

The 33rd Annual District Convention will be held on Saturday, April 23rd, 2022. At the Venue on Main located at 289 North Main Street, Giddings, Texas 78942. The 4th Cabinet Meeting will be held on Friday, April 22nd, 2022 at the Lions Den located at 1623 FM 141 Giddings, Texas 78942.

Convention Keynote Speaker: Past International Director Lion Jerry Smith

Election of District Officers for the upcoming 2022 – 2023 Lions Year will be conducted at the convention on Saturday. Each club in the district is allowed 1 voting delegate per ten members in their club; however, the major fraction of 5 members or more qualifies for an additional delegate vote (example a club with 26 members is entitled to three votes).

Annual District Awards including the Robert Koennecke Award (2021 –2022) for the outstanding Lions Club; and the E.B. "Tex" Mayer Award recognizing the outstanding Lion of the Year for 2021 – 2022, and other special recognition will be presented at the convention.

In lieu of bringing silent auction items, it is requested that each club bring a check made payable to "Lions Club International Foundation". This will be a free will donation with the proceeds going to help with the relief effort in Ukraine.

I have really enjoyed serving as your District Governor this year. This is a great district with lots of great people doing great service in your community.
