I hope this finds you well and enjoying life. Our weather doesn't seem to know what season we are in. Winter or Spring? At least we know that daylight is slowly getting longer. On December 21st we had 8 hrs and 58 min of daylight. Today we had 9 hrs and 49 minutes!

Governor Jeff, Vice Governor Steve and I are busy visiting clubs as you probably know since we might have visited your club already. Lion Steve and I will be heading to Grand Rapids for Vice Governor training and meeting with the Council of Governors along with Governor Jeff. The weekend of our training coincides with the Michigan Forum on February 17th at the Crown Plaza in Grand Rapids. The Forum is a good place to meet other Lions and learn more about WE SERVE. There are 16 breakout sessions. Some of the sessions are- Bridging the Generation Gap, Time Management, Creative Leaders, Water Color Art Class, The Art of Recognition and Understanding Awards. The Keynote Speaker is Ann Guzdzial Chief Program Officer of Special Olympics. Friday there will be a large Group Service Project assembling first aid kits for Special Olympics from 7:30-9:00 PM. I hope to see you there.

This month is when I finalize my goals for next year and continue putting my cabinet together. Later this month I will have training with Leaders from LCI. This is where they scrutinize my goals. I have started putting my goals together and making sure they are SMART Goals. SMART means a goal that is Specific, Measurable, Achievable, Reachable and Timely. You probably have heard of this and maybe have used Smart Goals.

The ideas I am contemplating for goals for our District are still in the planning stage and will include specific and measurable numbers soon. The ideas are:

- Increasing the number of women Lions
- Increase service among Clubs
- Increase the number of Lion Members
- Start one new club
- Increase the number of clubs who report their Activity and Membership Reports each month.

I will be meeting with part of my cabinet to go over my goals before and after my training with the LCI leaders.

I am very proud of the clubs whose Secretary has been reporting the service as well as the number of hours served, that they are providing for their communities. Last year from July, 2016 to January, 2017, there were 10,981 hours of service reported. The total of service hours that were reported in 2016-2017 was 20,206 hours. From July 2017 to January 2018 clubs reported 19,559 hours of service this year with five months to go. How are we doing that? We have been averaging almost 22 clubs who do Activity and Membership Reports each month with a low of 19 clubs and a high of 24 clubs. When more clubs report service activities and hours served, we can use this data to show how Lions are serving their community and the world.

I would like to celebrate those clubs who have reported their Activity Reports and Membership Reports. We have 23 clubs reporting. clubs have reported both reports for the last seven months \bigcirc : Auburn Williams, Flushing, Gaines Area, Hemlock, Kingston, Lennon, Linden, Mayville, Otisville and St. Charles. Clubs who reported both reports also this month-Bay City, Bridgeport, Caro, Cass City, East Flint, Essexville-Hampton, Freeland, Goodrich, Grand Blanc, Millington, Shields, Zilwaukee. We have a new club that completed both reports and that is Fairgrove. We have reported 91 service activities and 1,608 service hours this month. Always remember WE SERVE!

He was very passionate about helping the community.



A GEORGE E. DALY AWARD has been established which is administered by a committee consisting of two (2) Past District Governors who are in their second and third years out of office of District Governor and three (3) non-Lion members of the community selected by the two Lion members and approved by the District Cabinet each year on or before the midwinter Cabinet meeting. The Past District Governors on this committee will act in an advisory capacity only and have no vote in the selection of the candidate to receive the award. The non-Lion members shall have one vote each for the selection of the candidate. The Past District Governor of the second or third year out of office cannot serve they shall be replaced by the Past District Governor the next higher year out of office.

The committee will select a candidate for this award who must have:

(a) Been a Lion at least three (3) years.

(b) Had perfect attendance for the past three (3) years.

(c) Been a member in good standing of a Club in good standing in this District.

(d) A Lion of high moral character.

Judging will be based on the following criteria:

- (a) Offices and/or chairmanships held in the Club.
- (b) Lions projects participated in.
- (c) Accomplishments of this Lion in service to the community.
- (d) Accomplishments of this Lion in service to Lionism.

Any Club that wishes to nominate a candidate for this award shall do so by submitting a form signed by the Club Secretary or President to the Chairman of this Committee listing the candidate's qualifications by deed and year occurred. The form for this award will be provided by the District.

The Chairman of this committee will receive the nomination forms and remove the nominee's name, town and Club. He will then assign a number to the form. The voting members of this committee will vote on their choices - First, second and third choice with three (3) points for first choice, two (2) points for second choice, and one (1) point for third choice. Nominees receiving zero points along with the nominee receiving the least number of points on the first ballot will be dropped from consideration. Balloting will continue with the nominee receiving the least number of points in each round dropped from consideration until only one nominee remains.

The District Governor, and the voting members of his Cabinet shall not be eligible for this award during their terms of office. No Past District Governor shall be eligible for this Award.

This Award will not be given if, in the estimation of the Committee, no one is worthy of the award that year.

No other award will be established in the District with any direct or indirect link to this award. The prestige of this award will be continually protected.

The Secretary's report was called for. CS Laura stated that we have a quorum. A motion was made to approve the minutes from the Fall Cabinet Meeting as published in the District Newsletter. The motion was supported and passed. Membership is up 18 YTD with 1168 current members. Lion Laura read 3 notes of appreciation we have received from McLaren's Children's Ward and the Foster Care system for blankets, and from the Hamilton Community Health Network for our participation in the Flint Health Care week and the accompanying ice-cream sponsorship.

CS Laura also reported that the Blanket Project has created and distributed 301 blankets so far. She also noted that Hall of Fame nominations must be received by her by the 16th of Jan. to be considered for forwarding to the LMF.

DG Hunt called for the Treasurer's report. CT Phyllis Pross passed out the current financial statements. A motion was made, supported, and passed to accept the report.

Governor Jeff presented the signed Centennial banner to Lion Shelly and also presented a Centennial Service Patch to the District and noted how rare they are. He also noted that 30 of our 38 clubs have reported activities for the year and encouraged

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the other 8 to jump in. He noted that District 11 D1 has reported 18,125 service hours so far this Lions year!

DG Jeff commented on the recent request for written reports and stated that they were intended to give details but that verbal reports were still encouraged. The RCs and ZCs should be doing the written reports from the LCI website. Written reports are also expected from the committee chairs if they are unable to attend the Cabinet meeting. Zone I: Glenda Kiesling has visited several of her clubs and is having a challenge with the Flint Downtown Club. Her next Zone meeting will be in March.

Zone II: Mary Hall is doing her 2nd club visits. Her 2nd Zone Meeting will focus on membership.

DG Jeff then called for Committee Reports as follows:

Constitution and ByLaws (Dick DeLong): Updates will be posted on the District website. The position of Region Chair is optional for the Districts and can be either appointed or elected at the discretion of the DG.

Diabetes (Dr. Melissa Gwizdala): She had an opportunity to visit the Caro Lions Club and they need money to sponsor a diabetes class. A motion was made, supported, and passed to allow Dr. Melissa to spend up to \$200 to assist the Caro Club's efforts.

Parade of funds income is primarily used to send kids to Diabetes Camp in Fenton; please consider supporting us at the Convention Parade of Checks!

District Convention (Bob Sturgis): He visited the venue recently to see all the updates and changes and the place is looking fabulous! We'll be at the Wyndham Gardens in Ann Arbor and the theme will be "American Pride." The room rate is \$79.

Laura noted we are again selling advertising in the program; see her for details.

PR Committee (Laura Hunt): Noted the yard sign orders are due and suggested the District purchase a few. A motion was made, supported, and passed to purchase 50 Lions Yard Signs. The money is to come from the misc. fund and will be repaid as the signs are sold (at cost). Lion Laura also noted the Covered with Love Blanket project has now generated over 300 blankets, all of which have been distributed. Some of them are going to kids in Foster Care. The program would love to have pillows to go with the blankets...A motion was made, supported, and passed to take up to \$1500 from our Quest funds to purchase fabric and pillows as needed to support this project. Congratulations to the Genesee County Lions whose work on the blanket project landed them on the TV News!

Sickle Cell (Dan Houston): 40 juvenile patients were taken Christmas shopping. Each child also received a blanket from the "Covered with Love" project. The shopping trip/blankets were featured on the TV News! He requested reimbursement for \$77 he spent on the kids. Motion was made, supported, and passed. A new member has joined the Grand Blanc Club as a direct result of this project and another potential member has been identified. 
1st VDG Joe spoke about rezoning our District for next year. He will be working on this going forward.
