In July I began by discussing the three pillars of LCI's Global Action Team (above), leadership, membership and service. District 14C and even some clubs in the District use the GAT framework to organize their work, as we are encouraged to do by LCI. You may recall that I suggested in July that Service was our top pillar, particularly now as so many people have been impacted in one way or another by the pandemic. Last month I talked about Leadership with the goal of assuring that Lions have the tools they need to carry out the work efficiently and effectively. The District just completed a virtual three part training series with several of our District 14C Lion Leaders serving as instructors. The instructors' slides are available for all of the sessions and recordings are available for two of the sessions (Secretaries/Assistant Secretaries and Presidents/First Vice Presidents).

This month I want to focus on Membership. As with membership throughout the country, Lions membership in District 14C has been declining in recent years. District Governor Tom has a couple of goals directed at turning that around. The first goal is to have every Lion in the District ask at least one person who they feel would make a good member to participate in Lions activities and join their club. His second goal is to add one or more new Lions Clubs in the District this year. What can you do? In regard to the first goal, just do your part. Ask at least one person to join your club, possibly beginning with asking them to help out with a service activity. In regard to the second goal, if you feel there is an area of the District that could benefit from having a Lions Club, let DG Tom or District Global Membership Coordinator, PDG Lisa Griffie, know what area that might be. Is there anything else you can do? Work with your Club's Membership Chair/Coordinator to insure that you retain the members you have. The more hands we have, the more services we can provide for those in need.

# **Lions International Peace Poster and Essay Contest**

Lions of District 14-C: Although, the beginning of the school year may look a little different compared to previous years, students are still exuberant, wise, and creative about their expression of world peace through their artistic poster creations. Please consider giving students this opportunity to share their vision of world peace by sponsoring an organized group of children to participate in the Lions International Peace Poster Contest. In the last six months, there have so been so many examples of children and adults showing kindness to one another. I truly believe the posters created this year will be extraordinary.

The organized group of students could be from a school, Scouting group, homeschool group, church youth group, teen volunteer group, after-school care group, etc. Students must be 11, 12, or 13 on November 15 to be eligible to participate. Eligible birth dates are November 16, 2006 through November 15, 2009. The theme for the 2020/2021 Lions International Peace Poster Contest is "Peace Through Service." Please let me know if your club needs a Peace Poster Kit. I still have a supply of them and will make sure your club gets one. The kit includes the contest rules and guide for the club, the contest rules and guide for the participating students, a participation flyer (this flyer shares the information about the contest with the parent/s), a winner sticker to be placed on the back of the winning poster, an achievement award certificate, and a certificate of appreciation for the participants.

The Postmark Deadline for your club to send one winning poster to the District Governor is November 15<sup>th</sup>. So, it is important for you to contact the school, etc. in the next few weeks, to allow time for the students to complete their posters!

Your club can, also, sponsor visually-impaired students in the Lions International Essay Contest! The theme for the 2020/2021 Lions International Peace Essay Contest is "Peace Through Service." Students who are visually impaired and who are of the ages 11-13 as of November 15 are eligible to participate. For the essay contest rules and application form, please contact me.

# COMMUNITY PARTNERSHIP IMPROVES LION'S PARK PLAYGROUND

Two Dallastown Community organizations partnered to complete an amazing project at the Dallastown Lions Club Community Park! A brand-new playground area to serve children ages 2 to 5 years of age has been constructed with the special needs of handicapped children in mind. Handicap access to the playground has been installed along with an autism/handicap swing and a sensory station for those who are sight impaired or wish to learn braille.

None of this would have been possible without the great work of the Dallastown Lions Club and the Dallastown American Legion, Post 605. Along with a grant from the Pennsylvania Lions Foundation, these community organizations worked diligently for over a year putting this plan into action.

In addition to the new playground, a brand-new, regulation sized, horseshoe pit was constructed and is available for the use of the community and renters of the park. All of these projects would not have been possible without the additional help of Sweitzer Fencing Company of Felton, Penn Dutch Structures of Shrewsbury, Emory J. Peters Excavating & Paving Contractor, Inc., General Recreation, Inc., Jeff Watson Construction, and Mr. Doug Bray of Imagineering Signs, all of whom assisted with different phases of this project.

Discussion of future improvements continue between both the Dallastown Lions Club and the Dallastown American Legion, Post 605. One such improvement is the nature trail in the woods that was forged by a local boy scout, Sean Fleagle, with the help of his entire troop (Troop #50)! A continuation of this trail will be discussed as well as many other improvements to the park.

This just goes to show what great things can be accomplished when great people work together to better serve their community! Come out and see for yourself the new and improved Dallastown Lions Club Community Park!

### **Summer Seminars**

Summer Seminars - District 14-C held three on-line seminars in August for Lion Club members and officers. The first seminar was held on August 13th for Club Secretaries, Assistant Secretaries, and Club Administrators. 15 Lions participated in this seminar, which was led by PDG Kerry McKnight. PDG Kerry discussed the basic responsibilities of a Club Secretary and demonstrated how to use the reporting tools in MyLCI and MyLion.

The second seminar was a Lions orientation seminar led by PDG Lisa Griffie on August 20th. There were 20 attendees for this seminar. PDG Lisa explained the organizational structure of Lions outside of the club level, including activities at the Zone, District, and Multiple District level. She also discussed membership responsibilities to give participants a better idea of what it means to be a Lion.

The final seminar was for Club Presidents and Vice Presidents. This seminar was led by PDG Dennis Cope on August 27th. Ten Participants learned about the role and responsibilities of a Club President. PDG Dennis shared ideas for current and future presidents on how to run effective meetings, handle difficult situations, and plan for a successful year.



## **September is Childhood Cancer Month**

As we have reached the halfway point in August, it is time to start planning for Lions International Global Cause of Childhood Cancer. September is Childhood Cancer Month. As you know we are partnered with Four Diamonds from the Penn State Hershey Medical Center's Children's Hospital. We also support many other Childhood Cancer groups.

I am asking you to begin planning what your club and district's will be doing in September to promote awareness of, education for and physical and monetary help in the cause of eliminating Childhood Cancer.

When you have made you plans, I am asking you to do the following 3 things:

Put your project into MyLion as a Future Activity. This is so Lions everywhere can see what you are doing.

Send me a short message describing your project and the contact information for the project. Please let MD 14 Childhood Cancer Chairperson, PDG Keldeen Stambaugh, know what your plans are as well.

I do not know if you have heard yet but the in person "Thon" at Penn State University has been cancelled this school year because of the pandemic. "Thon" is the major fundraiser for Four Diamonds. Last year "Thon" raised nearly 12 million dollars for Four Diamonds during the weekend. While they are doing a virtual event, no one knows whether it will be as successful as a normal event. We must step up our efforts to try to offset shortfalls as best as we can. One thing every Lion can do is make a recurring monthly donation to Four Diamonds. A \$5 monthly donation from every Pennsylvania Lion would bring in \$1,058,160 to our campaign #PALionsFTK. That would be 1 million more that we donated last year.

Each year over 16,000 children are diagnosed with a form of cancer. Four Diamonds funds over 90 researchers who are looking for safer treatments and cures for cancer. Did you know that one of the first chemo drugs was a derivative of mustard gas? Mustard gas was used as a weapon in World War 1 and killed thousands on both sides. Please be proactive and generous so that no parent need ever hear the words "YOUR CHILD HAS CANCER."
