#### Message from the District Governor

We are approaching the end of another Lions year, and from my perspective, it has been a great one! The year began with a



wonderful 100th anniversary celebration at the Lion Clubs International Centennial Convention in Chicago. At that time, our new International President, Dr. Naresh Aggerwal, challenged us to renew our commitment to service for this, the first year of our new century of Lionism.

We in District 14-C embraced that challenge by continuing the on-going service projects in our clubs, initiating some new endeavors, working with other clubs to expand our

service, and engaging in 3 district-wide service projects. As a district, we provided specialized lenses to help an individual with macular degeneration; provided relief money and supplies to individuals in Texas devastated by Hurricane Harvey; and collected 150 boxes of toys and games for pediatric cancer patients.

District 14-C can also boast of many other accomplishments over the past 12 months:

- chartering of a new club in Shrewsbury;
- recruiting nearly 100 new members and increasing the percentage of women members by 2%;

- donating over \$200,000, including \$33,000 in donations to Lions Clubs International Foundation:
- providing over 26,000 hours of service;
- collecting nearly 40,000 pairs of used eyeglasses for the eyeglass recycling program; and
- benefiting over 50,000 individuals through our service and donations.

In short, the Lions of District 14-C have given life to our motto, "We Serve!" We have remained true to our mission of serving our communities, meeting humanitarian needs, encouraging peace, and promoting international understanding. We have used "The Power of Action" to exemplify "The Power of We" and "The Power of Service." It has been an honor to serve as your Governor this year and watch the Lions of District 14- C ROAR!

As we end this Lions year, please accept my most sincere and heart-felt thanks for the kindness, generosity, hospitality and support you have shared with me throughout my year as your District Governor. #### Membership Goals Progress Report

Our membership numbers as of May 22nd show some encouraging improvement over last month's numbers. While we are still not showing a net increase, the deficit has been cut from -14 last month to -7 this month. We have recruited 96 new members, just 5 members short of our goal of 101 new members. However, due to the number of drops we need to recruit more new members than that to end the year with a net increase.

Also, for the first time this year, our percentage of female members has risen broken the 19% figure. We need just 13 women to join between now and June 30th to meet our goal of 20%. 13 new female members would not only get us to our goal of 20% female membership, it would also help us achieve net membership growth for the year.

As was stated in last month's report, we need not only a strong push to recruit new members, we must work hard to avoid any more dropped members. Clearly, you have been working hard to help your club end the year "+1" for the year and help the District end the year with a net increase in membership. Please continue the push, and thank you for your on-going recruitment efforts.

#### Membership Campaign Reminder

The District's Global Membership Team (GMT) has challenged each of our clubs to end the year with one more member than they started the year with, as shown in the District



Directory. This goal is reflected in our campaign theme, "Plus One for 101," meaning each club will have net membership growth of at least one member for the 101st year of our Lions organization.

Every member who

sponsors a new member this year will receive a pin that looks like the logo pictured here. In addition, every club that meets the "+1" membership goal will be awarded a banner patch with this same logo.

District Governor Dennis is looking forward to giving away all 200 pins that have been purchased for this campaign and delivering a banner patch to each club!

And note that President Aggarwal has waived the entrance fee for new members inducted and reported to LCI beween June 7 and 30 of this year!

#### The Reisingers: Passionate about Vision Awareness

Although Lions provide many services to the community, our fundamental purpose remains providing programs for eyesight assistance to those in need. Here in Central Pennsylvania we place significant emphasis on serving children to detect and correct vision problems at the earliest ages possible. This month we profile two of our Lions who readily fulfill the mission of Lionism to promote and advocate our vision screening and awareness programs.

PDG George Reisinger and Lion Wanda Reisinger spend virtually every day promoting vision awareness. PDG George coordinates youth eye needs with the Northeastern York County School District and Lion Wanda does the same with Central York School District. The nurses at any school in these districts have the Reisingers on their speed dial and know that any eye examination and eyeglass need of their students will be promptly met and solved. PDG George and Lion Wanda work tirelessly every day to help their community.

Before retiring, PDG George worked for Caterpillar and Lion Wanda owned and operated Slim Time Spas. They met while playing racquetball and married in 1981. Lion Wanda's father, Lion Harry Crump, was a member of the Susquehanna Lions Club. He "encouraged" George to join, and George did so in September of 1988, joining Wanda's brother, Lion Robert Crump, as a member. PDG George has held every office in the Susquehanna Lions Club except Treasurer and served as District Governor in 2009-2010. He is currently the Administrator for District 14-C and Chairman of the district Long Range Planning Committee.

Lion Wanda joined the Shiloh Lionesses and served in a variety of offices including President, and is now a Lion with the York White Rose Lions Club. Lion Wanda's commitment to combating youth vision problems led to her endless advocacy for the establishment of the district vision screening program, and she currently serves as one of the vision screening coordinators for York County.

#### **LCI Legal's Annual Tax Reminder**

Club and district officers are also encouraged to share the following advisory from LCI's Legal Division:

"Please remember that all Lions Clubs, Districts and Multiple districts that have annual gross receipts less than \$50,000 and do not have to file Form 990 or 990-EZ, must file the e-Postcard (also known as 990-N). If your Lions club, district or multiple district has a foundation, which is a separate legal entity, the appropriate form will need to be filed as well."






