We Can Help Ukrainian Lions.

Lions across the world recognize the plight of the millions of Ukrainians whose lives have been torn apart in recent weeks. Despite the Russian invasion, Ukrainians have valiantly resisted the aggression, taken refuge in shelters, or fled the country. Many of our fellow Lions who live in Ukraine have continued to provide comfort and aid to those in need including displaced families, wounded, hungry, and seeking to flee.

Lion Oksana (for security reasons her last name is withheld) has been leading her fellow citizens in this effort. Huddled in a subway tunnel, she reported that she continued to do her daily work, care for her family, and offer support to others within the shelter. She was doing these things with missiles and planes flying overhead. (As of this writing, I have not heard from Oksana in nearly seven days.)

Like you, I am sure we all would like to be there to help care for all the Ukrainians Perhaps you know of some Americans who have gone over to assist Ukraine. It is tempting. Short of that, many continue to pray for Ukraine. If you pray, please include Oksana, her family, her neighbors, and fellow Lions.

A more tangible way of helping is to give to a special fund set up by the Lions Club International Foundation. Please follow this link to the <u>Refugees and Displaced Persons page</u>. Whatever amount you choose to give will go a long way to help the millions displaced by this war.

Ask your friends and neighbors if they would like to give. Tell them about your club and this is what Lions are about – helping those in need when it counts. Perhaps you might recruit a new Lion on Oksana's behalf, which would be a great calling.



Convention Keynote Speaker: Past International Director Lion Jerry Smith

Election of District Officers for the upcoming 2022 – 2023 Lions Year will be conducted at the convention on Saturday. 
