Q: Does my club need to file an IRS 990 every year.

A: The following information was provided by the Legal Division of Lions Clubs International.

Please remember that all Lions clubs, districts and multiple districts with annual gross receipts less than US\$50,000 who are not otherwise required to file Forms 990 or 990-EZ must file the e-Postcard (also known as 990-N). If your Lions club, district or multiple district has a foundation, which is a separate legal entity, the appropriate form will need to be filed as well. For more information check the <u>LCI</u> Frequently Asked Questions site.

The e-Postcard is due by the 15th day of the fifth month after the close of your tax year. Lions clubs operate on a fiscal year, July 1-June 30, and the e-Postcard is due by November 15 each year. Please note that an organization cannot request an extension for filing the Form 990-N.

Message from 1st VDG Lion David Sahm COVID-19 IS Not the First Lions' Challenge

Anyone who has been a Lion for more than a few days knows of Helen Keller's appeal to Lions in 1925. She challenged us who have our sight, hearing, are strong, brave, and kind to constitute ourselves as "Knights of the Blind in the crusade against darkness".


