Rules for Election of Officers for District 29-C 2020-2021:

The Lions clubs of District 29-C having been issued the Voting Delegate cards by mail by the Cabinet Secretary, the number of voting delegates of each club having been determined by Lions Clubs International.

The clubs of the voting delegates shall be in good standing with Lions Clubs International and District 29-C. (Note delinquent dues may be paid up any time prior to fifteen (15) days prior to the close of the Credentials Certification as established by this convention).

The Ballots shall be mailed to the Club President of each club of District 29-C. The Club president shall have the responsibility of delivering the ballots to the club delegates as designated by their club and if the clubs chooses mail the ballots to the Convention Site. The marked mailed ballots shall include the delegate card(s) for the club. Do not attach the delegate card to the ballot, do not sign the ballot. The number of enclosed voting delegate cards must match the number of ballots mailed. All ballots returned by mail by a club without the correct number of valid delegate cards enclosed will be disallowed.

We all know the uncertainty of today's health care. This has resulted in a huge need from our Sight Foundation, and has created a drain of available funds for services through the Foundation.

Through the generosity of District 29-L 2nd VDG Ramona and Lion Dave Sago of the Western Monongalia County Area Lions Club, a beef cow has been donated for raffle by the Lions of West Virginia! The proceeds from this raffle will be presented to the WV Lions Sight Conservation Foundation.

Now, we need your help! Each Lions Club in the state of West Virginia will receive a packet of twenty (20) tickets to be sold or purchased, equaling a donation of \$100.
