Becky Coakley was awarded the Miguel Award by the American Foundation for the Blind at a ceremony on March 4th, 2017 in Washington, DC for her excellence in the work of low vision education. The Migel Medal was established in 1937 by M. C. Migel, the first chairperson of AFB. Its purpose is to honor those whose dedication and achievements have significantly improved the lives of people with vision loss. Past honorees include legendary disability-rights advocate Helen Keller, Senator Tom Harkin, social entrepreneur and engineer Jim Fruchterman, and renowned educators Kathleen Mary Huebner, Ph.D., and Philip H. Hatlen, Ed.D. Ms. Coakley was recognized for her years developing outreach programs in West Virginia, Saint Lucia, and other locations. She



is Director of Outreach at the West Virginia Eye Institute and director of the Children's Vision Rehabilitation Program (CVRP), and is familiar to many West Virginia Lions.

The South Charleston Lions met May 8 with 23 Lions present, one new member and one guest. Special speaker for the meeting was Jon Putnam from Dow Chemical.







#### In Memorium

Harry J. Widney, 99 of Lewisburg, passed away Friday morning, May 12, 2017 at White Sulphur Springs Center. Born November 12, 1917 in Tyrone, PA, he was a son of the late Harry McGinley and Virginia Ray Fickes Widney. Harry was a 1935 graduate of Green Bank High School and received a Bachelor of Science degree in chemistry from West Virginia Wesleyan College in 1939. He retired from Howes Leather Company after over 40 years of service where he was Superintendent and later General Manager.

Mr. Widney was a founding, and last surviving charter member, of the Durbin Lions Club. There were 32 charter members of the Durbin Lions at the 9/25/1946 Charter Night held at the Durbin Methodist Church. At that meeting Mr. Widney was voted to serve as 1st VP. He then moved up to President beginning July 1947 to June 1948. Beginning July 1950 to June 1951 he served as Secretary. Among those left to cherish Mr. Widney's memory is his wife of 70 years, Dallas M. Propst Widney, whom he married on June 8, 1946.


nine. **Half and Half** We will run a 50/50 drawing for the Sight Foundation.
