As a new Trustee on the LMF, I attended my first meeting recently. Here is some information that you may find helpful:

Emergency Individual Assistance Program:

Clubs should work through their District Trustees to submit emergency assistance applications requesting funds for any individual with a diagnosed medical need. Sight restoration, hearing, and speech improvement procedures will receive funding priority.

Emergency Disaster Relief Program:

Applications for a single-family disaster request for funds (up to \$1,500) or multiple family requests (up to \$7,500) should also be submitted through your District Trustee. A follow-up report showing how grant funds were expended shall be submitted within 30 days of receiving the funds.

2022 Group Cruise: All the cruise ship rooms are now booked. Thank you to everyone that supported this LMF fundraiser. We look forward to seeing your pictures and hearing about your adventures.

Cookbook Project Fundraiser: There is still time to submit your delicious family recipes for our cookbook fundraiser. Any club that sells 20 or more cookbooks will receive a \$5 rebate per book sold. The recipe deadline is October 1. Please see the district newsletter http://www.lions11d1.com/districtnewsletters.html for the submission form. The books should be available in November. All proceeds will be given to the affordable hearing aid programs.

Dr. R. Mathog Lions Hearing Centers: If financial help is needed to cover co-pays that were not covered by insurance, Clients should contact their local Lions Club.

Project KidSight: We are making the process more electronic with the use of a QR code. Training will be provided. A new trailer has been obtained for District 10 and some new cameras will be purchased to upgrade equipment where needed in some districts.

Mints: Remember to ask business owners in your community to display our mints. This is a great way to remind people about Lions. Anytime you have a Lions event, mints displays are helpful in drawing in people and supporting the Foundation.

INTROPUCE, INVOLVE, INVITE, INPUCT

So far we have introduced a member prospect to who Lions are, involved them in a club or community project, and now it's time to invite them to become a Lions member of your club.

Avoid the simple approach of asking, "Hey, do you want to join the club?" Rather take the time to tell the person why you think they would make a good member. Let them know they would be an asset to the club and the Lions organization, the good they can help do in the community and the fun they can have within the club. Do not make the mistake of suggesting they would make a good club officer or that they could be in charge of a project immediately after they join. Some may be accepting of this, but most people would be hesitant to join a group where they were thrust into

a leadership position.

Do not expect an immediate acceptance from every person, but do not write off those who are hesitant or say no. For those who are hesitant, find out why and address the issue, if possible. (Personal or family reasons aside). It could be as simple as giving the person time to become more comfortable with the group so don't give up but don't push.

If you have received a negative response, ask why. You may not be able to change the person's mind about joining, but you will possibly gain insight into obstacles to people joining your club.

For those who do not join, keep them informed on club activities. Keep inviting them to projects and see that they get the club and district newsletter.
