From District Governor Joe Bogar

Lions of 11D1:

I hope you are all enjoying your holiday weekend with family and friends and getting ready to say goodbye to summer! September is here, and club visitations will be starting. VG Steve, VG Harold and I have decided that each of us would visit 13 clubs. If you have not heard from us yet, you will.

The USA/CANADA Forum is a great for a life long learner. 🝋 It is in Columbus, September 20-22. There will be a STRIDES walk and a service project. There are 20 seminars on Thursday, 40 on Friday and 40 on Saturday. Examples of seminars are Ice Breakers and Energizers, Things vour club can learn from a Diabetic nurse, It's a Process by Nick Saban, How to attract and Keep Great Lions. Nationwide Efforts to Address Childhood Cancer. Club Presidents meet the International President, and Women make Great Lions. There are 93 other seminars. too many to mention here. If you have not been to a USA/CANADA Forum, put it on your bucket list. If you have been to one, you will want to go again. I have attended Forums in Grand Rapids, Omaha, and last year with Lion Kathy to Portland. We are looking forward to attending this year in Columbus. 😂 In 2019, it will be in Spokane, Washington.

Lion Julia Embury, who is the District Diabetes Chair, and I are

applying for a grant from Lions International on Diabetes. Each of the 10 Districts in Michigan, plus one in the UP, need to apply and come up with \$5651per district. If the application is accepted, International will match our money and triple it for a total of \$22,264. The money can then be used in our district for A1C testing, glucose testing, education and help people who are underinsured or do not have insurance. The grant focuses on people who have diabetes and don't know it, as well as people who are pre-diabetic. In our four counties, we have contacted 8 hospitals, 2 health plans, National Kidney Association and the MSU Extension. Each of these organizations has agreed to be partners in our effort to identify, and educate people about Diabetes.

This is why we will be focusing on Diabetes at the Fall Conference, which will be at ST. Charles Schools on October 27. Look for the flier in this newsletter. Make plans to attend and bring some new members who may never have attended a Fall Conference. It is great to meet other Lions who are passionate about service!

I want to thank the Bay City Lions for sending me names of stellar Lions to be nominated for the New Voices Initiative.


