MD-2 Mid-Year Membership Challenge

This Lions Year, the 2021-2022 Council of Governors has authorized an exciting Mid-Year Membership Challenge. The first half of this challenge deals with retention and the second half deals with recruitment. The prize for this challenge is \$500 to the District that has the least drops for December 2021 and \$500 to the District who has the highest number of added new members (who can make up the most ground for what was lost in December 2021) in January 2022.

The Retention Half

How this will work – this is not just pure loss, but it is your overall percentage lost for December 2021. As an example, District A loses 45 Lions and at the beginning of December they had a total of 1,450 Lions. Their loss percentage is 3.1%. District B loses 35 Lions and at the beginning of December they had a total of 950 Lions. Their loss percentage is 3.6%. District A would win because they had the best loss percentage rate.

This way a large District would not be penalized for an unfair loss ratio to a smaller sized District.

The Recruitment Half

This is pure recruitment numbers. Let's take the same two Districts, A and B. For the month of January 2022, District A lost 45 Lions and by the end of January 2022, they added 28 Lions. District B lost 35 Lions and by the end of January 2022, they added 29 Lions. District B would win because of recruiting more members than District A.

The whole idea here is to try and recruit more new members in January 2022 than you lost in December 2021.

The contest winner(s) may use the \$500 prize money at the District's discretion; however, it is strongly encouraged that the prize money go to the District GMT or GMA to help with retention and/or membership growth efforts.

Emerging Lions Leadership Institutes focus on building the skills of Lions members for leadership opportunities at the club level, including the position of club president.

PARTICIPANT QUALIFICATIONS

- Candidates for this institute must be from Constitutional Area I & II - United States of America, Its Affiliates, Bermuda & The Bahamas & Canada. This institute will be conducted in English. Candidates must be capable of understanding and participating in the language of instruction at this institute.
- Candidates must be Lions in good standing who have successfully served on a club committee and who have not yet attained the level of club president. Current charter club presidents are also eligible for this institute.
- Candidates must be willing to commit to all days of the institute, including group mealtimes, and understand that personal time is extremely limited. <u>Attendance at all</u> <u>classroom sessions and scheduled meals is mandatory.</u>

COST OF THE INSTITUTE

Lions Clubs International will provide meals and lodging according to the schedule of the institute. Please note that according to board policy, a non-refundable participation fee of US\$150.00 will be required to offset a portion of these costs for all institutes. This fee will be due no less than four weeks prior to the institute start date. Please do not send fees until you receive a letter of acceptance to the institute. Participants are also responsible for their own transportation and related travel expenses to and from the institute site.

You will be assigned a roommate of the same gender to share lodging with for the Institute.

SELECTION PROCESS

Because of the high number of applications received by the association, acceptance into the institute is not guaranteed. In the selection process the MD2 Leadership Division strives to achieve maximum geographical representation of districts throughout the Multiple District. All candidates will be notified of selection status no more than three weeks after the application deadline via the email address provided on the application form.

The Leadership Development Division of MD-2 reserves the right to cancel any institute or due to insufficient applications submitted by the stated application submission deadline date.

The division maintains the quality of all aspects of the institute, including program, faculty and the selection process of participants.
