


DG Steve Shipman joined by President Dan Lawrence congratulates Jack Shultz (seated) for his 45 years of service.

DG Shipman presented some district goals and promote the importance of Lionism. In his presentation, Shipman spoke about the fundamental importance of the mantra "getting back to the basics" with regard to club membership both in recruiting new members and retaining current members.

DG Shipman shares importance of Vince Lombardi's "getting back to the basics" mantra as it associates with Lionism.

As an avid Green Bay Packers fan, Shipman used this mantra that was emphasized by the great Vince Lombardi in building and leading his professional football teams to many years of dominance and several championships in the NFL. He encouraged current members to seek potential members and have them be part of a club's service project before they attend a club meeting. Getting them personally involved in the basics of what Lions do (the hands-on events) will have a greater impact than sitting in

on a meeting and just hearing about what goes on in the club. Potential members will benefit more by "living" the experience of being in service to others.

Shipman also shared that the average age of membership in the Lions is increasing every year. New members do not have to be in their 20s or 30s or even their 40s as many are busy getting started in their work careers or raising families and involved in their children's school, athletic, and social events. Instead, he encouraged club members to seek potential members with grown children, those who are more settled and have that additional time available or those who are recently retired. Age is not a factor when it comes to being in service to others.

DG Shipman expressed his appreciation for the great service the Hanover Lions Club is doing for the Hanover community. He knows from his own personal experience that Lions support some great causes and organizations

that are also doing good work for the community. He encouraged members to look for ways to be a "Bridge" that brings two organizations together when it comes to providing service.



DG Shipman recommended that clubs should invite representatives from those supported organizations to a meeting to give the organization an up-front opportunity to learn more about the Hanover Lions Club and its mission, and at the same time it allows club members to learn more about the organizations being supported, the service being provided, and the difference being made in the joint effort. The Hanover Lions was pleased to share that it invites and secures many organizational representatives who receive club support to speak with the club members during meetings throughout the year.

Following the presentation, the Hanover Lions Club thanked Mr. Shipman for attending and sharing his goals and mission. The club provided DG Shipman with a donation to support his district-wide projects.



Following the opening of the convention, our District Chaplain, Lion Rodger Snyder will honor our recently deceased members by leading the District 14-C Necrology.

Our Keynote Speaker, International Director Gary Brown, will follow the Necrology with an inspiring message focused on leadership.
