A Message From the District Governor



I feel like my year as District Governor has gone from the "splash" in June (fall, broken hip, surgery and rehab) to the "nitty gritty" in August. I have begun visiting clubs (Weiglestown, Brogue and Jefferson Lions), have now held two monthly Global Action Team (GAT) meetings with District leaders to develop and move forward with plans to address District goals, conducted a District Cabinet meeting hosted by the Dover Lions and our friend and fellow Lion Duane Hull, and participated in a Zoom meeting with our Zone Chairs to support their effective start-up in the new Lions year. I have sincerely appreciated the reception I have received from the Lions Clubs, I appreciated and was buoyed by the attendance and the attendees' engagement and contributions to the District Cabinet meeting, and I enjoyed the interaction and planning that occurred in our Zone Chair meeting. Having said all that, I really

want to talk about the District's four membership goals today.

Of the District's eight goals for the year, four are membership goals developed by the District's GMA (Global Membership Approach) group led by PDG and District Global Membership Chair, Lisa Griffie. These goals were developed for a reason. We have been losing more members than we are gaining over the last four years. We have lost members for two reasons. First, we have had a couple of clubs "fold" (cease to exist), and, secondly, we are averaging more "dropped" members than gained members across the clubs in the District in the last four years. We have averaged about 85 new members a year across the District for the last four years, while we have on average about 32 Lions die each year and 98 Lions drop their membership each year. That means we are averaging 45 less Lions each year in the District for the last four years. Where do we go from here? We could just throw up our hands and say that this is the way it is. We won't do that!!!

There are many potential Lions members out there who just need to be asked. These could be family members, friends, work associates, businessmen and women, etc. With the help of 1st Vice District Governor, Keith Shoff, we had the pleasure of inducting two new members for the Jefferson Lions recently. In addition, we need to talk with, mentor and support Lions in our clubs who are struggling to find their place. We need to determine their interests and get them involved in things that interest, challenge and fulfill them. We can't just let them slide away because of our in-attention.

Finally, I think we need to keep our focus on service. Fundraising is certainly necessary, but I think many people join our clubs to serve, just as our motto says. We all make up the District.

We must:

- work together to find new members who will bring new ideas and abilities
- ensure that all our members are engaged and challenged to help with the work, and
- serve the needs of our communities through our clubs and serve the needs of the world through LCIF.

We need "all hands on deck."

Have a wonderful September with children back to school, absorbed in their books and having fun with their many activities.



Hanover Conducts its 30th Annual "Commitment to Sight" Golf Benefit

Lion Don Dorr, who this year is celebrating 45 years as a member of the Hanover Lions Club, began this specialized fundraising benefit in 1991 for the purpose of providing support to local citizens in need of general eye care, or who were blind or visually impaired. For the first 27 years, Don worked to build and grow the golf benefit with ever increasing golfers and supporters over the years. His dedication and commitment along with support from his fellow Lions and the Hanover community has kept the annual event alive and well....and all the while making it possible to support local organizations that focus on helping the less-fortunate, the disabled, and those in need.

Lion Dan Lawrence has carried on Don's legacy for the past three years to provide oversight and coordination of the event. On July 29, 2021, 64 golfers, 11 volunteers, 30 major sponsors, and 48 community businesses and individuals all contributed to a very successful day on the links at the Hanover Country Club.

This 2021 benefit raised funds in excess of \$8,000. Some of the benefactors of the Hanover Lions Club's Golf Benefit include:

- The Leader Dogs Program the nationally recognized dog training program for leading the blind
- A local Hanover citizen who is visually impaired and attended The Beacon Lodge Summer Camp Program in 2021
- Maintenance of eye glass and hearing aid collection boxes at numerous locations around the Hanover community
- New Hope Ministries and their efforts to provide support to those in need in the Hanover community

Lions International Peace Poster Contest



Lions International chooses a new theme to be demonstrated in the children's posters each year. The theme for 2021/2022 is "We Are All Connected." What an amazing and important theme for our children to explore! I can not wait to see how the youth in our district are going to demonstrate this theme in their posters. And clubs of District 14-C, now would be an excellent time to contact and share with a teacher or an advisor of a classroom, youth group, homeschool group, scouting group, etc. about the Peace Poster Contest and how it gives children the opportunity to express their vision of peace in our world. And, I do believe because of the lessons we have learned over the last year and a half and are still learning that this year fits very well into many schools' curriculum.

Children of the ages 11 to 13 (which, usually, targets grades 5 and 6) are eligible to enter the contest. The contest encourages children to engage in thinking about what peace means to them and to share with the world their vision of world peace by creating a unique poster.

I have Peace Poster Kits available to deliver to you. The Peace Poster Kits include everything front the contest rules, letters to the family about the contest, participation and achievement certificates and, even, an example of a press release to be submitted to social media or a local newspaper. The cost remains at only \$11.95! (Quite a bargain!)

For sight impaired children, there is a Peace Essay Contest for them to enter. The information about the essay contest is available on the LCI website. The theme is the same, "We Are All Connected." Also, as a sideline, there is a <u>wonderful video of Joshua Wood</u>, a 13 year old young man from Australia, who won this past year's Peace Essay Contest. It is truly powerful to hear and see him read his essay in Braille. In his essay, Joshua shares about the importance of service and the many wise lessons he had learned from his grandfather. He mentions how his grandfather said even though Joshua does not have sight, he has insight.

Please, don't just be curious about what the youth in your club's locale could create with their posters, really find out by offering children the opportunity to move forward and create wonderful posters to share their visions of world peace through your sponsorship. This cannot happen without your help!



Mechanicsburg Joins Community Day

The Downtown Mechanicsburg Partnership sponsored Community Day at Soldiers and Sailors Memorial Park. It marked the 100th anniversary of this event and featured live music, games, food vendors, and large inflatables. The Mechanicsburg Lions assisted by monitoring the inflatables and taking a count of individuals attending this free and fun event.





In this month's Lions Clubs International Foundation article, I will focus on how and where your donations to LCIF lend assistance to fellow Lions to help the people in Pennsylvania.

With the coronavirus pandemic we have been experiencing the last 18 months, some counties in our state were affected more than others. LCIF awarded \$60,000 to 6 Districts to aid in purchasing items such as masks, gloves, sanitizer and other medical equipment to combat the spread of the virus. Recipients of aid were nurses, hospitals, and First Responders. I will tell you they all were grateful for your help to keep them and their patients safe. These grants were made through the LCIF Disaster Relief program.

14-C has been notified of the approval of our grant application from LCIF for \$60,000 to expand cold storage capacity at a food bank in Adams County. Pennsylvania Lions Clubs have been awarded over \$7 million in grants since 2000. The most common are funding for camps for the handicapped, the vision impared, disaster relief, and emergency grants. Another popular Lions Clubs purchase over the years that utilize funding from 14-C Lions and LCIF are handicapped accessible vans for transportation of the ederly and patients of camps and Blind Centers. In just 2 decades, LCIF has awarded 175 grants to MD14 to continue the outstanding service Pennsylvania Lions perform and are known for around the world.

We have entered Campaign 100's 4th and final year of a 3-year fundraising campaign. Yes, it has been extended an additional year due to most clubs being required to curtail or stop fundraising and donations completely due to Covid. Currently LCIF has raised \$207 million of their \$300 million goal. 14-C's share of that goal is \$233,000 of which we have raised 84% or \$191,000 of that amount. I feel confident with our clubs' reputation for supporting LCIF we will reach that goal and again lead all other Pennsylvania Districts.

Update on Cohenour Family

At the request of Heather Stem (Family Spokesperson) we have purposely not talked about the accident / fundraiser or Family for quite a while. Now that some time has passed, I'd like to update everyone on the Family. If you remember, back in Dec 2020 the family was involved in a tragic head-on crash that totally destroyed their vehicle, put everyone in the Hospital with Amanda (Mother) being flown to trauma crisis center in Christiana Del. and unfortunately their 2 yr. old son Johnny did not survive the crash.

In January 2021, the East Prospect Lions and Brogue Community Lions partnered to raise funds thru cash donations and a meat raffle. As 2VDG, I had the opportunity to present this tragic story and the fundraiser to the entire MD14 VDG training class in February. A Meat Raffle was held on the 6th of March and Donations continued into late April.

In May, we contacted Heather about presenting the funds to the family and she asked us to hold off for a few weeks as the Family was settling back into their own Home in Southern York County and that they would be more comfortable meeting us there after they've had some time to adjust. On June 29th, Howard Clever (East Prospect Lions) and Pat Hoens (Brogue Lions) met with Heather and the Family at their home to present a check in the amount of \$29,312.00 to the family. It became a VERY emotional evening. The Family was deeply touched by the outpouring of love from so many people that they would probably never meet.

Unfortunately, the Family is still struggling with the loss of Johnny and the ongoing physical trauma. Amanda will require more surgeries in the future, but the hospital is waiting to see how well her bone graft heals. Randy has returned to work full time; the bright spot is that the 3 daughters are doing well physically and to some degree have returned to being kids.

This gift would not have been possible without YOU, the Lions of MD14. Thank you ALL for your gift of Service and Compassion to this family and all the other families that you touch every day.

Vision Screening Committee Report



Thanks to COVID-19, Vision Screenings came to a screeching halt in mid-March, 2020 and were very limited for much of the year. Still, we were able to screen just over 1,000 individuals during Lions year 2020-2021. Lion Peck Freeland from the Plainfield Lions Club and Lion Jim Miller from the Mechanicsburg Lions Club were instrumental in arranging screenings in the Carlisle Area School District and the Mechanicsburg School District, which accounted for the majority of individuals screened this past year. As a result, 101 children 6 years old and younger were identified as needing a follow-up examination along with 13 individuals over the age of 6.

This year, we hope clubs will resume their pre-COVID screenings, and we would love to see some additional clubs offer screenings in their communities or schools. If your club is interested in learning more, please contact me or a member of the Vision Screening Committee. We are ready to help in any way we can. Shiloh Meets Blind Dog Rescue Alliance



On Wednesday night, August 25, the guest speakers at the monthly Shiloh Lions Club meeting were Diana Baum and Lisa Kilhefner, local volunteers for the Blind Dog Rescue Alliance (https://www.blinddogrescue.org/). Founded in August of 2009, the BDRA is a group of volunteers spread throughout the United States and Canada dedicated to helping blind and visually impaired dogs by rescuing them in shelters, assisting blind dog owners, and educating the public about these wonderful dogs. Thus far, the BDRA has rescued more than 600 visually impaired dogs!

Diana and Lisa spoke about their experiences as "foster" parents for these dogs, which they began doing in 2020 and have fostered 2 dogs thus far with this organization, including Buddy, whom they brought along! 
