


LIONS CLUBS OF MICHIGAN DEFENSE AGAINST DIABETES PROGRAM D.A.D.

The Defense Against Diabetes (D.A.D.) program is an eight-week lifestyle change program developed from the CDC's year-long National Diabetes Prevention Program (NDPP) curriculum. The National Kidney Foundation of Michigan (NKFM) has selected key elements of the NDPP and made them deliverable in eight, one-hour distance learning sessions. Sessions will be facilitated via the Zoom platform by a trained and certified DPP Lifestyle Coach with experience providing the CDC's program.

NKFM's Lifestyle Coaches will work with Lions Club members to develop healthier eating habits and introduce physical activity into their weekly routines. Each participant will be provided the tools and support necessary to succeed at the program. Lifestyle Coaches will be available to participants anytime throughout the program via phone, text, and email.

I volunteered to help write the grant, Lion Debra jumped on the phone along with Lion Steve Goss and we were in the end able to get some immediate initial supplies free of charge from Sam's Club and Target. However, there may or may not have been a small accident with water bottles disbursed upon the concrete. We may never know. These items were brought out to the Midland area and dropped off at a designated location along with some supplies brought into the Freeland Sports Zone to the chosen United Way Location. The United Way seemed grateful but has not recognized our district for the donations as of yet.





Once we received the grant for our district, plans were made very fast. We worked with 3 local restaurants in the Freeland and Shields area for Food Vouchers for the people affected by the flood. We also bought pallets of water and bleach. Buckets were donated and we were ready to go. By now, we had accumulated several volunteers from the post on the district Facebook page and did not have a need to send out an email to the clubs for this round. We were shocked at much of the devastation and property damage, but the people were in overall good spirits and appreciated the small part of help we were able to give. They seemed very grateful that someone cared and wanted to do something nice for them. We saw a lot of smiles, some tears, and lots of hugs were freely given out.

North America Membership Initiative



1) What is the North America Membership Initiative (NAMI)?

NAMI is a focused program designed to address and reverse the decline in Lions membership in Constitutional Areas 1 and 2 (CA1 and CA2).

2) Why is this program important?

Evidence of similar membership declines is appearing in other parts of the world. We need to establish a solid plan for revitalization and growth before our organization's ability to serve humanity—our core mission—is fundamentally compromised.

3) What are the NAMI objectives?

1) Rejuvenate districts with new clubs, 2) Revitalize clubs with new members, and 3) Remotivate members with new fellowships and exciting service.

4) What are the goals of NAMI?

The goals for the pilot districts are positive membership growth and the development of scalable best practices. By June 2021, we expect 200 new clubs and 44,000 new members in CA1, and 20 new clubs and 5,000 new members in CA2. The goals for June 2023 are 315,000 total members in CA1 and 38,000 total members in CA2.

5) How is progress being reported?

Key stakeholders receive monthly status reports. Progress is also being shared at International Board of Directors meetings and at the USA / Canada Forum.

6) How will districts in North America indicate they will participate in 2020-21?

First Vice District Governors will complete a form, which will be available from the NAMI webpage, lionsclubs.org/nami, after attending the FVDG/DGE seminar in February 2020.

7) What happens after a district decides to participate?

Leaders from each district will meet to build a team, develop their own goals and a plan for achieving them.

8) Who leads the initiative in NAMI districts?

Part of building the NAMI team is identifying a NAMI Champion for the district, a leader who will promote and manage the initiative, foster execution and report results. The NAMI Champion works side-by-side with the district governor team, GAT coordinators, region/zone chairpersons, and other district leaders on plan development, implementation and accountability.

9) What are the roles and responsibilities of district governor teams in NAMI districts?

District governor teams are directly involved in planning, promoting and supporting NAMI activities throughout their districts. Individual roles are identified during the team building process within each district.

10) How are clubs of NAMI districts involved?

Clubs are the foundation of NAMI success. Club members will participate in NAMI projects throughout the year, including leadership development, club marketing and welcoming new members into their clubs.




