One of the joys of this role is that we are truly a team in District 14-C, with all the elected and appointed officers working together to build up the clubs so that together we can build up our communities and our world. Past District Governors are actively using their skills and experience to help us, and Zone Chairs and project leaders are working to grow our service.

I am actively working to schedule the 50 or so visits to Lions, Lioness, and Leo Clubs in our district. It may be a good time for our Lioness to consider bridging and becoming Lions Clubs, as Lions Clubs International has set a deadline to end the Lioness program June 30, 2021. It's not my decision; please don't shoot the messenger! But after that time, Lioness Clubs will no longer be insured under our Lions policy, and members will no longer get credit for years of service or the offices they have held. The charter fee has been waived, and there is no minimum number of members required to bridge.

I look forward to working with you during the coming year as we grow in service.

MEMBERSHIP UPDATE

A TURN IN THE RIGHT DIRECTION! ... For the first time in several months, our new member count for the month was higher than our dropped member count. This resulted in a membership increase from last month to 1260 Lions in District 14-C. Congratulations to the Mechanicsburg Lions Club for leading the way with 7 new members added in May, and also to Boiling Springs Lions and New Oxford Lions for adding one new member each.



With one month left in this Lions year we need a net gain of 20 members to get the District back to where we started the year - 1280 members. 13 clubs have yet to add a new member this year. If each of those clubs adds a member, that will be a tremendous help! Because clubs often drop members at the end of the year, it is likely we will need 30-40 new members to offset this year's losses. Can we do it? Of course we can!! How? By asking! Make this a goal for your end-of-year meeting so you can include a new member induction ceremony along with your installation of new officers. What a great way to end the year!!

VISION SCREENING COMMITTEE REPORT

The District 14-C Vision Screening Committee is proud to report that we have surpassed last year's vision screening totals and set a new record for the number of screenings conducted. Last year's total was 1266, and already this year we have screened more than 1300 individuals! With two months and several screenings on the schedule, we hope to reach at least 1500 screenings this year.

21 of our Lions clubs have sponsored screenings so far this year. With 44 clubs in the district, there is plenty of room for growth. This is an easy, fun, and rewarding project for your club. To get started, simply contact one of the following Vision Screening Committee members:

FREE VISION EXAMS AND GLASSES THROUGH VSP

Earlier this year, our District 14-C Vision Screening Committee requested and received gift certificates for free vision exams and glasses. These certificates were made available to us from our Lions Club International Foundation (LCIF) in cooperation with Vision Services Providers (VSP). The certificates can be used to cover the cost of a basic vision exam and glasses through a participating provider for either children and adults.

The District was awarded 80 certificates. Each Zone Chair was given 10 certificate to distribute to the clubs in his or her zone as needed. We strongly encourage each club to secure a certificate when they receive a request for assistance before tapping into their own club resources. It is important that we use all 80 certificates before they expire in mid-August so that we can request and receive at least the same number of certificates next year.



If your club receives a request for assistance, please contact your zone chair or IPDG Dennis Cope, Vision Screening Committee Chair, to secure a VSP Gift Certificate. You will receive the certificate along with instructions and locations of participating providers.

LIONS CLUB INTERNATIONAL PEACE POSTER

What an amazing job Yu Meng did in sharing with the world her vision of world peace with the 2018/2019 theme, "Kindness Matters!"

Now, it is time to get on board, Lions of District 14-C, to order your kits for the Peace Poster Contest for 2019-2020. The theme is "Journey of Peace." The last few months of school is the perfect time to contact a school in your area and introduce them to the Lions Club International Peace Poster Contest. It could be the inception of a wonderful relationship being established between your Lions Club and the school or other organized group of children that your club is sponsoring.



So, with this in mind, ask for a "volunteer" from your club to chair the Peace Poster Contest. It really only takes one club member. Take a look at your community and make a list of schools and/or organizations such as Scouts, Youth Centers, 4-H groups, church youth groups, etc. that you could offer this opportunity to, take the plunge and make the call or email. Please use me as a resource. I would love to come and speak with your club and even go along to the school to share information about the Peace Poster Contest with the teacher and/or advisor.

The Peace Poster Contest is open to children ages 11-13 as of November 15. Each poster is judged on originality, artistic merit, and expression of the theme. Posters advance through several judging levels: local, district, multiple district, and international. At the international level, judges from the art, peace, youth, education and media communities select one grand prize winner and 23 merit award winners. One international grand prize winner will receive \$5,000 and a trip to a special award ceremony at the International Convention. Each of the 23 merit award winners will receive a cash award of \$500 and a certificate of achievement.

(The staff is very helpful.) The cost of the kit is \$11.95 plus shipping. Lions Clubs around the world are, also, encouraged to sponsor students in the **Lions International Essay Contest**. The essay contest was created to offer the opportunity to visually impaired young people to express their ideas of world peace. The theme of the 2019-2020 International Essay Contest is "**Journey of Peace.**" Students who are visually impaired and who are ages 11-13 as of November 15 are eligible to participate. MELVIN JONES FELLOWSHIPS

I wish to let all Clubs know that as we enter the final quarter of this Lions year, right now is an excellent time to plan for honoring deserving members with Melvin Jones Fellowships.

A \$1,000 donation to Lions Clubs International Foundation qualifies for a MJF to honor a Lion or Lioness that has been a key member of your club, perhaps for many years. Melvin Jones Fellowships may be named in honor or in memory of an individual. Turn around time is 3-5 weeks from application for the MJF to receiving the plaque and pin.

The MJF donation does not need to be paid at once; minimum installments to LCIF of \$100 can be paid over a five-year period to total \$1,000, at which time donor applies for the MJF.

Your club may presently have funds available that were donated to LCIF in past years, but unused in your MJF club account. All that it takes to find out is to contact me and it would be my pleasure to help you with anything you need to apply for a MJF, or donate to LCIF's Campaign 100 for this honor.

Adam T. Foreman, Students Program Specialist elaborates, "The Billy Michal Student Leadership Award is given annually to one student from each state who demonstrates the American Spirit in his or her community. The values of leadership, teamwork, tolerance, creativity, and perseverance can and should be learned and lived by all Americans regardless of age. During World War II, when six-year-old Billy Michal from Zimmerman, Louisiana, helped his one-room school win a statewide scrap-metal collection contest, he understood that every citizen- no matter their age- could contribute to our victory in the war."

After a short new member initiation by Plainfield Lion Ortrun Gates, the six new members Alexandra Kutulakis, Zachary Rodgers, Colin Boyd, Allison Beecher, Sadie Groff and Liam Ocker were inducted into the LEO Club.

Dan Brant, President Newville Lions Club gave a short explanation the origin of LEO Clubs, "In 1957, the Glenside Lions from Pennsylvania sponsored the world's first LEO Club – the Abington High School LEO Club, with 35 students. LEO members acquire skills as project organizers and motivators of their peers. They discover how teamwork and cooperation can bring about change in their community and the world. LEOs develop positive character traits and receive recognition for their contributions."

Mr. Anderson invited all new and current LEO Club members to come forward and sign the LEO charter "as the inaugural group of Big Spring High School TEMPUS/LEO Club Members", and reminded everyone that "We, as a group, stand ready to help build a better tomorrow through the community service that we provide and in return we will build within ourselves the character that will serve us throughout our life. 
