Convention Update

Hello Lions. I hope this finds you and yours safe and well. As we look to the future the 2021 convention committee would like to propose the convention next year be held at the Comfort Inn in Mt. Pleasant.

The hotel has offered us rooms for \$93 per night with 2 complimentary suites and an additional room for every 30 nights sold. For early arrivals on Thursday, two complimentary drinks (beer wine, or pop) with hors d'oeuvres are available to registered guests.

We will not be charged for meeting space, if we meet a minimum of \$3,500 in food service. (As an example, this year's minimum was to be \$7,000). The hotel has completed some renovations in the meeting area including carpet and new paint.

As a further incentive, if we would return to the hotel for three years in a row, they will decrease the room rate to \$90 per night for all three years and guarantee the meal cost would not increase by more than 3% over the three years. (That would mean a \$20 meal in 2021 would only increase to not more than \$20.60 by 2023.

Club delegates will be receiving ballots for this year's elections soon. Please consider our staying with Comfort Inn.

We will be seeing a proposal from the 2022 committee as will. So please consider it as well.


