

of you and see projects like the selling of chocolate bunnies, Christmas trees, turkeys in the park, making fleece blankets, cutting 2,200 gallon milk jugs as luminaries, roadside pick up, spaghetti dinners, newspaper recycling, roasting chestnuts at a candle walk, making and packaging dog biscuits, serving donuts and glasses of cider, donate prize for village buck pole, 96th year IV football banquet for awarding Brown Jug, build a handicap ramp for a local senior, bags and broom sale, selling hot dogs at local car show, building play structures, winter light parades and Music in the Park. I have visited Clubs in my Zone at least 7 times. At times I feel like I am a member of the Shields and Hemlock Lions clubs since I have inducted new members installed officers, attended

members installed officers, attended Christmas parties, end of year dinners, helped with service projects and the list can go on.

When the Past District Governors and their spouse served as Governors they visited all of the clubs. Thanks to the guidance of DG Lion Jeff Hunt, last year we tried the idea of each of us visiting a third of the clubs. This year we improved on the idea. We chose clubs we did not visit last year and scheduled them. The Vice District Governors Steve and Harold have learned how to report their visits to International. If your club has already been visited from one of us or are scheduled for a visit, but you also want VG Steve, VG Harold or I to visit please contact us. WE Serve.

It is time to celebrate! We have 28 clubs of 38 clubs reporting their Activity and Membership Reports. Twenty Eight clubs reporting is the most we ever had in a month and now we have done it two months in a row. We have 14 of 38 clubs reporting for the fifth month in a row:

Auburn Williams, Bay City, Essexville-Hampton, Flushing, Gaines Area, Grand Blanc, Hemlock, Kingston, Linden, Mayville, Millington, Shields, St. Charles and Zilwaukee. Also reporting both reports are Buena Vista, Bridgeport, Cass City, Chesaning, Clio, Davison, East Flint, Frankenmuth, Freeland, Goodrich, Lennon, Merrill, Otisville and Saginaw West.

This makes a total of 74% of our District completing Service Activity Reports. This month we have 3,342 service hours for a total of 16,903 hours and 117 activities for a total of 478 activities so far this year.

From 1st Vice District Governor

Fellow Lions,

Busy? You betcha!!! The third training session as 1VDG in preparation for governor is November 30 and December 1 in conjunction with the Council of Governors (COG) meetings. Lion 2VDG Harold attends the training as well in preparation for his year as governor. We have the benefit of attending the COG, seeing our upcoming year's job as governor from a different perspective and meeting the MD11 Governors that will make the 2019-20 and 2020-21 councils.

In addition to the training before the four COG meetings, Lions International has more training for incoming Governors. This is the first year for an intensive three-day training in St. Charles, Illinois in February that replaces the July three-day Pre-International Convention training. The change gives the governors less work time at the International Convention

and more sightseeing time in the convention city. It also is more cost effective for International. The St. Charles training days are February 11-15, 2019. Still three full days of training! The fourth training day will be in Milan Italy just before the International Lions Convention.

Additionally, I need to mention we also have training on the Lions Learning Center prior to St. Charles. The Lions Learning Center is open to ALL Lions. When typing in Lions Learning Center in the search bar, you will be directed to a page which has a link to the web pages for the Lions Learning Center. The learning center has suggested classes for Governor, 1VDG, 2VDG, Past District Governor, District Chair Person, Zone Chairperson, Club Officers and Club Membership Director. Check it out. You never now where it will lead you or what you may learn.

On Friday November 30, the 1VDGs will be selecting the Council Chair for the 2019-2020 COG. This is just the beginning of the appointment, selection and election of the committee chairs for the Multiple District. These chairs are to assist the District Committee Chairs with their district work.

The incoming governor has the duty, honor and privilege to appoint the following positions on the District Cabinet for his or her term as governor. These include secretary, treasurer, the six zone chairs and three region chairs. In addition to these positions, there is the other half of the two-year appointments for several other district committees. Since she was a toddler, Kayla McDonough has lived with Retinitis Pigmentosa. "For 14 years I have adapted my life to my vision," said Kayla, "I made things work—but my vision has changed and now I have night blindness and very little peripheral vision." Kayla realized she needed to develop better travel skills because, "If you don't have mobility, you can't get across the street safely."

Kayla attended Summer Experience Camp at Leader Dog when she was 17, and at 18 she became a camp counselor. "The first time I flew alone to Michigan I needed a flight attendant to get to baggage claim," explained Kayla. "But the confidence I built during camp and over the following year made it possible for me to make my way to baggage claim on my own this time."

During camp, Kayla fell in love with the staff and environment. "Leader Dog had already made me more independent during camp," said Kayla. So, she had no trouble deciding where she would go to get her first guide dog.

Less than a week after finishing as a Summer Experience Camp counselor, Kayla was back on campus to receive Leader Dog Kane, a male yellow Labrador retriever. "Kane just kind of melts into me, he always has to be touching me," laughed Kayla.

Kayla is now a freshman at Kings College in Pennsylvania heading for a degree in business administration. She is living on campus and other than having to enforce "no food off the ground" to LD Kane when in the cafeteria, things are going great.

LIONS OF MICHIGAN HALL OF FAME OFFICIAL NOMINATION FORM

The LIONS OF MICHIGAN HALL OF FAME is a project of the Lions of Michigan Foundation. The purpose of the Hall of Fame is to recognize and honor those individuals who have had a significant impact on Lionism in Michigan and to preserve a memory and record of their service.

SELECTION

A maximum of seven individuals may be selected annually for enshrinement into the Lions of Michigan Hall of Fame. The inductees shall include up to four living and two deceased individuals. Past International Directors will automatically be inducted at the end of their two year term as International Director, and each year, one Hall of Fame inductee will be selected by a special committee consisting of the current members of the Lions of Michigan Hall of Fame.

SELECTION COMMITTEE

The primary Hall of Fame Selection Committee will be comprised of the members of the Lions of Michigan Foundation's Fund Development and Marketing Committee.

NOMINATIONS

Nominations will be received annually, no later than March 1. All nominations must be made using the Nominating Forms provided by the Lions of Michigan Foundation. All portions of the Nomination Form must be completed in order for a nomination to be considered. A detailed Narrative for each Nominee should accompany the Nomination Form to provide the Selection Committee with additional information about the nominee. However, the Narrative shall have no numerical score.

Nominations may be initiated by an individual or individuals, a Lions Club or a District. Nominations must have the endorsement of the District Cabinet (**one nominee per category**) before they are submitted to the Foundation office. Individuals nominated and not selected, in any given year, may be nominated in a subsequent year through the endorsement of a current District Cabinet.

INDUCTEES

Inductees and their spouse/guest will be invited guests of the Lions of Michigan Foundation at their scheduled induction ceremony. The time and location of the induction ceremony will coincide with the Foundation's Annual Meeting.

RECORDS

The Lions of Michigan Foundation will be the official repository of records of the LIONS OF MICHIGAN HALL OF FAME. All records will be retained at the Lions of Michigan State Office.

THE SIGHT AND HEARING SWEEPSTAKES TICKETS to roll this out starting in January. While applying for have been sent to your club. Club members, ask your Secretary or President for them. This is a great fundraiser for your club. Sell over 100 tickets, and your club will receive \$5.00 per ticket for all tickets sold. Sell over 300 tickets and your club will receive \$5.50 per ticket sold. The LMF does the paper work, licensing and your clubs earn funds to help with your projects.

ANOTHER REMINDER FOR THE LMF HALL OF FAME nominations. The nomination forms can be found on the Lions of Michigan Foundation website, www.lmsf.net under the Hall of Fame tab or in this issue of the newsletter. Complete the application then submit the nomination to the District Governor by midnight, January 16, 2019. The District Cabinet will choose our nominee prior to the LMF March 1st application deadline. Our district can submit nominations for one living and one deceased Lion.

The following is an excerpt from the October LMF Trustee meeting minutes on the Hearing Improvement Program. As mentioned before this is available to our District clubs. Note the new form has been approved and will be available for Hearing Aid requests in January 2019. It is very important to have clubs in our district support the LMF to fund this program.

HEARING IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM-

In your email packet everyone received our new affordable hearing aid selection form. We would like hearing aids will remain the same with the exception of Medicaid patients, we are asking the clients who have Medicaid to contact them first before applying for our program. We are changing the selection form around, so we can start to be cohesive with the Lions Hearing Center. We will have 2 levels, it will be based on income. If the client is below the federal poverty level 150% he/she will have the option of "level 1" seen in your packet. If the client applies and he/she is over 150% they will get the "level 2" selection form. With this change, there will be no more "free" hearing aids, there will be some out of pocket expenses. Clubs can either help the client pay for some or none of the expense. It's completely up to the club.

For example: Level 1 Phonak is \$150.00 each= \$300.00 to the client; Club can help pay some, all or none

Level 2 – (above 150%) Phonak Virto-ITE is \$350.00 each =\$700.00 to client; club can help pay for some, all or none.

Reminder this is just for the hearing aids, does not include the fitting fee that is a separate charge. Some clubs just pick up this fee and leave the hearing aids charge up to the client.

If you have any questions or need assistance with grant applications for emergency assistance, vision or military aid you can contact either 1VDG Lion Steven VanTol, or PDG Lion Leo Dolehanty.


