


District 14C Newsletter September 2021

District Governor Dan Brant has issued a call for the first District 14-C Cabinet Meeting of Lion Year 2021-2022:


Date: Saturday, August 21, 2021

Lions International Peace Poster Contest

"Slow and steady wins the race!"

Lions of District 14-C: Let your club be a true **winner** by extending the opportunity to an organized group of children in your area to participate in the Lions International Peace Poster Contest with your sponsorship! This contest gives children around the world the opportunity to express and share their vision of world peace along with inspiring the world with their artistic talent and creativity. The organized group of children could be from a school, a Scouting group, a homeschool group, an after-school group, a church youth group, a youth volunteer group, etc. The children must be 11, 12, or 13 on November 15 to be eligible to participate. The theme for the 2021/2022 Lions International Peace Poster Contest is "We Are All Connected." This theme could not be more relevant for the times in which we live. I cannot wait to see what the children in District 14-C create!

Please let me know if your club needs a Peace Poster Kit. I have a supply of them ready to distribute. I, also, will bring them along to our District 14-C Cabinet Meeting on August 21st. The cost for each kit is \$11.95. The kit includes includes the contest rules and guide for the club, the contest rules and guide for the participating students, a participation flyer (this flyer shares the information about the contest with the parent/s), a winner sticker to be placed on the back of the winning poster, an achievement award certificate, and a certificate of appreciation for the participants.

As quoted from the LCI website, "some of the great reasons for Lions Clubs to sponsor the Peace Poster Contest are: *it boosts kids' self-esteem and lets them know that their ideas matter. It, also, offers clubs the opportunity to promote peace while increasing their visibility in their communities. And most importantly, it gives children-and adults –hope for the future."*

Lions Clubs around the world are, also, encouraged to sponsor students in the Lions International Essay Contest. The essay contest was created to offer the opportunity to visually impaired young people to express their ideas of world peace. Students who are visually impaired and who are ages 11-13 as of November 15 are eligible to participate. The essay contest rules and application form are included in the Peace Poster Kit and can, also, be found by searching Lions International Peace Essay Contest. The theme is, also, "We Are All Connected."

Here is a listing of the positions that are currently vacant and a brief explanation of the responsibility:

Family and Women Membership Development Chairperson - This person works with the Global Membership Coordinator and focuses on ways to encourage membership growth by recruiting family members of current Lions club members and also more women.

Program and Facilities Chairperson - This person make helps secure locations for district meetings, at the direction of the District Governor. This person also maintains the district's property and equipment (such as flags, podium, banner, and sound system) and is responsible to have the proper items at each district meeting.

Public Relations and Lions Information Chairperson - This person supports the District Governor in enhancing the image and awareness of Lions, Lioness, LEOs and the international organization in the areas encompassed by District 14-C.

Diabetes Awareness and Action Chairperson - This person works with the Global Service Team Coordinator and focuses on district activities to promote Diabetes awareness, education, and prevention, which is one of LCI's five global service initiatives.

Environment Chairperson - This person works with the Global Service Team Coordinator and works to promote environmental awareness and protection at both the club and district level. This is one of LCI's global service initiatives

Audit Committee - Cumberland County Representative - This person is part of a three-member team that reviews the district's financial records shortly after the end of the Lions fiscal year. Typically this is accomplished in one or two meetings. This is a three-year appointment, which requires minimal time.



District 14-C will host the PA Lions State Council of Governors for their meetings, February 4-6, 2022. The weekend will include the State Council Meeting, State Committee meetings and reports, Vice District Governor Training, and a closing banquet featuring a guest International Director or Past International Director. 

VISIONCORPS OFFERS FREE PROGRAMS TO GROUPS

VisionCorps is now offering virtual programs to organizations and employers about its services. The programs, which can be individualized based on the needs of the group, include information on vision problems, living with low vision, employing people with low vision, and tips for living independently with blindness or low vision.

"During the pandemic when it is more difficult to meet in groups, many community groups – such as the Lions clubs, churches, and others – are meeting in teleconferences," said Dennis Steiner, VisionCorps President/CEO. "We can present virtual programs to meet their needs."

VisionCorps also gives programs in person, when advisable during the pandemic. All the programs are provided free of charge, and all services offered to clients of VisionCorps are free, said Steiner.

VisionCorps provides programs and services to clients in Lancaster, Adams, Chester, Lebanon, and York counties. VisionCorps programs include a general presentation about its mission and services, specific rehabilitation tips for those living with low vision, and training and Continuing Education Units (CEUs) for employees who work with individuals who are blind or have low vision.

"We want people to know about the services we provide," said Steiner. "We offer education and prevention of blindness services, rehabilitation, and employment to individuals in South Central Pennsylvania."
