PA State Council of Lions Clubs Special Election.

Date: September 28, 2020

The Special Election, due at the November State Council Meeting on November 6 thru 8, 2020 will still take place.

The necessity of this Special Election is to complete the two outstanding Ballot Questions, originally scheduled for a vote at the May 2020 State Convention.

The Council of Governors, at a Zoom Meeting on Sunday, September 20th approved the Multiple District hold an Electronic Election and selected Election Runner as the application of choice.

This letter will now serve as the official notice of the manner and timing of an Electronic Special Election, using electionrunner.com to be conducted by the MD14 Lions of Pennsylvania on Sunday, November 8, 2020 – between the hours of 12 noon and 8pm.

An election packet will be mailed to each District Governor in time for inclusion in their Newsletters and for distribution by their District Secretary/Certification Chair to Club Presidents and Secretaries containing the following documentation to guide them through the process:

- Election Process sets forth the steps and timing of the election to ensure its successful completion.
- Delegate Collection Spreadsheet an excel spreadsheet to enter the Delegate names, member numbers (for certification purposes only) and email addresses to be uploaded to electionrunner.com.
- Official Delegate Certification Form each Club Secretary and/or President
 must complete and return this and the Delegate Collection Spreadsheet to the
 State Office, preferably by email, by <u>Friday October 23, 2020</u>.
- Sample Letter to Clubs including the Potential Delegate Count showing simplified process and the number of delegates that each club in each District is entitled to.
- 5. Ballot Questions copies of the two Ballot Questions.
- Unpaid Dues Schedule Dues must be paid to Lions Clubs International no later than <u>Monday October 14, 2020</u> for a club to be entitled to have their nominated delegates to vote in this election. (Each District receives their own District Recap Report to be included in this packet).

It is very important that all delegates have a correct email address as the election will be conducted electronically (no paper ballots will be sent.)



Lions International Peace Poster and Essay Contest

Wenjing was a 2019-2020 Merit Award Winner for the Lions International Peace Poster Contest. She is 13 years old and was sponsored by the Guangdong Heai Lions club in China. What an impressive job she did!

Be proactive and with a hopeful spirit, get a head start on next year's poster contest by, in the next few months, establishing a Peace Poster chairperson to seek out an organized group of children in your area from a school, a Scouting group, a 4-H group, a homeschooling group, a church youth group, the YMCA, the YWCA, a youth volunteer group, etc. about participating in the Peace Poster Contest. What a wonderful way to build selfesteem and promote positivity among our youth! The effect of participating in the contest and, possibly

winning, can really be immeasurable in its impact on the children given the opportunity to participate.

Peace Poster 101 Basics:

- The Peace Poster Contest is open to children ages 11-13 as of November 15.
- Each poster is judged on originality, artistic merit, and expression of the theme.
- Posters advance through several judging levels: local, district, multiple district, and international.
- At the international level, judges from the art, peace, youth, education and media communities select one grand prize winner and 23 merit award winners.
- One international grand prize winner will receive \$5,000 and a trip to a a special award ceremony at the International Convention. Each of the 23 merit award winners will receive a cash award of \$500 and a certificate of achievement.



I received a call for help from MD-14 Disaster Chairperson Lion Jim Groff. The Lions of Louisiana need supplies because of the hurricane a couple of weeks ago. Below is a list of items that have been requested by DG Gerard Credeur, Jr. He is governor of District 8-O.

What we are asking for your willingness to help out with these items. When we have the items, they will be shipped in one of our wrapped trailers to his district. Here are some guidelines:

- 1. When possible, the items should be packed in 12x12 boxes that are sealed and labeled with the contents.
- 2. Larger items should be wrapped together in a bundle.
- 3. Boxes are available from either the Lions office in Harrisburg or from Lion Jim Groff. Please help with the shipping costs.
- 4. Financial donations can be made to either LCIF or the Lions of Pennsylvania Foundation. Please mark on the memo line that the donation id for the Louisiana Hurricane.

Timeline is as follows:

- 1. The collection dates should fall between October 5 and 8
- 2. The truck will be scheduled to pick up at regional sites between October 9 and 11
- 3. The loaded truck will leave for Louisiana on October 12th.

The exact pickup dates and locations have yet to be set. DG or GST PDG will let you know.

Continuing To Answer The Call

Through support of Campaign 100, Lions Clubs International Foundation (LCIF) was able to provide \$5.1 million in grant funding for COVID-19 relief worldwide. This pandemic continues to remain a heavy burden – as do all Global causes LCIF and Campaign 100 support.

Feeding the hungry, developing our youth, caring for the sick, and rebuilding communities have never been more complicated or critical. Equally important is our ability to raise funds essential for your service. To continue progressing towards our fundraising goal, Campaign 100 now runs through June of 2022.

On August 4th a large amount of ammonium nitrate stored at the Port of the city of Beirut exploded, causing 200 deaths, 6,500 injuries, \$10-15 billion in property damage, and leaving an estimated 300,000 people homeless. LCIF awarded \$200,000 Major Disaster Relief Grants to Beirut Lions Clubs to help in rebuilding 3,000 homes.

Also since August, LCIF has been overwhelmed with applications requesting Major Catastrophic Grants from Lions Clubs in the Western United States due to wildfires, and Lions Clubs along the Gulf Coast working to recover from Hurricane Sally.
