#### "Something for Everyone" Lives Up To Its Promise

On Saturday, April 14th, 110 attendees representing 29 Lions Clubs, 2 Lioness Clubs, and 1 Leo Club participated in our annual District Convention, which was held at Liberty Mountain Resort, near Fairfield. This year's theme was, "Something for Everyone," and, indeed, there were a lot of activities for the attendees to enjoy.

Participants began arriving shortly before 9:00 a.m. on an unusually warm and beautifully sunny day. From the start, there was an air of excitement, enthusiasm, and anticipation as club members arrived with cart loads of boxes containing items their clubs collected during the *District-Wide Day of Service*. The large volume of boxes, bags and containers of supplies took everyone by surprise. 2VDG Steve Shipman, coordinator of this project, gladly dealt with the situation and made the necessary adjustments to accommodate the overflow of materials.



Also contributing to the excitement during the registration hour were the Club and District service project and promotional displays that had been set up for attendees to view. These displays generated lots of in-depth conversations and excitement about



possible new service initiatives. In addition, attendees were treated to a beautiful resort setting, with large windows and wide patio spaces, allowing them to enjoy the day's sunshine and warm temperatures.

The convention program began at 10:00 with a brief opening, which included introductions and general information announcements. This was followed by the annual Necrology

Service, where our departed members were remembered and honored. PCC Gus Fridenvalds presided over the service, which included hymns, scriptures, and a very thoughtful and heartwarming message by our District Chaplain, Lion Rev. Christina Fidanza.

During the Necrology Service, volunteers from the Apple City Leo Club began the daunting process of sorting the club-collected donations that were stacked in the lobby area during registration. Thanks to their efforts, an organizational system was set up that allowed attendees to jump in throughout the day and help sort and box the thousands of items brought to the convention

The first of three seminar sessions followed the Necrology service. The session topics focused on Membership Growth (IPDG Kerry McKnight), Social Media (DG Dennis Cope), and Fundraising (PCC Terry Hartzell and PDG George Reisinger). By the end of this seminar session, stomachs were beginning to rumble and participants were ready for lunch.



A tasty buffet greeted attendees as they entered the banquet room. The picnic-style menu complimented the day's weather perfectly with grilled hamburgers, jumbo hot dogs, and chicken breasts. A beautiful salad, baked beans, sandwich fixings and dessert rounded out the luncheon menu. Once everyone was through the line, DG Dennis introduced the Biglerville High School Jazz Band, under the direction of his wife, Jamie Cope. The Jazz Band provided 20 minutes toe-tapping big-band tunes which resulted in a standing ovation and encore.

Following the Jazz Band Performance, PDG and Convention Chair, George Hilisinger recognized 8 Golden Lions and 4 Silver Lionesses for 50 years and 25 years of service respectively. Those in attendance were Lion Jack Potts and Lion Larry Sharer, both from the Camp Hill Lions Clubs.

The highlight of the luncheon was the Keynote Address by Past International Director John Pettis, Jr. Using a combination of humor and personal stories, PID Pettis reminded the audience that what Lions do is important, and that their work has long-term impact, as was the case when his grandson benefited from a program that was started many years earlier by the Lions of Massachusetts. PID Pettis will be remembered by the Lions of District 14-C for many years to come for his humor, his

Our guest speaker, PID John Pettis, also presented a seminar for aspiring leaders highlighting the benefits and rewards of accepting leadership positions at the club and district level.

The final cabinet meeting for the year was held during the last hour of the convention. In addition to completing routine

business, the cabinet meeting featured a Q&A with PID Pettis and election of District Officers for 2018-2019. 1st VDG Lisa Griffie was elected to the office of District Governor, 2nd VDG Steve



Shipman was elected to the office of 1st VDG, and Zone Chair C.R. Lloyd was elected to the office of 2nd VDG.

Following the close of the convention, a group of nearly 20 Lions stayed to enjoy dinner at the resort, and a few stayed overnight and played 9 holes of golf on a chilly damp Sunday morning.




