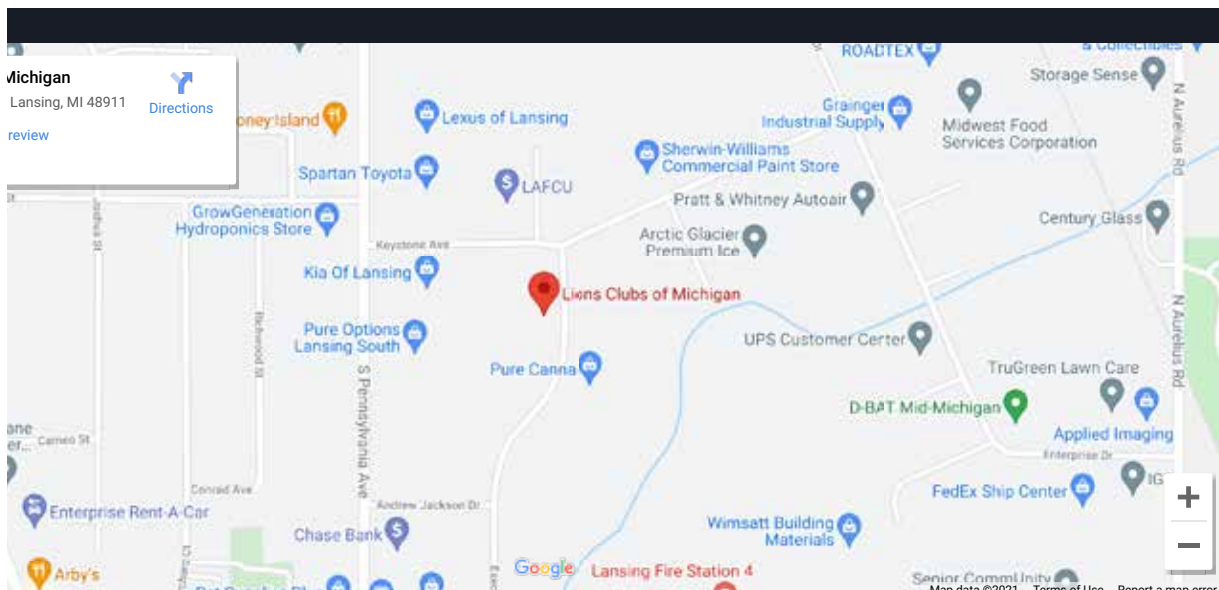

Dear Friend:

Dr. Robert Mathog dedicated much of his life to treating hearing loss and identifying affordable treatment options for Michigan residents. Until his death in 2014, he served as Professor and Chair of the Department of Otolaryngology at Wayne State University and as President and Chair of our Lions Hearing Centers. Dr. Mathog was a staunch supporter and a champion of our cause, and he recognized that fund development and the building of strong partnerships was necessary for long-term success.

Hearing loss is an extremely common, yet complex debilitation. People with untreated hearing loss are much more likely to suffer from depression, anxiety and unemployment, and they are less likely to participate in social activities. Most Americans will experience problems with hearing at some point in their life, and for many uninsured, underinsured or financially stressed Michigan residents, our Lions Hearing Centers will be their only option for treatment.

Please help us serve those in need, and please consider sponsoring our newest Lions Hearing Center fundraiser, a cookbook that will include many healthy meal options. The cookbook will serve as our primary fundraiser for 2021 and 2022.
