#### From the 1st Vice District Governor



Lions of District 11 D1

February was a month of learning for me and it was great fun. Lion Steve and I had our VG Training two weeks ago. We learned how to work on Membership Retention, Leadership Development, Public Speaking and Thinking Outside of the Box. Later that day, we participated in a service project for Special Olympics. We put together 1000 first aid bags.

The next day was the Michigan Forum. I went to sessions on Lions Protocols, Time Management, Learning Opportunities and Lion Orientation. At Noon we listened to a very interesting presentation by Ann Guzdzial Chief Program officer for Special Olympics Michigan. She explained that the mission of Special Olympics is to provide year-round sports training and athletic competition for children and adults with intellectual disabilities. They are celebrating 50 years of health, wellness and fitness.

Continuing my learning, I attended the District Governor Elect area training in Indianapolis last weekend. Vice Governors from Michigan, Illinois, Indiana and Kentucky were there. We discussed Leadership, Membership and Service goals. One other topic was Membership and Activity Reports.

I was given a GST Action Plan which I will share at a later time, from a district in Indiana for completing the online reports. That District used the action plan and had 100% completion of Membership Reports and 97% of Activity Reports. WOW! Districts in the four state areas included 24 Districts. One of the reports showed the percent of clubs reporting, number of clubs, and comparisons to 2016-2017 in each District. How do we compare? The results are way cool!

One of the reports showed the percentage of clubs reporting at least one Activity and Membership report so far this year. Out of 24 Districts, the four highest were 100%, 84%, 83%

and 11D1 with 82%. That is really good. From July 1 to December 31, 2017, we were tied with another District for 3rd highest number of activities reported 804 activities. As I have said last month, I am very proud of the clubs whose Secretaries have been reporting the service as well as the hours served that they are providing for their communities. In 2016-17, our district had 20,206 hours of service reported. In only eight months of the 2017-18 year, we already have more service hours reported: 20,699! OI would like to continue to celebrate those clubs who have reported their Activity and Membership Reports. We have 23 clubs reporting. Ten clubs have reported both reports for the last seven months.  $\langle \cdot \rangle$ : Auburn Williams, Flushing, Gaines, Hemlock, Kingston, Lennon, Linden, Mayville, Otisville, and St. Charles. Clubs who also completed both reports were Cass City, East Flint, Essexville-Hampton, Freeland, Goodrich, Merrill, Millington, Saginaw West and Shields. We have a new club that reported both reports and that is Montrose. Reporting only Activity reports were Bay City, Grand Blanc, Caro and Zilwaukee. We have reported 98 service activities and 1,195 service hours this month.

Always remember WE SERVE!

One more topic to discuss, the Family and Women Symposium. The committee has been working diligently to plan a thoughtful and meaningful way to reach out to women and families in our District. There are 15 women from 13 clubs led by Mary DeMott, Kathy Bogar and Debra VanTol.

Their Goals are:

- -To increase membership of women and families in our District.
- -Improve the knowledge within the public about Lionism and provide services and Education to families.

Lions of District 11 D-1.

The below information is being provided to the Lions of District 11 D-1 to make members aware of the services provided by the clinic.

Any member that knows of anyone that needs the services please contact the clinic at 989-777-1040.

Special Needs Vision Clinic offers primary care optometric services by appointment at our office, receiving referrals from area educators, social agencies, ophthalmologists and assisted care homes. We also provide off-site care on a case-by-case basis, depending on need and location. We are handicap accessible, have adaptive equipment to accommodate wheelchair bound individuals, utilize alternative testing techniques to accommodate varied levels of cognitive function and apportion ample time to ensure that each patient receives a thorough examination. We have an in-house dispensary so that our patients can order glasses and we carry many specialty frames designed to meet the unique needs of the developmentally disabled. Low vision services for the blind are provided as well.

The Special Needs Vision Clinic provides

- Optometric Examinations and Ocular Health Assessment
- Low Vision Evaluations
- Eyeglass and therapeutic contact lens dispensing
- Eyeglass adjustment and repair
- Off-site special education vision screenings/exams
- Consultation with parents, educators and support staff
- Social/ Medical/ Educational referrals

It is not so much what we do that makes our program unique, but rather who we do it for. Our clinic was established thirty-five years ago to meet a service delivery concern for the handicapped population. At the Special Needs Vision Clinic the atmosphere is informal, empathetic and client-centered. This means there are few time constraints; examinations can be as long and as frequent as necessary, and communication with the client, family and support professionals can be adequately provided.

We see developmentally disabled children/adults, physically, mentally, emotionally impaired, visually impaired and legally blind individuals. Historically, we see between 800 and 1000 patients per year.
