 20%; Leader Dogs - 20%; LCIF - 15%, PA Lions Hearing Research - 10%, PA Lions Sight Conservation and Eye Research - 10%; Lions of PA Foundation - 10%; Diabetes Education and Awareness - 5%; Leo Club Support - 5%; and District Service Project - 5%.

Two Lives Dedicated to Lionism: Lois and Cecil Mundorff

We are excited to profile two Lions who both served as our District Governor and a wide variety of positions throughout their Lion careers. Cecil and Lois Mundorff spent 54 years of marriage together before her death in April of 2016. Much of their time was dedicated to Lionism in general and to Beacon Lodge specifically.

PDG Cecil was recruited into the Brogue Lions Club in 1966 by Harold Leiphart. Lois immediately immersed herself in the fundraising efforts of the Brogue Lions. She also cooked all of the meals for the Lions Club meetings.

During his 51 years as a Brogue Lion, Lion Cecil served as President five times, served as Secretary for five years, and held other offices, with perfect attendance through his entire tenure. Cecil has served as Zone 4-B Chairman for six years, a Region Chairman for three years, Vice-District Governor during 2002-2003 and District Governor during the 2003-2004 year. His



involvement with District 14-C continued with his involvement on the District Convention Committee and as Program Facilities Chairman.

While Lois continued to feed the Brogue Lions, she also attended night classes at York College, ultimately graduating cum laude and operating a bookkeeping and tax service business, and she served as the local District Justice from 1970 to 1993. She also found the time, along with three other women, to form the

Brogue Lioness Club in 1979, and served in many positions within that club until it disbanded in 2005. At that time Lois joined the Mason-Dixon Lions Club, where, while still cooking for Brogue Lions until 2012, she served at President for the 2008-2009 year, and Zone 4-B Chair from 2009-2011. Lois then served as Vice District Governor for the 2013-2014 year and District Governor for the 2014-2015 year.

PDG Cecil and PDG Lois both received the Melvin Jones Fellow awards, with Cecil also adding the Progressive Melvin Jones Fellow, Pennsylvania Fellow, and P.I.P. Joe Wroblewski Award, all of which were well deserved. Together they attended 17 International Lions Conventions and many state conventions and USA-Canada Forums. Lois was also a Life Member of the PA Lions Vision and Research Center at Hershey Medical Center. In 2013, then District Governor Shirley Starner place a brick at Beacon Lodge in Lois's name to honor her commitment to Lionism. Lois's dedication to Lionism continued even after her death in 2016, as she donated her eyes to Sight Life/Northeast PA Lions Eye Bank for research.

PDG Cecil and PDG Lois have given much to Lionism on all levels. What an inspiration to all Lions and Lionesses to find that project that can inspire you and others around you and when you tire form your exhaustive efforts, remember our very own PDG Cecil and PDG Lois and their endless love and energy for a cause they both love so much!



<u>Pennsylvania Counsellors Distinguished</u> <u>Service Award</u>

The Pennsylvania Counsellors have established an award for presentation to deserving Lions throughout Pennsylvania - The *Pennsylvania Counsellors Distinguished Service Award*.

Each District within Multiple District 14 may present **two (2)** *Pennsylvania Counsellors Distinguished Service Awards* annually. The award is limited to **one (1)** per club per year and only one (1) award per District may be presented to a Past District Governor. Persons who have received a prior *Pennsylvania Counsellors Distinguished Service Award*, *Lions International Leadership Award*, *Lions International Presidents Award*, or the Lions International Ambassador of Good Will *Award* **are not** eligible for this award.

The following are the criteria to earn this award:

A. Have served at least ten (10) years as a Lion,

B. Have earned at least five (5) years of perfect attendance,

C. Shall have served as either President or Secretary of their Club, or have displayed other exemplary service.

D. Must be a Lion in good standing in a Lions Club in good standing in their District within Multiple District 14.

Applications for the *Pennsylvania Counsellors Distinguished Service Award* shall be submitted by the Lions Club President to the Chair of the District 14-C Past District Governors Honorary Committee (**PDG George Hilsinger, 50 Foreman Mill Road, Shippensburg, PA 17257**) no later than December 1st. The Past District Governors Honorary Committee will review all of the applications received and recommend two (2) for the awards. The Chair shall endorse the recommended applications and forward them to the District Governor for his/her endorsement. The applications must be received by the Secretary of the Pennsylvania Counsellors at least two (2) weeks prior to the February State Council Meeting.

The awards will be presented at a District Function by the Chair of the District 14-C Past District Governors Honorary Committee.




These pictures from the first District Cabinet meeting of the 101st year of Lionism give a brief taste of what happens.
