MEMBERSHIP UPDATE

March has been a difficult month in regard to membership numbers for District 14-C. This month alone, we dropped 24 members and gained only 6. That puts our total District membership at 1254, which is 26 members less than we started the year. Some of this is due to the unfortunate loss of two clubs, York Township and York Eastgate Sunrise. With just 3 month left in this Lions year, we need a strong membership push to get our District membership numbers back to where we started the year and help District Governor Lisa achieve her goals.

So far this year, 26 of our clubs have recruited at least one new member, and 9 of those clubs have recruited more than 1 members. We can get back to even if each of the 18 clubs that hasn't recruited a new member brings in 1 or 2 members and the 17 clubs that have brought in 1 new member find at least 1 more. Club Membership Chairs and Secretaries recently received an email from our District Membership Coordinator, IPDG Dennis Cope, with an offer to help put together a membership recruitment plan. Feel free to contact him with any of your membership concerns or requests for assistance: dennis.cope@icloud.com.

On a more positive note, congratulations to the following clubs who reported new members in the past two months: Jefferson Community (1), New Freedom (1), Susquehanna (1), Windsor (1), and York Springs (2). Also, DG Lisa challenged us to increase the percentage of female members in District 14-C. We started the year at 19%, and that number has increased to 20%. If each of our clubs recruits at least 1 female member this year without losing any female members, the percentage of women members will increase to 23%. The following list of clubs added at least one female member since July 1, 2018. That list has grown by two over the last two months, and those clubs are shown in bold type in this listing: Camp Hill, Carlisle, Dallastown, Dover, Hanover, Mount Holly Springs, New Cumberland, Jefferson **Community**, Newville, Shippensburg, Upper Adams, Windsor and York Springs.

We congratulate all of the students who participated along with the following sponsoring clubs: the Arendtsville Lions Club, the Jacobus Lions Club, the Mechanicsburg Lions Club, the Newville Lions Club, the Windsor Lions Club and the York New Salem Lions Club.

But, we truly need to increase the number of sponsoring Lions Clubs and the number of children that our offered the wonderful opportunity to create a poster. It is a fantastic way to make a connection with your community along with giving young people the opportunity to express their vision of world peace. We, also, cannot place a price on what a difference this could make in a child's life by his/her participation in the Peace Poster Contest.

Melvin Jones Fellowships

I wish to let all Clubs know that as we enter the final quarter of this Lions year, right now is an excellent time to plan for honoring deserving members with Melvin Jones Fellowships.

A \$1,000 donation to Lions Clubs International Foundation qualifies for a MJF to honor a Lion or Lioness that has been a key member of your club, perhaps for many years. Melvin Jones Fellowships may be named in honor or in memory of an individual. Turn around time is 3-5 weeks from application for the MJF to receiving the plaque and pin.

The MJF donation does not need to be paid at once; minimum installments to LCIF of \$100 can be paid over a five-year period to total \$1,000, at which time donor applies for the MJF.

Your club may presently have funds available that were donated to LCIF in past years, but unused in your MJF club account. All that it takes to find out is to contact me and it would be my pleasure to help you with anything you need to apply for a MJF, or donate to LCIF's Campaign 100 for this honor.
