## **From District Governor Jeff Hunt**

GREAT NEWS!! HB4160 (Street collections bill) not only passed both the Michigan House and Senate, it has now been signed by Governor Snyder and is the law of the land. It is now known as Public Act 112 of 2017. For Lions and other non-profits in Michigan, charitable contributions can now be collected on public streets and roadways. The safety provisions required by the new law, such as hivis vests and only stepping into the street when traffic is stopped, Lions have been using for years. Local governments can enact restrictions but cannot prevent our collections.

Many thanks to our 2016-2017 Council of Governors and the legislative committee for their efforts to make this happen with the assistance of our consultant, Lion Matt Sowash and his firm, Michigan Legislative Consultants.

A Global Membership meeting was held at the Gaines Area club house on July 9th led by DGMT Coordinator PDG Poirier. Our membership team is hard at work, identifying areas that need Lions and ways to make that happen. They are also working on plans to help existing clubs grow their membership. Discussion included some of the programs and grants available from Lions Clubs International to assist in those efforts.

Immediately following the membership group, we had our first 11D1 cabinet meeting, the minicabinet meeting. It is so named because it is for the voting cabinet, with committee chairs needing funds

to start the year also in attendance. After the Pledge and invocation the cabinet officers were installed by PDG Tom Thompson with assistance from his bride, Judy. Many thanks to both PDG Tom and Judy!

I have great news to share. If you have read your Lion Pride July/August, bear with me. House Bill 4160 which provides a charitable exemption for roadway fundraising (White Cane for example) in Michigan has passed the State House of Representatives and Senate. The Governor signed it into law.

A Big Thank You goes to last year's Council of Governors and Council Chair Justin Faber for their efforts to communicate on behalf of our organization. After the Attorney General ruled that organizations could not collect in the streets, they decided, almost a year, ago to hire a lobbyist firm to help influence the legislature to pass a law permitting us to fundraise in the streets. There are some key points of the bill. Find your Lion Pride and on the front page look for Legislative Update.

Our new International President is Dr. Naresh Aggarwal

from India. His theme for this year is "We Serve". He believes using the Power of We, the Power of Service and the Power of Action to work together to change lives and make the world a better place and engage Lions in communities all over the world.

We have a new Centennial Service challenge: Diabetes. The other service challenges are Vision, Hunger, Environment, and Youth. A new focus within the Youth category is Pediatric Cancer.

#### From the Second Vice District Governor



Second Vice District Governor Job: Technology. As mentioned in the last month's article, a request was made for list of each of the 38 clubs' web presence in our district. An email from Lion Dave Kern of the Millington Lions Club was received that included their website address www. millingtonlions.com. Thank you, Lion Dave.

The small response was small. Knowing my club, Auburn Williams, has a website, e-clubhouse and a Facebook page my work was cut out for me. The search was on for the web presence of other clubs. The job was awesome! It was interesting to find clubs with the same names in different states and some in several states. One club was found in another state but not in our District. Again, could each club send me their club's web presence whether it be e-clubhouse, website, or FB? Thank you.

We currently have 38 clubs in our district and are looking for new areas to start or rebuild. The 100th Anniversary Lion Billboard campaign has been promoting Lion Club recognition. Hopefully the subsequent outcome will be non-Lions looking for Lions Clubs in our state to join. With this in mind, it is important to have and keep a club's web presence up to date.

First Vice District Governor Joe Bogar is known for keeping statistics on information in our district. Go Joe! Here are some new statistics that you may or may not have.

The search found 32 out of 38 clubs have some sort of web presence either an e-clubhouse, website or Facebook page. This is great news Following is more detailed information.

Thirteen Lions Clubs have information using the free e-clubhouse website builder furnished by Lions International. We can easily have all clubs set up e-clubhouses. Four of these sites have the incorrect president. Three list presidents from more than a few years ago. Two have the wrong meeting location. Two sites have only meeting times. One has not been updated since 2014, and another was last updated in 2015.

The e-clubhouse has a calendar where you can post future activities of your club. You can upload PDF flyers with your event information which website users can open to see more detail. The best part is the information is automatically removed after the event date has passed. A few clubs are using this calendar.

Eleven clubs were found with websites not created using Lions International. Three of the sites had the wrong President. One site had the incorrect meeting location. One has been under construction since 2010, and one was completely blank.

Facebook is the most popular way our Lions Clubs are using the web. We have 20 clubs using public Facebook

pages. One club has a Private Facebook group and is using a website open to the world. Looking at all club web presence sites, the FB pages are kept the most current. However, three Facebook pages have issues. One has never been used and two others were last updated in 2013 and 2014. If you need assistance with Facebook, find your son, daughter or grandchild. I have not mastered Facebook.

Please find the person or persons updating information on the internet. Have them look at ALL pages of the website for correct information; some sites are current on one page but not another. If they would please send me an email at <a href="mailto:lionstevenvantol@gmail.com">lionstevenvantol@gmail.com</a> stating they have reviewed and updated the site. Once information is received, I will update my information and give it to Lion Joe Bogar.

If your club needs help setting up an e-clubhouse, you can find the information on the LCI web site (http://www.lionsclubs.org). Just type e-clubhouse in the search box. You should see this "Create a Website for Your Lions Club e-Clubhouse." Just click and follow the directions. LCI will send you a user name and password for your club website as well as a link to the login page.

If you cannot locate the user and password to update your e-clubhouse, contact tech support at Lions International 630-571-5466. If needed, I can help with some of the information input for your e-clubhouse once the user name and password is found or obtained for a new site. Let me help, it is my job.

I encourage all Lions to look for their club on the internet. You will be surprised at what you find.

Although I was on the search for club's web presence, much was learned about the district's clubs; what they are doing or have done. Interesting search! My next technology job is improving our district's website calendar area and contact information. A Lion's job is never done. The engine is warm, and we are ready for the journey. Lions will continue moving forward as "We Serve".

The 9th Annual Hall of Fame Banquet for LMF is August 5, 2017, 6:00pm at the Crown Plaza Hotel in Grand Rapids. PDG Robert Sturgis will be inducted into the LMF Hall of Fame. He was chosen by the current members of the Hall of Fame for induction.

The District Governor announced the successful lobbying of the Michigan Legislature for the passage of House Bill 4160 now Public Act 112 of 2017. The LMF was asked by the Council of Governors to assist with the funding of a lobbyist to promote the change in the law to allow the "On site solicitation." The LMF decided to partner with the Lions of Michigan by providing \$2900 (2 months fee) to pay for the lobbyist. We were blessed the legislation was completed quickly and did not require additional funding by either the LOM or LMF

Bryan Grubb was in a good news/bad news scenario; Leader Dog had a great dog available to pair him with, but he was

unable to get time away from work for training. Luckily for Bryan, we had a solution—a home delivery.

Like most guide dog clients, Bryan came to Michigan to receive his first Leader Dog, Magellan. The 25-day training taught him how to work with a guide dog and gave him time to bond with Magellan before heading home.

However, due to his work schedule and the fact that training for clients who are Deaf-Blind wasn't available for several months,\* Bryan trained with Leader Dog Dozer in his home environment with Guide Dog Mobility Instructor Jennifer Sanderson.

After spending a few days on basic guide work and getting to know each other, Bryan and Dozer set off for work with Jennifer at their side. Together they set up a safe place for Dozer to stay while Bryan worked and patterned Dozer to the cafeteria, rest room and exits in the manufacturing facility where Bryan is employed. For several more days Jennifer accompanied the team from home to work to home again.



As an experienced guide dog user, Bryan relied on his knowledge of commands and dog handling to quickly become a safe traveling team with Dozer. Being in his home environment, Bryan traveled familiar routes, which is especially important for people who are deaf and blind because learning new or multiple routes can be time-consuming and stressful.

In their 18 months together Bryan and Dozer have strengthened their bond and teamwork. According to Bryan, Dozer is a good listener that really understands Bryan's routine and where he needs to go. He adds, "I am glad to have the right dog."

"I want to thank Leader Dog for letting Jenny bring Dozer here to my home. He is a wonderful dog. This was easier for me and Dozer to understand how to work as a team."

\* Leader Dog is the only organization in the western hemisphere with a dedicated Deaf-Blind program. Classes for clients who are Deaf-Blind are offered twice per year.

I have had much difficulty with my hearing for quite some time. Due to being an operating engineer and listening to race car motors without hearing protection, consequently I have severe hearing loss.



The Cap Tel 2400i with Touchscreen, Bluetooth and Speakersphone came to me from a free program for people with hearing loss under title IV of the A.D.A. The law in the State of Michigan says, "All people shall hear on the telephone" A certified hearing related professional, is required to obtained this machine.



DG Jeff introduced special guests PDG Tom and Lion Judy Thompson who performed the induction of the Cabinet Officers.

The Secretary's report was called for by DG Jeff. CS Laura stated that July 1 opening membership is 1150 and that as of this morning we have added 7 members YTD for a total current membership of 1,157. A motion was made to approve the minutes from the April, 2016 Cabinet Meeting, Business Meeting, and Elections Meeting as published in the May 2016 District Newsletter. The motion was supported and passed.

DG Hunt called for the Treasurer's report. CT Phyllis Pross stated that the end of the 2015-2016 financial statements and the proposed budget for 2017 - 2018 had been distributed to all in attendance. DG Jeff noted that we have decreased the budget for Cabinet meals and awards and substantially increased the budget for leadership development/education with the goal of subsidizing increased attendance at the Higgins Lake Leadership Institute. A motion was made and supported to approve each of these items as attached. The motions

both passed.

The Governor called for Committee Requests for Funds. None were requested.

DG Jeff called for any Old Business. CS Laura noted that we have \$698 from the sale of 11 D1 Centennial pins. The original intent, approved by a previous Cabinet, was to divide the proceeds among 11 D1 members attending the 2017 LCI Convention in Chicago. However, only 3 members attended, including the now-Governor, his wife, CS Laura, and PDG Bob Sturgis. All 3 Lions declined any reimbursement, making the funds available for other projects. No decision was reached at this time.

New Business: DG Hunt presented the proposed 2017 – 2018 policy and procedures manual. A brief discussion was held, a motion made, & seconded to approve it as included in the attachments. The motion passed.

CS Laura brought up an idea for a District Service Project to be headed by the partners of the 3 Governors; Laura, Kathy Bogar, and Deb Van Tol. We would like to make and distribute several hundred tied flannel blankets

to pediatric cancer patients, seniors in care facilities, Veterans, first responders, foster kids, and perhaps animal shelters and/or Leader Dogs for the Blind. A Leader Dog rep is checking to see if they would be useful or not. A motion was made, supported, and passed to approve the project. After brief discussion, another motion was made to authorize the use of the proceeds (\$698) from the Centennial pin sales to fund the initial expenses. That motion was supported and passed.

Governor Jeff then broke the attendees down into smaller groups and asked them to work on their Club visit presentations. Results included the following:

- Suggest the Clubs begin the year by focusing on one of the 5 initiatives
- Use personal stories to demonstrate our belief in the motto "We Serve."
- Pass on the Governor's message that the District officers are here to assist, not direct, to aid, not criticize, and that by working together, we can accomplish so much.
- Encourage the Clubs to invite more women and to consider how to involve family units.
- Focus on membership via service
- Encourage service projects in general and ask for support of District and State projects

VDG Remarks: VDGs Steve & Joe both expressed excitement and enthusiasm for the coming year.

Governor Remarks: Jeff thanked us all for our service this year and noted that we will work together for success.

DG Hunt adjourned the meeting at 4:01 PM
