The Family and Women Symposium was a great success and congratulations to Mary DeMott, Kathy Bogar, Deb VanTol and the Family and Women committee. was enjoyed by many, and our soonto-be-International President Gudrun, inducted four new members at the event. The participants were almost all from Genesee County. Hopefully, there will be more new members. I sent to clubs the information sheets on participants who came to the Symposium from their town. If you received any of these, I hope you can contact them and invite them to a meeting or service project.

Increasing clubs that do projects together is one of my goals. As an example of this, I installed the officers of Lennon Lions and the Gaines Area Lions on the same night. It was a very interesting night with club members learning about each other and their clubs. It was a great success.

We have completed two officer training sessions. They went well thanks to GLT Alice and 1st VDG Elect Steve. Thanks to Otisville and Freeland Lions for the use of your meeting places. I would also thank the Freeland Lions for providing the Pizza and drinks.

In the January newsletter, I explained the changes I wanted to make in the zones and regions. In April, the international directors voted that if governors wanted to change zones or regions, the governor's cabinet would have to approve. Lion Jeff and Cabinet Secretary Laura, according to the constitution and bylaws, contacted the cabinet 10 days before having a mini cabinet meeting. The meeting was to discuss the changes being planned for zones and regions. On June 19th, the mini cabinet met to discuss and vote. We had eight cabinet members needed for a quorum. After explanations and discussion, the vote was unanimous to approve the moves. The moves take place July 1st.

By the time you read this, Lion Kathy and I will have been in Las Vegas for six days and I will have completed governor training and the convention will just be beginning. Regretfully, I will not be able to celebrate those clubs who have completed their Activity and Membership Reports in June. I can celebrate that 33 out of 38 clubs have at least reported one month of Membership and Activity Reports. Nine clubs have reported every month. We have reported 1,400 more activities this year than 2017-2018.

LCI is very helpful with sample procedure guides for installation of officers. Upon finding and reviewing the officer installation guides, I was surprised. We have always installed the President, Vice President, Secretary, Treasurer, Tail Twister, Lion Tamer, and the Club Directors. But there is more! New to be elected and installed are LCIF Coordinator, Safety Officer, Program Coordinator, Service Chairperson, Membership Chairperson and Marketing Communications Chairperson. When installing officers at clubs, I have found that sometimes these duties are already being performed, so the title and installation is just a formality.


Using the new officer installation guide, I had the opportunity to install the officers in the Hemlock and St. Charles Lions Clubs this month. It gave me an opportunity to share the new positions and responsibilities of these chairs. These positions are shown on the revised Standard Club Structure flow chart.

To recap some history, the position of LCIF (Lions Club International Foundation) Coordinator was added two years ago. The LCIF coordinator is to work with the district chair to promote LCIF. LCI suggests the immediate past president fills this position.

With the addition of the Global Service Team at the district and multiple district level, LCI has now added this position at the club level. The Service Chairperson is to work with others to develop, communicate and implement community and humanitarian service.

The Membership Chairperson is not new but the installation of the Membership Chairperson is new. The duties of the membership chair are to help the board of directors create and implement a membership growth and retention program. It is not the job of the Membership Chair to recruit and retain new members, that is the job of ALL LIONS MEMBERS.

Another new face that requires the chair to be installed is the Program

Coordinator. Many clubs assign the Program Coordinator to one of the officers on the board. This person is to work to improve the club meetings by providing programs and speakers to the club members.

The Marketing Communications Chairperson has evolved from social media. This chair is to develop and implement a plan to publicize club activities to both members and non-members and to share newsworthy accomplishments via all available means of media.

Last is the Club Safety Officer, an optional position created by LCI. This person makes the club aware of safe practices and ensures that adequate supervision and insurance coverages are in place for all activities and events for both Lions and participants. This is a position most clubs (I would guess (99.99%) have never heard of.

Lions Clubs International

Starting on June 30, 2018, dues credits for membership drops will not be **issued** after the release of the semi-annual billings on July 1 and January 1.

In the past, Lions Clubs International has given clubs a grace period in January and July to adjust their club rosters and receive a credit for unreported membership drops. This practice has been a courtesy extended to clubs by Lions International despite rules governing the practice in Board Policy. The board of directors recently decided that enforcement of existing policy is necessary in order to be in compliance with Board Policy.

This will also provide greater alignment with district billing and create more accurate reporting that better

reflects true membership growth. We realize that this will have an impact on some clubs, so we would like you to help them prepare for the upcoming billing cycle.

Here are a few best practices that can help you prepare your clubs for their July dues billing:

Remind club officers to update their membership rosters using MyLCI or their regional reporting system.

Encourage club officers to submit their membership roster to MyLCI or their local reporting system prior to June 30, 2018 CDT.

Inform current and incoming leaders that membership dues credits will no longer be issued.

Please contact Accounts Receivable and Club Account Services at membershipbilling@lionsclubs.org if you have any questions. And thank you for all of the kindness and tremendous service that you bring to your community.
