I would also like to thank 27 clubs and the Otisville Lionesses for supporting our Childhood Cancer service project by filling requests from Hurley Hospital Pediatric Cancer Center and bringing items to the conference. Many Lions were very helpful by assembling the bags. The bags included coloring books, crayons, silly putty, Playdoh, colored pencils, coloring books, scratch art kits, watercolor books, warm socks, lotion, lip balm, fast food gift cards and hand sanitizer. Cancer Chair Lion Laura Hunt and the Childhood Cancer club chairs will be finishing up the bags at our house next week and then we will be delivering them to Hurley

I really like how the cafeteria looked thanks to STC Lion Donna Schantz and many H.S. students. The 20 minute general sessions plus discussion groups were appreciated and commented on by many Lions as a great way to learn and discuss. Thanks go to speakers RN Kelly Weiss, our own Lion OD Autumn Wicke, Lion Roger Blackwell and Lion Julia Embury. There was a good amount of interesting information, and it gave us many things to think about.

The project displays looked great set up in the cafeteria. Lions enjoyed a wonderful lunch, socialized, participated in the service project, received some Years of Service pins, and Lion Claudia Scott was awarded the International President's Appreciation by PDG Jeff Hunt. A cabinet meeting was held after lunch, but the exciting part was that Parade of Checks netted \$40,192.68!

I have shared five of my goals. Here are two more...

- By the end of the 2018-2019 fiscal year, the Districts membership drops will not exceed 150.
 - Action Step meet with District Membership team to develop a process to implement the community assessment program throughout the District.
 - Action Step-look at reasons why Lion members are dropping and ask how we can help meet their needs.
- By June 30, the district will add a total of 120 members, including transfer, and re-instated members.
 - Action Step-Find key people in communities, and ask assistance in implementing Lion services for unmet needs.

Its time to celebrate! We have 28 of 38 clubs reporting their Activity and Membership Reports. This is the most clubs we have had submitting both reports. 



The motion was supported and passed.

Nominating (Tom Thompson): announcing candidate for 2^{nd} Vice District Governor Duane Wilcox.

Lions of Michigan Foundation (Steve VanTol): need candidates for the foundation. Leo will take over next year for Steve. Working to get \$3000 for Flint to supply 100 children with glasses. The Foundation has covered \$690 for a single person. Steve is still working on getting 100 children glasses for \$30!

Leader Dog Puppy Program (Joe Gwizdala III): There is a real need for puppy raisers. There was a very low turnout for Big D. We need to make an effort to get more people to go every year.

Eversight (Leo Dolehanty): Leo is encouraging everyone to donate.

USA Canada Forum (R.G. Barnum): Next year's forum will be held in Spokane, Washington.

All State Band (Matt Wicke): 1^{st} program January 12^{th} , 2019. They are getting ready for the International Convention in Milan, Italy.

Leo Clubs (Debra VanTol): The Conference has been postponed for Leader Dog.

Bear Lake Camp has a position available and has been accepted by Ron Johnson. Leader Dog (Laura Hunt): The Pancake Breakfast and Bake Sale was a big success with a total of \$1784 raised. \$500 will go to support area puppy raisers and breed stock hosts and the rest will go to the Leader Dog operations budget. Family and Women (Mary Demott): Mary and Kathy are going to continue talking to clubs throughout the year. Encouraging them to have a Symposium in just their Zone or Region. They will need at least a year to plan the event. Please contact one of them and they will help in any way to make it a success.

GST (Joe Gwizdala III): Thanked everyone for the donations given today at the Fall Conference for the Childhood Cancer service project bags. There will be a service project at the Multiple District Convention (more information at a later date).

1st Vice District Governor (Steve VanTol): Steve thanked Alice for talking about committees. Working on getting written reports from committee chairs. Make sure you share monthly Newsletter with your club members.

Lions Youth Exchange (Deb VanTol): Essay competition is based on 3 questions on application. Ages 16 through 21 years old. 1st place-\$1500, 2nd place-\$1000, and 3rd place-\$500. Deadline November 30, 2018.

Kidsight (Keith Cregar): The year has had a great start. We got our Kidsight trailer and have installed the cabinet, chairs, tables, and ice box in it. There is a little more to do but will wait until spring. If a club has a screening starting next spring, they will need somebody with a truck to come pick up the trailer. They will need two of their members familiar with the camera and know

how to use it, the paper work that needs to be done. It's not that hard. Keith will be setting up classes this winter to train people on the camera and paper work. Keith would like the clubs to send a request that they want training. He will schedule 3 or 4 clubs at a time to get trained. Keith will also see if Joe Gwizdala and DG Joe can do some training in their regions. The more people we have that knows about the camera and paper work the easier it will be


