When you get new members in your clubs make sure they have a member induction ceremony that is special and meaningful. The ceremony should include information regarding your club service activities and how you serve your community as a group. Below are some thoughts on keep your new members enthusiastic and feeling like they are welcome in your club:

- Club President or Secretaries should send new members an email or give them a call about a week after their induction and ask if they have any questions and remind them of the next meeting or event of the club. Make sure they have your phone number and email address in case they would have any questions later.
- Continue to follow up with them especially if you do not see them at the next meeting. Keep reminding them they are needed and valued as a member.
- Remember to NOT make it about meetings but make it about SERVICE. If the new members cannot attend every meeting, make sure they are aware of the upcoming events and that their help is needed.
- Ask a Veteran There is no admission fee (\$35) for all veterans who are recruited by June of 2021

- Any Lioness wishing to convert to a Lion has no entrance/admission fee (\$35). This would apply to any Lioness club wanting to convert to a Lions club.

- Have fun at your meetings no one wants to join a club that only meets for dinner and goes home. We need to brainstorm at our meetings and come up with new ideas for how we will serve our communities. Message from Steve Shipman



A key to success in many areas of life is, "Get back to the basics." Winning coaches stress to their athletic teams the need to get the basics perfected before trying to move on to fancy plays.

But it is so easy for any organization to lose sight of the basics and try to succeed by razzle-dazzle. And it is tempting for an organization founded on service to others to become ingrown and squander its energy trying to please the members.

I spent three days recently helping a homeless family move from a hotel to an apartment in York. It was hard and at times frustrating (some time ask me about

the large sofa that almost fit into their front door; thankfully we got it in the back way). Yet, even as I drove home dirty, tired, and sore, I had a sense of satisfaction in knowing I had been able to make a difference for real human beings.

I doubt that many members will remember a program or meal from a Lions meeting very long, with a few exceptions (and sometimes things we wish they would forget). But years later we will remember with joy the people we have been able to meet and to help. My adult children still talk about the service projects we did together many years ago. I doubt whether they could remember anything from one of my sermons, unless it was a time I might have embarrassed them.

The most important way for your club to grow will not be by inviting members to your meetings, but by inviting people to serve alongside of you. As they experience what Lions do, they will be much more open to consider an invitation to membership. And if they don't want to join but are willing to help, be grateful and welcome their assistance.

THE FINAL NUMBERS - 2017-2018 MEMBERSHIP GOALS REPORT

Our membership campaign for 2017-2018 yielded a mixed bag of results. Some goals were achieved, and others were not. Unfortunately, the net result is our District membership dropped from 1,301 July 1, 2017 to 1,281 on June 30, 2018.

On the bright side, we exceeded our goal of recruiting 101 new members. Our clubs that were in place on July 1, 2017, recruited 105 new members over the course of the year. We also started a new club, the Shrewsbury Area Centennial Lions Club, which accounted for 16 additional members in the end-of-year count. That gave us a total of 121 new members for this year. Another goal was to increase the percentage of women members in our District. We started the year at 17% and moved that number to over 19%, just shy of our goal of 20%. While we were fortunate and grateful to start 1 new club, we did not establish any Club Branches. Our goal was to have at least 1 club in each zone establish a Club Branch with the hope that branch could grow into an independent club.

Finally, dropped members appears to be the primary reason we did not achieve net membership growth for the year. Our goal was to keep this number to 100 or less. In the end, we had 141 dropped members reported this year.

The District Membership Team (GMT) appreciates the efforts of all our clubs and members who recruited new members, and we will be working during the coming year to find ways to capitalize on our successes and overcome our weaknesses.

What a great program of our Lions to provide clear sight to those in need of good vision. Lion Gene made four trips to Arlington, VA, to deliver glasses.

As was the case last year, used eyeglasses will be collected at each of the District Cabinet Meetings and at the District Convention. Clubs are encouraged to collect glasses and send them to these meetings with either their club representative or their Zone Chairperson. District Governor Lisa will also be happy to take them when she visits your club.

Collection boxes are available through the Lions Clubs International Store. They make an attractive display for vision care offices, stores, banks, etc. Please consider placing several around your community. You'll be surprised at the response.

LION'S IN THE SPOTLIGHT

Being a Lion exposes us to many amazing people. Lions Timothy and Laura McCaulley are no exception. Lion Tim and Lion Laura are another wonderful couple who have given of themselves to their community through Lionism. Tim was first recruited into the Mechanicsburg Lions Club by Laura's father in 1972. Her father was a Lion for over 53 years. Laura also followed in his footsteps by joining the Dandy Lions, which was a predecessor to the Lioness Club, and then later into the Mechanicsburg Lions Club.

The Mechanicsburg Lions Club has been blessed to have both Lion Tim and Lion Laura not only as Lions but as leaders. Lion Tim has served in many positions including three terms as President, as well as Chaplin and Director. He has also served as a member of the Board of Directors of Beacon Lodge for over 30 years. Lion Laura has also served in leadership as Treasurer. The Mechanicsburg Lions Club has grown by almost a third by simply inviting residents from a 55+ community near them. Some of these residents were Lions previously and some were extremely interested in giving back to their community. Now, the Mechanicsburg Lions Club has a very active club with 40 to 45 members of both men and women.

Lion Tim worked in business sales with an electrical company and Lion Laura was a senior vice-president of a medical malpractice company. Their daughter, Erica, was active in college with her sorority sisters by volunteering with their local eyeglass collection agency.

Both Lion Tim and Lion Laura are also involved in their signature project, which is the Lions' Pin Traders Association. If you are unfamiliar with this organization, you are not alone. The history of the pin traders is extraordinary in that they do more than just gather to trade pins at conventions. Pin Traders started trading friendship pins with other state organizations at conventions. The first two states that started a pin traders organization were Virginia and Pennsylvania. From that small beginning, pin traders has now expanded worldwide.

Lion Tim has been on the Board of Directors of the Pin Traders Association for 2 years. Both he and Lion Laura attended the Pennsylvania State Convention in March as hospitality chairpersons, and will be attending the International Convention in Las Vegas in July. In 2019 the International Convention will be in Italy, but the pin traders will have their own separate meeting in Kentucky because they never attend conventions outside of the United States.

Since attending their first convention in Atlanta in 1982, the McCaulley's have collected over 100,000 pins. This year is the 35th Anniversary of the Pennsylvania Pin Traders Club. The Pin Traders Association has approximately 800 members and every year they work on a local service project. They prepared pink pillows for the "Pink hands of hope", an organization that helps comfort those with breast cancer.

The association's motto is "Lions First" and they not only trade pins and serve the local communities that host their conventions, but they also give scholarships to students all over the United States who are graduating high school and are involved in their local Leo Clubs or are children and grandchildren of Lions. Last year they gave scholarships in the amount of \$2,500.00 per student.

If you work with your local Leo Club or if you have children or grandchildren who are graduating from high school, please contact the McCulley's and get an application for this amazing scholarship and you just might find an interest in the history these pins can give to you. Consider asking the McCaulley's to speak to your club to explain this wonderful association and

what they do more fully. Let's help the McCaulley's and the pin traders get the word out about this outstanding scholarship!
