Lions International Peace Poster



What a beautiful representation of the theme “Peace Through Service” created by 13 year old Yue Zheng of China sponsored by the Dalian De Long Lions Club! As the dove is flying toward peace with open wings, many examples of service are shown in the open wings of the dove. The artist, Yue Zheng said, “Let us create peace together by imbuing service in every corner of the world.”

My hopes are that Yue Zheng’s poster will motivate you extend the opportunity to the youth in your area to participate in the Lions International Peace Poster Contest. The theme for the 2021/2022 contest is “We Are All Connected.” Make that connection with the youth in your community by sponsoring them in this amazing contest.

The important information for you to know about the Peace Poster Contest includes the following:

- The Peace Poster Contest is open to children ages 11-13 as of November 15.
- Each poster is judged on originality, artistic merit, and expression of the theme.
- Posters advance through several judging levels: local, district, multiple district, and international.
- At the international level, judges from the art, peace, youth, education and media communities select one grand prize winner and 23 merit award winners.
- One international grand prize winner will receive \$5,000 and a trip to a special awards ceremony at the International Convention. Each of the 23 merit award winners will receive a cash award of \$500 and a certificate of achievement.

Your club can, also, sponsor visually-impaired students in the Lions International Essay Contest! Students who are visually impaired and who are of the ages 11-13 as of November 15 are eligible to participate.

Please let me know if your club needs a Peace Poster Kit. I have a supply of them and will make sure your club gets one. The kit includes the contest rules and guide for the club, the contest rules and guide for the participating students, a participation flyer (this flyer shares the information about the contest with the parent/s), a winner sticker to be placed on the back of the winning poster, an achievement award certificate, and a certificate of appreciation for the participants.

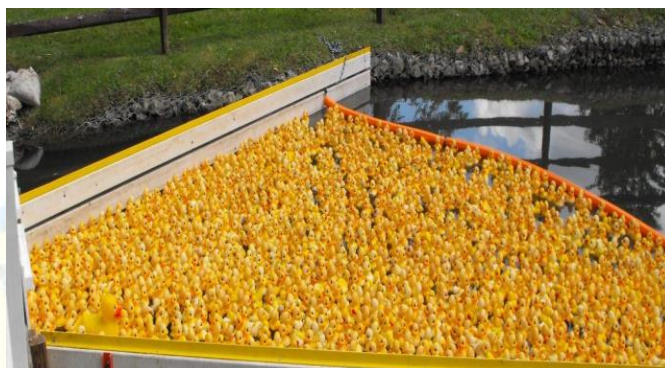

14-C DISTRICT CONVENTION REPORT

The 2021 District 14-C Convention was held on Saturday afternoon, April 17, 2021, using the Zoom virtual meeting platform. In accordance with COVID-19 restrictions, a small group of district cabinet members and convention coordinators participated in the convention activities in person at Stewartstown Presbyterian Church.

The convention began with a necrology slideshow. The slideshow recognized deceased Lions who passed away from March 2019 through the date for the convention, thus including Lions who were not able to be honored last year due the cancellation of the convention.

Following the opening formalities of the convention, Past International Director Ardie Kelmish provided the participants with an inspiring keynote message regarding the work of Lions around the world, including the efforts made by our Lions Clubs International Foundation to fight the COVID-19 pandemic. She recognized our clubs for their contributions to LCIF and also those clubs who showed membership growth this year.

In appreciation for her participation in our district convention and her efforts on behalf of Lions clubs, PID Ardie was presented with a \$1,000 donation to LCIF in her name. In acknowledgement and gratitude, PID Ardie wrote the following:

"Thank you so very much for your generous LCIF donation! It will make a positive impact on HUNDREDS of lives! Thanks for allowing me to participate in your convention. Thanks to each of you for your dedicated service as a Lion. I hope to see you in person at the USA/Canada Forum September 9-11, 2021 in Des Moines, IOWA. Stay safe and well. Ardie Klemish"

Three concurrent seminars were held during the convention. PDG Dennis Bell led a seminar entitled, "Lions Learning Opportunities," here he presented the many resources available to Lions to become better informed about our organization and improve their leadership skills. Lion Marty Zimmerman led a discussion designed to inspire clubs to consider new service activities during a seminar entitled, "Expanding our Impact." Due to some technical difficulties, PDG Kerry McKnight was not able to present his similar entitled, "My Next Steps as a Lion."

The fourth and final cabinet meeting of this Lions followed the seminars. This meeting included remarks from the District Governor and the Vice District Governors as well as reports by the Zone Chairs. Also of note was the approval by the cabinet for the Lions Clubs in Region 1 to submit a grant application to LCIF to provide a refrigerated storage unit for The Gleaning Project of South Central Pennsylvania.

Another highlight of the convention was the election of our District 14-C officers for Lions year 2021-2022. Elected by unanimous vote were:

District Governor - Daniel Brant, Newville Lions Club

First Vice District Governor - Keith Shoff, Brogue Community Lions Club

Second Vice District Governor - Marty Zimmerman, Stewartstown Lions Club

The convention also included the presentation of two videos, one about the PA Lions Beacon Lodge Camp and the other about Leader Dogs. These videos aired during the breaks.

If polling results are an indication, this year's district convention can be considered a success with 54% of respondents giving the convention a rating of "Excellent" and 44% rating their convention experience "Good." While we managed to have this year's convention amid the on-going pandemic, we look forward to gathering together for an in-person convention in 2022!

VISION EXAM AND GLASSES GIFT CERTIFICATES

Each zone chairperson currently has VSP Gift Certificates, which provide a vision exam and, if needed, glasses for low income individuals who meet eligibility requirements. If your club receives a request for assistance with glasses and/or a vision exam, please contact your zone chairperson and ask for a certificate. This will help your club save funds that can then be used for other needs. The current batch of certificates expire on August 27, 2021.

CLUB SECRETARIES AND CLUB ADMINISTRATORS

If you haven't already done so, please make sure you enter your club's officers for Lions year 2021-2022 in MyLCI as soon as possible.

To report your club's 2021-2022 officers, follow these steps:

1. From the MyLCI landing page, click on "My Lions Club" and click on "Officers" from the drop-down menu.
2. Find "Select Term" and choose "Next Year" from the drop-down menu.
3. Click on the "Officer Type" tab and choose "Lions Club Officers"
4. For each office listed, click on the "Add Officer" tab
5. Click on "Select Member" to reveal a list of your clubs members
6. Click on the member who will serve in the office

The procedure listed above will allow you to identify the individuals who will serve in the offices included in the Standard Club Constitution and By-Laws. Additional officers specific to your club (Tail Twister, Lion Tamer, Chaplain, Committee Chairs), use the following procedure:

1. From the MyLCI landing page, click on "My Lions Club" and click on "Officers" from the drop-down menu.
2. Find "Add Local Title."
3. Type the title of the position you wish to add to your club's listing.
4. Click on "Save"

To access your newly created (or previously created) titles and identify the members holding these titles, use the following procedure:

1. From the MyLCI landing page, click on "My Lions Club" and click on "Officers" from the drop-down menu.
2. Find "Select Term" and choose "Next Year" from the drop-down menu.
3. Click on the "Officer Type" tab and choose "Local Titles "
4. For each office listed, click on the "Add Officer" tab
5. Click on "Select Member" to reveal a list of your clubs members
6. Click on the member who will serve in the office

To identify a Club Administrator for your club, use the following procedure:

1. From the MyLCI landing page, click on "My Lions Club" and click on "Officers" from the drop-down menu.
2. Find "Select Term" and choose "Next Year" from the drop-down menu.
3. Click on the "Officer Type" tab and choose "Lions Club Admins"
4. Click on the "Add Officer" tab

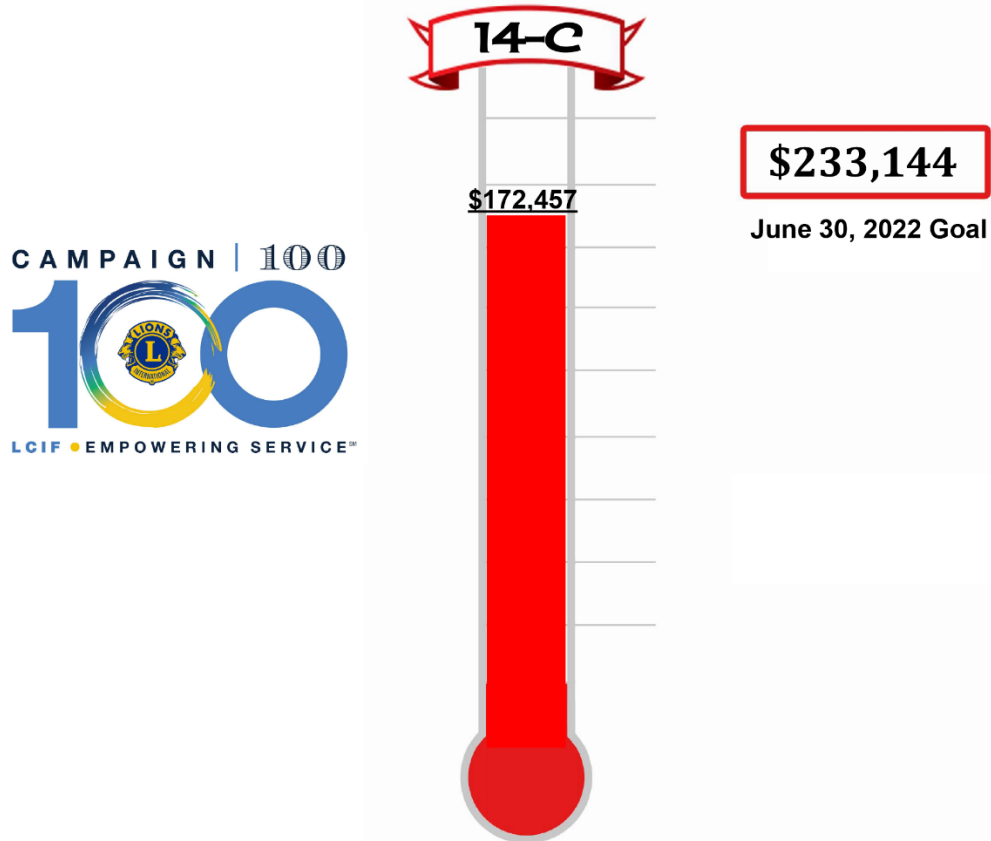

In 2017 the Lions Clubs International Foundation assigned your District 14-C a Campaign 100 goal of raising \$233,144 to aid communities throughout the world. As you can see by our "Campaign 100 Progress Thermometer", 14-C has reached 74% of our Campaign 100 goal, which leads all the other Lions districts in Pennsylvania. Donations received by June 30, 2023 will still be included in the final count.

In many places in the world, including our district, donations to LCIF this Lions year are down significantly due to COVID. Grant requests have been increasing dramatically since the pandemic broke out about a year ago. I was told by a LCIF board member that the pandemic has seen more grant requests than any other period in LCIF's 53 year history.

We all have had a difficult Lions year. LCIF is asking if you have not already supported LCIF this year for you and your club to consider a contribution to Campaign 100 if possible.
