





My name is Lion Mary Palmer and I am very excited because I have been given the position of All State Band Coordinator, 11-D-1. One of my many goals is for the "All State Band" to get the support and recognition from every Lions Club in the state of Michigan

I called the Lions of Michigan, Executive Director, Wendy Burns, and she sent us a CD starring "The All State Band". She referred us to "All State Band" Chairman, Dave Benefit and C.E.O. Becky Dahlke.

I called Dave and we talked for quite some time about "All State Band". He explained how "All State Band" operates. It is made up of high school students from all over Michigan. They are the 'cream of the crop', most all of them have a 4.0 grade average.

At this time, there are about '71' members. Most of them like to use their own instruments, except the percussion instruments, which are owned by the "All State Band" and are in need of repair or replacement.

They usually practice three times per year. "All State Band" plays at all International Conventions .

Next year they are going to play at M.D. Convention at the Holiday Inn in Grand Blanc. Fri. and Sat. on May 18 & 19, 2018 and International Convention in Las Vegas, Nevada June 29 - July 3, 2018, Thursday until Sunday.

At this time the funding for uniforms and equipment comes from Lions around the state.

Donations are not enough to cover everything. The individuals write letters to Lions Clubs in the area where they live. They ask Lions Clubs to sponsor them for travel expenses.

These kids deserve all the help we can give them! After all they are a Leo's Club, young professionals, and also in all the years of "All State Band" there have never been any behavior problems.



DG Jeff then called for Committee Reports as follows:

GMT (Leo Dolehanty for Dennis Poirier): Working on several new clubs and retention ideas. DG Jeff noted that we now have a President for the rebuild of the Downtown Host Lions Club. (Added information at a later date: there will be a Pizza Party on 9/12 at 6 PM at the Neighborhood Engagement Hub to round up potential members).

GST: (Joe Gwizdala): Each club should be looking for a NEW service project for this year. Blanket project "Covered with Love" is an example of one to get your club involved with. Remember to REPORT your service projects.

Newsletter Editor (Phyllis Pross) Please send your information to both Phyllis and to Doug Palmer for inclusion in both the Governor's newsletter and the Lions Pride!

Eversight (Jim Zessin): Verified the \$1500 sponsorship for the 2017 Clay Shoot had been paid. We will consider a 2018 sponsorship at a later date; let's see if there is more participation this year first. Reminder about the Essexville – Hampton Lions "Roar for Sight" event on 9/24. Also, on 9/29, there will be an Eversight Anniversary BBQ with music; details to follow.

IT (Larry Porn): Encouraged club Presidents and Secretaries to report recurring activities to LCI, including Club meetings. Larry is available to help with "My LCI" – just call him!

Kidsight (Keith Cregar): They have been busy doing screenings and have been using one of the LMF owned trailers or have been borrowing from neighboring Districts. We really need our own trailer. Chad (McCann) and Steve Van Tol are working on additional grant money to fund it. Total cost will be approximately \$23K.

DG Jeff noted that there will be a Family Fun Day on 8/18 in Flint. We will be doing vision screenings and serving ice cream.

LCIF (Bob Sturgis): \$20 Contributor pins have been distributed. Please give them to the Club LCIF Coordinator to sell.

Leader Dogs for the Blind (Jake Dasho): Bark and Brew was extremely successful and raised over \$115,000 for LD with over 2600 participants. It will be held again next year on June 2, 2018 at the Rochester Hills Brewing Co. PDG Jake noted that there are currently 1200 working teams in the USA alone!

LEOs (Deb Van Tol): The existing LEO Clubs have been very active. We are working on adding clubs at Bangor & Central in Bay City and on starting an Omega Club. Any area wishing to start a club can talk to her for help.

LMF (Steve Van Tol): Has a brochure about the various awards and fellowships available to MI Lions.

PR (Laura Hunt): Summarized the MD 11 PR Campaign successes and asked for a show of hands to indicate interest only in making yard signs available. Majority were interested. She also asked how many of those would be willing to pay \$6 or \$7 to have a sign; most would. Laura stated she will work on this and get back to the Cabinet on it. It will likely be an MD 11-wide project.

Quest (Doug Palmer): Understands the various uses allowed for the funds under the MD 11 Policies and Procedures. He stated that a pop up tent would be very useful for Kidsight screenings and other events, including membership information booths. Laura Hunt made a motion that we approve up to \$400 from Quest funds for the purchase of a pop-up with Lions Logos. Steve Van Tol 2nded the motion. A brief discussion followed and the motion was approved. Lion Doug will look into pricing and getting the logos printed on the tent.

Vision & Hearing: DG Jeff stated they are now combined and congratulated the team on how well they are doing working together.

Youth Exchange (Deb Van Tol): We had 5 students visit MI this summer. All were from Italy. Michigan's first YE Camp was held this weekend at the Optimist's Opportunities Unlimited Campground and was very successful. 2 LEOs attended as well. We are looking forward to building this camp both in number of days held and in number of participants.

Lion Deb then described a proposed essay contest for YE students. It would require a 500 word essay and provide up to \$3000 for the winning student to use for airfare, expenses, and up to \$200 in spending money. $2^{\rm nd}$ VDG Steve made a motion proposing we approve up to \$3000 from the existing \$15,000 YE funds to be

used as stated above. The motion was seconded and discussion followed. The motion was amended to add a $2^{\rm nd}$ place prize of up to \$2000 and a $3^{\rm rd}$ place prize of up to \$1000 with \$200 maximum allocated to spending money. All prize money must be used for YE travel and camp expenses. The amended motion was approved. The original motion was approved.

Governor Jeff then called for Old Business:

PDG Leo reported on the Flint Support (water crisis) projects. We received a formal report from the Neighborhood Engagement Fund detailing the equipment they have purchased as well as their intentions for the remaining funds. They included action photos of the machinery in use. Leo also noted that \$3000 had gone to the Michigan School for the Deaf, located in Flint, for supplemental water needs. These projects are a great step toward visibility and rebuilding the Flint Downtown Host Lions Club!

DG Jeff then called for New Business:

Deb Van Tol and Laura Hunt explained the 11 D1 Blanket project and demonstrated how to make a fleece tie blanket. They encouraged each club to make blankets and promote this project in their communities and noted that it could be a great way to involve non-Lions and to get them interested and excited about what we do!

Bob Sturgis asked about the Lioness Clubs and DG Jeff explained that a Lioness Club is a project of the sponsoring club and so are covered by LCI insurance. All monies raised by the Lioness must be reported on the sponsoring Club's I $-990.\,$ DG Jeff also noted that the "Rankin Lioness" are now being sponsored by the Gaines-Area Lions Club due to the closing of the Rankin Lions Club.

2nd VDG Steve spoke briefly about the importance of attending Zone & Region Meetings and that Committee Chairs should try to attend & ask the meeting Chair for a few minutes to speak. Also, use the DG's Newsletter and all our Facebook and online resources.

Governor Jeff asked for a received a motion to endorse the Little Caesar's Pizza Fundraiser with proceeds going the Special Needs Vision Clinic. The motion was seconded and approved. It was noted that anyone/any Club wanting to participate can get packets from Lion Shelly Hardt.

kids were screened (with 2 referrals) at the event. We had a couple of parents who were bringing


