





## Lions Around the District

Bay City Lion's Club has been meeting recently in person

as much as possible and virtually. We are preparing for our Tag Days fundraiser on April 30<sup>th</sup> and May 1<sup>st</sup>. We held elections last Wednesday, April 24<sup>th</sup>, and Jessica Gregory was elected our new President.

Our main project over the last several months and still ongoing is food box giveaways at the Salvation Army in Bay City. We have





sponsored them on February 8 and 22<sup>nd</sup> and March 8 and 22<sup>nd</sup>. We will also do them on April 12 and 26<sup>th</sup>. There is a morning giveaway and a late afternoon one for essential workers. Up to 500 individuals have received the food in one day that we get from the Food Bank of Eastern Michigan. Milk, bread, fruits, vegetables, and meats are included along with canned and packaged goods.

Flushing Lions Club made a request to the Flushing
City Council to consider safety upgrades to install APS
enabled pedestrian traffic signals at the downtown area's
busiest intersections. The signals would be equipped
with audible cues for visually or hearing-impaired
walkers to help them safely cross Main Street as they
shop downtown or go out for a leisurely stroll.

The Flushing City Council received a cost estimate for pedestrian traffic signal and ADA ramp upgrades at Main Street and Maple Street and Main Street and Cherry Street. According to the report, which was conducted by the City Manager, the current estimate for both improvements would be \$65,670. Around \$50,150 would be for pedestrian crossing-signal upgrades and \$15,520 would be for ADA sidewalk, curb and ramp upgrades.

Although funds have not been allotted for the upgrades

Flushing continued

in the current budget year, the Flushing Mayor said that the city will look at the next fiscal year as a possibility for both projects. He said that a plannedMichigan Department of Transportation (MDOT) road repair project on the 100 and 200 blocks of Main Street for 2022/2023 fiscal year will likely include ADA upgrades, thereby reducing the cost for the city. The City should also be able to come up with funds to complete the projects for specific traffic signals that would be needed to help people with visual or hearing impairments. The city will also look to apply for state and federal traffic safety grants that may be available during the 2022/2023 fiscal year.
