From the First Vice District Governor

February is now behind us with memories of club visits, a training trip to Indianapolis with my fellow 1st VDGs, the Michigan Forum, the "Backpack Project" (weekend food for school kids), the Council of Governors meeting and, most recently, the East Flint Auxiliary "Soup and Pie" Social.

A good part of February was also

spent working with our Council of Governor's committee that was formed to address the Michigan Attorney General's opinion on street collections. Our committee chair, CC Justin Faber, gave an update in the Jan/Feb issue of the Lions Pride Magazine and more has happened since then. I'll give you the quick synopsis:

1. Attorney General issued an opinion that street collections violated Michigan law.

- 2. Many jurisdictions stopped allowing street collections based on that opinion.
- 3. Lions clubs and the projects they support were drastically affected.
- 4. The problem was brought to the attention of the Council of Governors.
- 5. The Council formed a committee to address the problem.
- 6. The committee researched and discussed two possible solutions. The first was to challenge the opinion on existing law in court and the second was to attempt new legislation that would allow us to legally collect in the streets.
- After reviewing bids, the committee voted to hire a consultant firm, Michigan Legislative Consultants, to help us address the issue legislatively. This recommendation went to the Council of Governors for their consideration.
- 8. The Council of Governors approved the recommendation and also approved a contract for 6 months of service. This service will be paid out of administrative account dollars that are now dedicated to this project.
- 9. The Michigan Legislative Consultants firm has made great inroads with legislators and is recommending a "Lions Day" at the Michigan Capitol. The planning for that "Lions Day" has already begun and we should have a date shortly.

The next step is to raise awareness of the "Lions Day" and encourage participation of Lions from across the state. It will allow us to tell our story to those who will decide the fate of the proposed legislation change. Who better to tell them than their own constituents, who just happen to be Lions?

To accomplish this event, we will be renting a wing of the capitol building and providing lunch to the legislators as we tell our story. The total cost is estimated to be in the \$3500 range and we need sponsors to help pull this off. If this legislative effort will help your club's street collections continue or start again, please consider a donation. Our thanks to the 11D2 clubs that have already donated \$100 or more. Please make checks payable to Lions of Michigan with legislative effort in the memo line. Just a gentle reminder that the funds need to come from your administrative account. Thank you!!

Can we finish out the first 100 years of LIONS continuing to improve our communities? Can we get started on the second 100 years to make this a better world? You bet, because "together we can" do anything!

Lions of 11 D-1,

On February 18, 2017, the Michigan Lions Forum was held in Lansing. Thanks to the Lions who helped put on the Michigan Forum. It was very informative. I went to a workshop on Laughing for your Health. O It was full of laughter and great fun! The keynote speaker was John Drake who gave a very informative and eye-opening talk on starting an orphanage in the Philippines.

There was also a special presentation to our Governor Tom. He received the International Presidents' Leadership award. Congratulations, Governor Tom, you are very deserving of this prestigious recognition.

The day before the Forum, Lion Jeff and I had Vice Governor training. After our training, many Lions helped to stuff 250 backpacks for children and families with non-perishable food. Many of us were able to take some backpacks back to our towns to give to needy children.

After the Forum, and the next day, the Council of Governors met. The council consists of the 10 Governors in the Lower Peninsula. The Vice Governors are asked to meet with the Governors to listen and learn. In last month's newsletter, I asked how your Legacy Project was going. I learned at the council meeting that only 6 clubs in Michigan have reported a Legacy Project. I am hoping that all of our 11-D-1 clubs have a project in mind! I also learned something a bit alarming in regard to our District Membership. If a district falls below 1,250 total members we may lose the opportunity to have an international speaker at our convention, and our district would not be able to vote at the International Lions Club Convention. In addition, when our Governor Elect goes to the International Convention to be sworn in as our Governor, the spouse of the Governor would have to pay their own expenses to the Convention and for the Convention. We started the year (July 2016) at 1,236. We now have 1,173 members which is 77 members below 1250. Only two Districts in our state are over 1,250. Our District has the 3rd highest number of members in our state. Time to rally and gain new Lions! Please spread the word of Lionism and "Just Ask" !




