

The month of October is usually our Fall Membership growth month. District 2-S5 finished its growth month with a net loss of two members, 37 new members in and 39 members processed out. For the Lions year we have 110 new members added and 128 Lions dropped for a net loss of 18 members. Twelve out of 57 Clubs in District 2-S5 were membership active in October, meaning that they added at least one new member during the month. Twelve out of 57, or just 21% of our clubs added new members in October, our membership growth month. The District was led by our two College Clubs that added 13 new members between them. Giddings was not far behind as three of their five clubs added 12 new members. Let's hear it for those clubs that are growing and serving their communities.
