A Message From the District Governor

By the end of the day Thursday, we had 15 paid prospective members of the new club, and we were well on our way. Thanks, in particular, to Lion Carl Winfield from Camp Hill and PDG John Griffie who made valuable contributions to the effort.

Finally, I would ask you to pay particular attention to some upcoming events in the District. First, on April the 23rd is our District Convention at the Wyndham Garden Hotel in York. The convention will last about half a day, starting in the afternoon. In that time period you will hear a great speaker, have several good seminar options, be immersed in a Necrology Service for District 14C Lions lost during the last year, participate in the election of new District officers, and hear from the new District Governor and Vice District Governors. Secondly, there will be District 14C Bingo at the Eureka Fire Hall in Stewartstown to benefit LCIF. We would like clubs to sell raffle tickets and tickets for bingo, and sponsor a bingo game. And then on May 14th from 9:00 am until 1:00 pm, Lions Clubs in Adams, Cumberland and York Counties will simultaneously hold District 14C Diabetes Awareness "Strides Walks" at locations to be announced within their counties. 

Kidney Donors Sought

The following letter is from Lion Gail Fridenvalds, wife of PCC Gus Fridenvalds

Dear Lions and Friends,

Most of you know Gus Fridenvalds or have heard of him. In his life as a Lion he was District Governor for Lions District 14-C in 2008-2009 and Council Chair for District 14 in 2009-1010. He has worked on many projects and has been part of the Western Cumberland County Lions Group. He is a member of the York Springs Lions Club.

For the past several years Gus has suffered from Chronic Kidney Disease. Two years ago, during the Covid Pandemic, he began Dialysis treatment. At first at home and presently at the Center in Carlisle. During this time, he began to discuss Kidney Transplants with Johns Hopkins Hospital in Baltimore and Tower Health in Reading (now Penn Transplant Center in Philadelphia).

His wife Gail is a willing donor, is not a match and is considered too old. Gus is currently on the Active Transplant List at Hopkins and the University of Pennsylvania. The wait is 5 to 7 years for a kidney from a deceased person.

Consequently, we are looking for a living donor. Gus has O + Blood but you do not need that to be a match.

Below is a "direct access" to the University of Pennsylvania site. The site will ask various questions and determine if you could be a donor.



Leader Dog Puppy Raiser Robbie Teal


FLD Killian and I decided to get away from the cold winter in Pennsylvania and enjoy the warmth of the sun in Florida. Traveling with a dog is a lot like traveling with a young child. You need to pack for every possible situation. For those who have met me, you know that I wear around my waist, a treat bag for training Killian. It is on my right side and used to reward good behavior. When traveling, you need to make sure you have plenty of treats for refills with you. I pack my suit case, then I pack Killian's bag. I include his paperwork, which is my information from Leader Dogs, his vaccination certificate, both which are placed in a file folder, and in his bag within easy reach. I then place several zip lock bags of dog food already measured out in the correct portion, along with treats to refill my treat bag. Of course, the most important thing is Killian's chew toys to help keep him entertained. I use a portable 42 inch canvas crate for traveling since Killian is over 70 pounds, and secure it on the floor in the back seat area. Pennsylvania law states that a dog is required to be secure when traveling. A dog must be in a crate, harness and seatbelt, or tethered so they don't become a projectile in case of an accident. It is a \$300.00 fine if caught with a dog that is not secured. (Have a friend who found out the hard



way about the fine.) I also pack Killian's metal crate for him to use wherever we stay. I place his bed inside the portable crate along with a few of his toys. I take his regular food and water dish, but I also pack a portable water dish to use on the road. I carry a small cooler with a half dozen bottles of water. I usually freeze two bottles which keep the rest cold. Poop bags are a must. You want to keep any area your dog uses as clean as possible. This shows you are a good dog owner, and helps keep diseases from spreading to another dog. The last item is a first aid kit. When traveling with a young puppy, under 12 weeks old, I make a pit stop every 2 hours. At Killian's age, we can travel for at least 3-31/2 hours before we need to stop and stretch our legs.

While in Florida something unusual happen. I am use to getting questions about Leader Dogs wherever Killian and I travel, and I enjoy talking about the organization as well as the puppy I am raising. One evening, my cousin, Killian and I decide to get take out Chinese food. There was a little place down the road not far from where we were staying. The three of us walked in, and as we walked past a young couple sitting to the side waiting for their order, I heard; "A Leader Dog here in Florida?" That caught me by surprise and I turned around and began a conversation with them. It turns out that they are from Michigan, not far from Leader Dogs' location. We had a wonderful conversation about Leader Dogs while waiting for our orders. It truly is a small world.

Club Officer Elections

It's time to gear up for club officer elections. By this time, Club Presidents should have named their Nominating Committee, and that committee should be recruiting candidates for next year club officers. A date for your club's Nominating Meeting should be set for some time in March, and club members should be notified of that date at least 14 days prior to the meeting. The Nominating Committee should report their nominee(s) for each office, and additional nominations can be made from the floor during this meeting.

The Election Meeting should be held in April. Again, club members should be notified at least 14 days in advance of the date of this meeting. A printed ballot should be prepared for this meeting and member should cast secret ballots. No additional nominations may be made at this meeting.

Following the election, the Club Secretary should report the new officers in MyLCI under 2022-2023 Officers.


