## Message from the District Governor

Many of our Lions were touched by the generosity and appreciation of individuals who contributed items to this cause, and it was great to hear their stories. Some of our clubs are still working on this project, and I am looking forward to seeing the full amount of items that will be brought to our District Convention on April 14th.



At the District Convention, there will be an opportunity to assist in assembling the items that were collected into kits, which will be distributed to pediatric cancer patients in our 3-county area and at Hershey Medical Center. This will be in addition to our seminars, a necrology service, our Convention Luncheon featuring our guest, Past International Director John Pettis from Massachusetts, the Biglerville High School Jazz Band, a business meeting and our annual caucus and elections. If you have not yet registered, there is still time to do so.

Throughout my year as your District Governor, I have worked to draw attention to the importance of service as a key to

the health and vitality of our clubs. That lesson has been reinforced in my mind repeatedly as I visit our clubs and attend activities. Lions are at their best when they are engaged in active, hands-on service. 

## Membership Goals Progress Report

Our membership numbers during March slipped from February. We added just 1 new member and lost 10 members. Of the 87 members we have dropped this year, 24 are due to deaths. Let's look at the reasons for the other 63 dropped members.

Six members moved and one member changed membership type. Those are understandable and acceptable reasons. The reasons for the remaining 57 dropped members are not acceptable: 31—Resigned in Good Standing; 20—Non-Attendance/Non-Payment of Dues; 5—Other. It is important to understand the reasons members resign, don't attend meetings, don't pay their dues, or drop for other reasons. Obtain and use that knowledge to brainstorm and implement changes that will lead to better membership retention.

In order to meet our goals for this year, we need not only a strong push to recruit new members, we must work hard to avoid any more dropped members. Clearly, lack of member retention is hindering our efforts to grow. Let's stop the "bleeding."

This essay contest was created to offer an opportunity for visually impaired young people to express their feelings about world peace.
