MESSAGE FROM STEVE SHIPMAN



"Insanity is doing the same thing over and over again and expecting different results." This statement usually attributed to Albert Einstein is something we need to consider as Lions Clubs.

In more than a century of our existence, Lions have provided wonderful service for our communities and our world. And we still do. Yet in North America, we have fewer and fewer hands available to do the work, and our aging hands and bodies can't do what we once could.

We are being told again and again that we need more members, and our clubs have certainly worked hard to interest folks in joining us. But with the exception of one year, our membership in District 14-C has been dropping for decades (although the rate has slowed in recent years). This is in spite of dedicated and hard-working District Governors and cabinet and club officers who have done their very best.

If what your club is doing is working, please keep it up. But the reality is that for most of us, it is not. There were 14 Lions the most recent meeting of my club; the president noted that when he had last led a meeting many years ago, we had 113 members and at least 70 at every meeting. And I don't think our story is unique.

The simple reality is that while many people are interested in serving other people, very few will join an old boys' dinner club that conducts occasional fund-raisers. We need to focus on hands-on service and involve people in service in order to interest them in Lions membership.

A few ideas: If your club has a meal with every meeting, why? Many growing clubs gather in meeting rooms (perhaps in a community center or fire hall) to plan service and enjoy light refreshments or desserts. Save the meals for special occasions, and don't include the meal costs in your dues. And keep the meetings to an hour or less!

Also, have you considered a branch club that might gather at a different time? This is especially helpful if your members still value the dinner meetings; a branch might offer a different way for younger people to serve with you.

And we live in a multi-ethnic world. Do you have contacts with people who might be uncomfortable in your club but who would love to join with similar people to serve and show that they are valuable citizens of our community? Contact me or one of our officers and we will be happy to meet with them.

If what you are doing is working, don't stop. But if it isn't, doing the same thing over and over again is unlikely to produce different results. What does your club need to change to be able to continue its service to your community?

We are Lions. We serve. Let's not lose sight of the basics.

MEMBERSHIP UPDATE

STOP THE BLEEDING! That is priority number one for first responders. When it comes to our District membership, we need to use the same approach to membership losses. So far this year, District 14-C has lost 96 members. While Lions membership worldwide is increasing, membership in the United States, as in District 14-C, continues to decline. This decline affects the United States representation on the International Board of Directors and threatens the ability of the United States to determine the direction of our Lions organization.

Why is membership declining in District 14-C as well as the rest of the United States? Let's look at our own District 14-C for some answers. Of the 96 members we lost this year, 21 were due to member deaths. The average age of our membership is increasing, and this is to be expected. 17 more losses were due to the closing of two clubs: York Eastgate Sunrise and York Township. As our clubs lose members, they are not replacing members, which leaves the club without the physical and financial resources to carry on their efforts.

That leaves 58 Lions who decided not to continue their involvement with their local Lions Club. Why did these Lions leave? Why did these individuals feel Lions club was not enough of a priority to continue their involvement? These membership drops are the root cause of our membership decrease, both in District 14-C and across the United States. Without these losses, our District membership would be +30 for the year. Each time a Lion leaves a club, we need to find an honest answer as to the reason and see what steps the club can take to remedy that situation.

Sometimes older members with health issues and mobility limitations feel they can't contribute and there is no longer a reason to remain a member. Find a role for these individuals to fulfill and remind them of the importance of their membership to the overall health of the club and the Lions organization.

What about your club meetings? Are they interesting, entertaining, engaging, and productive? Prospective members, for the most part, are not looking for another social outlet, but they are looking for ways to help others. Lions meetings should be focused on service and addressing the needs of our community while building camaraderie among the membership.



The cost of dues is often cited as the reason members leave a club. It is imperative that members understand how their dues are being used and the importance of these dues in helping Lions meet their mission of service. Be sure members understand that their dues support the administrative costs of our Lions organization at all levels - International, Multiple District, and District - not just at the club level, and how the club benefits from that support. At about \$5 per month to support our Lions organization outside of the club level, it's a pretty good deal!

Also in regard to dues, clubs should explore offering a variety of local membership options, from low-cost basic memberships to memberships that include meals. Remember, club costs must be covered through dues, and dollars given to the club from the public through fundraisers and donations must be used for service. Members need to understand and appreciate this core principal of Lions.

Now is the time for the incoming club officers and board members of each club to take a critical look at the state of the club and set goals for the coming year. Look at the members lost over the past 5-10 years and see if there are any trends in the reasons. Informally survey your newer members to see what the club is doing that might not be attractive to potential members and what suggestions they have for changes. Formally survey the entire club membership using tools that are available from LCI to see get ideas on changes that will improve the function of your club.

Based on the information you collect, set specific goals for recruitment of new members and retention of current members. Then develop specific action plans to attain those goals. As always, your District leadership team is ready and willing to assist your club in any effort to strengthen and improve your club. IPDG Dennis Cope is the current District Membership Coordinator, and DG Lisa Griffie will assume that role in July. Please contact either of these individual for assistance.

VISION SCREENING COMMITTEE REPORT

The District 14-C Vision Screening Committee is proud to report that we have surpassed last year's vision screening totals and set a new record for the number of screenings conducted. Last year's total was 1266, and already this year we have screened more than 1300 individuals! With two months and several screenings on the schedule, we hope to reach at least 1500 screenings this year.

21 of our Lions clubs have sponsored screenings so far this year. With 44 clubs in the district, there is plenty of room for growth. This is an easy, fun, and rewarding project for your club. To get started, simply contact one of the following Vision Screening Committee members:

FREE VISION EXAMS AND GLASSES THROUGH VSP

Earlier this year, our District 14-C Vision Screening Committee requested and received gift certificates for free vision exams and glasses. These certificates were made available to us from our Lions Club International Foundation (LCIF) in cooperation with Vision Services Providers (VSP). The certificates can be used to cover the cost of a basic vision exam and glasses through a participating provider for either children and adults.

The District was awarded 80 certificates. Each Zone Chair was given 10 certificate to distribute to the clubs in his or her zone as needed. We strongly encourage each club to secure a certificate when they receive a request for assistance before tapping into their own club resources. It is important that we use all 80 certificates before they expire in mid-August so that we can request and receive at least the same number of certificates next year.



If your club receives a request for assistance, please contact your zone chair or IPDG Dennis Cope, Vision Screening Committee Chair, to secure a VSP Gift Certificate. You will receive the certificate along with instructions and locations of participating providers.

The last few months of school is the perfect time to contact a school in your area and introduce them to the Lions Club International Peace Poster Contest. It could be the inception of a wonderful relationship being established between your Lions Club and the school or other organized group of children that your club is sponsoring.



So, with this in mind, ask for a "volunteer" from your club to chair the Peace Poster Contest. It really only takes one club member. Take a look at your community and make a list of schools and/or organizations such as Scouts, Youth Centers, 4-H groups, church youth groups, etc. that you could offer this opportunity to, take the plunge and make the call or email. Please use me as a resource. I would love to come and speak with your club and even go along to the school to share information about the Peace Poster Contest with the teacher and/or advisor.

The Peace Poster Contest is open to children ages 11-13 as of November 15. Each poster is judged on originality, artistic merit, and expression of the theme. Posters advance through several judging levels: local, district, multiple district, and international. At the international level, judges from the art, peace, youth, education and media communities select one grand prize winner and 23 merit award winners. One international grand prize winner will receive \$5,000 and a trip to a special award ceremony at the International Convention. Each of the 23 merit award winners will receive a cash award of \$500 and a certificate of achievement.

The essay contest was created to offer the opportunity to visually impaired young people to express their ideas of world peace. The theme of the 2019-2020 International Essay Contest is "**Journey of Peace.**" Students who are visually impaired and who are ages 11-13 as of November 15 are eligible to participate. MELVIN JONES FELLOWSHIPS

I wish to let all Clubs know that as we enter the final quarter of this Lions year, right now is an excellent time to plan for honoring deserving members with Melvin Jones Fellowships.

A \$1,000 donation to Lions Clubs International Foundation qualifies for a MJF to honor a Lion or Lioness that has been a key member of your club, perhaps for many years. Melvin Jones Fellowships may be named in honor or in memory of an individual. Turn around time is 3-5 weeks from application for the MJF to receiving the plaque and pin.

Ballot Question 2019 Multiple District 14 Convention

THE FOLLOWING RESOLUTION CONCERNS THE MULTIPLE DISTRICT 14 CONSTITUTION. (THIS AMENDMENT TO THE CONSTITUTION REQUIRES A TWO THIRDS MAJORITY OF THE VOTES CAST TO ADOPT.)

A RESOLUTION TO PROVIDE A REVISION TO THE SELECTION OF THE VICE COUNCIL CHAIRPERSON AND THE COUNCIL CHAIRPERSON AS LISTED IN ARTICLE VII, SECTIONS 1- COMPOSITION, SECTION 4-COUNCIL CHAIRPERSON, AND SECTION 5- COUNCIL VICE CHAIRPERSON.

THIS REVISION IS TO CHANGE THE PROCESS OF THE SELECTION OF THE VICE COUNCIL CHAIRPERSON AND COUNCIL CHAIRPERSON FROM A DISTRICT ROTATION TO ONE WHERE THE VICE COUNCIL CHAIRPERSON IS SELECTED FROM THE FIRST VICE DISTRICT GOVERNORS.

BE IT RESOLVED, that effective July 1, 2019, Article VII, Sections 1, 4, and 5 will read as follows:

"Section 1. COMPOSITION. There shall be a State Council composed of all of the District Governors in the Multiple District and the Chairperson of the State Council (who shall be a Past District Governor), who are the voting members.

Section 4. COUNCIL CHAIRPERSON. The Chairperson of the State Council shall be the Immediate Past District Governor who served in the capacity of Vice Council Chairperson during the preceding year. The Council Chairperson will serve a one- year term only and cannot serve in that capacity again. In the event the Chairperson is unable or refuses to serve, or having accepted, resigns or dies, the sitting District Governors shall appoint an Immediate Past District Governor to serve the remaining term of office. If no Immediate Past District Governor is willing to serve, the District Governors will select a qualified Past District Governor to serve the remainder of the term. Any lion selected to serve as Council Chairperson must be a Pennsylvania resident and a member in good standing of an MD-14 Lions Club.

Section 5. VICE COUNCIL CHAIRPERSON. The Vice Council Chairperson for Lions year 2019-2020 shall be the District Governor from District 14 P. The Vice Council Chairperson for Lions year 2020-2021 shall be the District Governor from District 14 T. The Vice Council Chairperson for the Lions year 2021-2022 shall be the District Governor from District 14 U. The Vice Council Chairperson for Lions year 2022-2023 shall be the District Governor from District 14 W. For Lions year 2023-2024 and thereafter, the determination as to who will be the Vice Council Chairperson for a given Council shall be made while that group is serving as First Vice District Governors. One of the sitting First Vice District Governors will be selected by the sitting District Governors at the Fourth Council of Governors Meeting. The first selection of a Vice Council Chairperson using this method will occur at the Fourth Council of Governors Meeting of the 2022-2023 Lions year. The Vice Council Chairperson will serve a one-year term (concurrent with the year as District Governor) and then become the Council Chairperson. In the event, either before or after becoming the Vice Council Chairperson, the Lion is unable or refuses to serve, or having accepted, resigns or dies, the sitting District Governors shall appoint a replacement from among the same group of First Vice District Governors (who may now be District Governors) to serve out the term of office and then serve as the Council Chairperson. If no one in this group is willing to serve, then the sitting District Governors will select a qualified Past District Governor to serve in the position."

SHALL THIS RESOLUTION BE ADOPTED? YES NO
