From the District Governor Elect

Lions of 11 D1

I hope this finds you well and enjoying life. The District Convention was a success. Thanks to chairs Lion Bob Sturgis and Lion Dick Delong. I also want to thank Governor Jeff Hunt and Lion Laura Hunt. It was fun seeing many Lion members, and there were many opportunities to learn. We had six Break Out sessions that included E Clubhouse, Hidden Harvest, and Different Strokes for Different Folks which was a painting class. The paintings were used as a fundraiser for SNVC.

Our Lions International speaker was Past International President Joe Preston and his wife Lion Joni. They had great ideas and spoke very well. I asked Lion Joni for a suggestion for a speaker next year's convention at Shanty Creek. She gave me a good idea, and I will share as soon as I know.

There were two banquets where

awards were given out by Governor. We had a business meeting and the Lions Store was open. At the Memorial Service, we were able to honor 24 Lions who had passed during the year.

We had elections and Lion Harold DeMott was elected 2nd VG. Lion Steve was elected 1st VG and I was elected Governor. We take office July 1st. Well for me I have already started putting my cabinet together, and I still need to contact some Committee Chairs.

Last month, I wrote about a District in Illinois whose clubs completed 100% of their Membership Reports and 97% of their Activity Reports.

I would like our District to follow this GST action plan:

Reports are due the 2nd to last day of the month.

For the clubs who have not reported:

-Send a personal email reminder 3 days prior to when due.

-Telephone calls to clubs 2 days prior. Who would be responsible for



completing the actions? District GST,

1st VG, 2nd VG and Governor.

I think this could help our District improve on reporting. Before I began to recognize club secretaries or presidents in some cases, there were two or more months of 11 clubs reporting. Remember we have 38 clubs. When I started, we had one month of 13 clubs. Then the teamwork started. Presidents and members started to ask why their club wasn't Shields, Zilwaukee, and for the first time, Fenton. reporting. Some asked for help. Then in March and April, we had 16 clubs and 19 clubs reporting. Then we had officer training in May and June. From July until now, we have not had less than 20 clubs reporting in a month. We had two months of 24 clubs reporting and one month of 23 clubs.

It is time to celebrate those clubs who have reported their Activity Reports and Membership Reports. Twenty six clubs reporting are the most we have ever had. \bigcirc

# Starting on June 30, 2018, dues credits for membership drops will not be **issued** after the release of the semi-annual billings on July 1 and January 1.

In the past, Lions Clubs International has given clubs a grace period in January and July to adjust their club rosters and receive a credit for unreported membership drops. This practice has been a courtesy extended to clubs by Lions International despite rules governing the practice in Board Policy. The board of directors recently decided that enforcement of existing policy is necessary in order to be in compliance with Board Policy.

This will also provide greater alignment with district billing and create more accurate reporting that better reflects true membership growth. We realize that this will have an impact on some clubs, so we would like you to help them prepare for the upcoming billing cycle.

Here are a few best practices that can help you prepare your clubs for their July dues billing:
