Let's remember this as we go forward to serve!




FIRST DISTRICT VICE GOVERNOR 14-C THOMAS L. JONES - STEWARTSTOWN LIONS CLUB

All club presidents and secretaries should attend, and all Lions, Lioness, and Leos are welcome and encouraged to learn what we are doing by being joined to Lions in other clubs. There will be goodies available from about 8:30 on, and we start business by 9:30. We will finish by lunch time (not provided). Please get any business items to DG Steve or Secretary-Treasurer Bob well in advance. And spread the word in your club newsletters and any mailing lists you have, as well as personal contacts with members.

Folks are checking on our usual places of the UM Church in Manchester and the York Springs Fire Hall for our other District Cabinet meetings, but they have not been confirmed.

Our District Convention will be April 18, 2020, at the Wyndham Gardens in York. Please put this on your calendars now and ask your clubs to do the same.

MEMBERSHIP UPDATE

June was a tough month for membership in District 14-C. As clubs adjusted their rosters in preparation for the new year, the dropped 26 members. Unfortunately, we didn't add nearly as many new members. Our new member count to June is 8 Lions, and we are grateful to those clubs that added these new members: Boiling Springs, Fairfield, Mason-Dixon, New Cumberland, New Freedom and Newville.

The most unfortunate aspect of this month's drops is that our District 14-C membership has dropped below 1,250, the number needed to be viable to nominate a candidate for International Director. As of the writing of this article, our membership stands at 1,242. It is imperative that we reverse these losses and push our membership back over the 1,250 mark. As you begin planning for the upcoming Lions year, please take time to develop a membership recruitment strategy. Your Zone Chair and our new Membership Coordinator, IPDG Lisa Griffie, will be happy to assist your club in any way possible.

At the same time, make sure your club is sensitive to the needs and wishes of your current membership. Of the 130 members we lost this year, only 24 were due to deaths. That means 106 members dropped for other reasons. Please take a critical look at the members your club lost this year and over the past few years and see if there are things your club could do to avoid future losses. Think about changes your club could make to make meeting and membership more engaging and enjoyable. Finding was to improve member satisfaction will help retain current members as well attract new members.

VISION SCREENING COMMITTEE REPORT

The District 14-C Vision Screening Committee is proud to report that we have surpassed last year's vision screening totals and set a new record for the number of screenings conducted. Last year's total was 1266, and already this year we have screened more than 1300 individuals! With two months and several screenings on the schedule, we hope to reach at least 1500 screenings this year.

21 of our Lions clubs have sponsored screenings so far this year. With 44 clubs in the district, there is plenty of room for growth. This is an easy, fun, and rewarding project for your club. To get started, simply contact one of the following Vision Screening Committee members:

FREE VISION EXAMS AND GLASSES THROUGH VSP

Earlier this year, our District 14-C Vision Screening Committee requested and received gift certificates for free vision exams and glasses. These certificates were made available to us from our Lions Club International Foundation (LCIF) in cooperation with Vision Services Providers (VSP). The certificates can be used to cover the cost of a basic vision exam and glasses through a participating provider for either children and adults.

The District was awarded 80 certificates. Each Zone Chair was given 10 certificates to distribute to the clubs in his or her zone as needed. We strongly encourage each club to secure a certificate when they receive a request for assistance before tapping into their own club resources. It is important that we use all 80 certificates before they expire in mid-August so that we can request and receive at least the same number of certificates next year.



If your club receives a request for assistance, please contact your zone chair or IPDG Dennis Cope, Vision Screening Committee Chair, to secure a VSP Gift Certificate. You will receive the certificate along with instructions and locations of participating providers.

LIONS CLUB INTERNATIONAL PEACE POSTER

2018/19 Merit Award Winner, Jaelyn Ridley, sponsored by the Sault Ste Marie Lions Club from Michigan with the theme, "Kindness Matters."

Attention, Lions of District 14-C: Join in the celebration of the 32nd birthday of Lions Club International Peace Poster contest by sponsoring a group of students. Extend the opportunity to students in your community for their voices to be heard in the form of their poster creations about peace. The theme for 2019/2020 is "Journey of Peace." I, myself, cannot wait to see what the children in my area will create!



Incoming presidents, in order to get the ball rolling, ask a member of your club to chair the Peace Poster Contest. **Only one member is necessary**. Take a look at your community and make a list of schools and/or organizations such as Scouts, Youth Centers, 4-H groups, church youth groups, etc. that you could offer this opportunity to and make the call or email. I would love to come and speak with your club and even go along to the school/youth group, etc. to share information about the Peace Poster Contest with the teacher and/or advisor.

The Peace Poster Contest is open to children ages 11-13 as of November 15. Each poster is judged on originality, artistic merit, and expression of the theme. Posters advance through several judging levels: local, district, multiple district, and international. At the international level, judges from the art, peace, youth, education and media communities select one grand prize winner and 23 merit award winners. One international grand prize winner will receive \$5,000 and a trip to a special award ceremony at the International Convention. Each of the 23 merit award winners will receive a cash award of \$500 and a certificate of achievement.

Order a kit online at **www.lionsclub.org.** Click on SHOP, type in and click on **Peace Poster Contest Kit**, and order your kit or call Club Supplies at (630571-5466 or 1-800-710-7822. (The staff is very helpful.) The cost of the kit is \$11.95 plus shipping. Lions Clubs around the world are, also, encouraged to sponsor students in the Lions International Essay Contest. The essay contest was created to offer the opportunity to visually impaired young people to express their ideas of world peace. The theme of the 2019-2020 International Essay Contest is "Journey of Peace." Students who are visually impaired and who are ages 11-13 as of November 15 are eligible to participate. The essay contest rules and entry form are included in the Peace Poster Contest Kit packet.

MELVIN JONES FELLOWSHIPS

I wish to let all Clubs know that as we enter the final quarter of this Lions year, right now is an excellent time to plan for honoring deserving members with Melvin Jones Fellowships.

A \$1,000 donation to Lions Clubs International Foundation qualifies for a MJF to honor a Lion or Lioness that has been a key member of your club, perhaps for many years. Melvin Jones Fellowships may be named in honor or in memory of an individual. Turn around time is 3-5 weeks from application for the MJF to receiving the plaque and pin.

The MJF donation does not need to be paid at once; minimum installments to LCIF of \$100 can be paid over a five-year period to total \$1,000, at which time donor applies for the MJF.

Your club may presently have funds available that were donated to LCIF in past years, but unused in your MJF club account. All that it takes to find out is to contact me and it would be my pleasure to help you with anything you need to apply for a MJF, or donate to LCIF's Campaign 100 for this honor.




