
#### **Club Officer Elections**

#### Membership Goals Progress Report

Our membership numbers during March slipped from February. We added just 1 new member and lost 10 members. Of the 87 members we have dropped this year, 24 are due to deaths. Let's look at the reasons for the other 63 dropped members.

Six members moved and one member changed membership type. Those are understandable and acceptable reasons. The reasons for the remaining 57 dropped members are not acceptable: 31—Resigned in Good Standing; 20—Non-Attendance/Non-Payment of Dues; 5—Other. It is important to understand the reasons members resign, don't attend meetings, don't pay their dues, or drop for other reasons. Obtain and use that knowledge to brainstorm and implement changes that will lead to better membership retention.

In order to meet our goals for this year, we need not only a strong push to recruit new members, we must work hard to avoid any more dropped members. Clearly, lack of member retention is hindering our efforts to grow. Let's stop the "bleeding."

## **Brogue Lions Hold Highly Successful Day of Service**





The Peace Poster Contest is open to children 11-13 years of



age on November 15, 2018. Your Lions Club can sponsor the Peace Poster Contest in local schools or organized sponsored youth groups. An organized sponsored youth group can be your local Girl Scout Troop, your Boy Scout Troop, or other organized Youth Groups such as a Church Group or the YMCA or YWCA.

Lions Clubs around the world are also encouraged to sponsor students in the Lions International Essay Contest. This essay contest was created to offer an opportunity for visually impaired young people to express their feelings about world peace. The theme of the 2018/2019 International Essay Contest is also "Kindness Matters." Students who are visually impaired and who are aged 11, 12, or 13 on November 15, 2018, are eligible to participate. 
