The purpose of this convention is to endorse the candidacy of Lion Dr. Patti Hill for the office of 3rd International Vice President of Lions Clubs International for 2019 and 2020.

For those wishing to vote and are not registered for the District C-2 Convention, you may be certificated Saturday morning in Salon 157 from 11:15—11:45 am and again at 1:30 pm. Voting will commence immediately at 1:30—2:00 pm in Salon 157.


Lions Leaving Lasting Legacies



25 Years of the Bearspaw Farmers' Market and Growing.

In 1991 when the Bearspaw Lions club was looking for a way of raising funds, then President, Lion Orval Grenon, promoted the idea of a market which would serve the northwest area of the city. In 1992, the now famous and extremely successful Bearspaw Farmers' Market was born.

After initial years of hard selling and slow growth, the concept of selling breakfast at the market was put into reality and the rest is history. It was decided to hold it only on Sundays to complement the Millarville Market which ran only on Saturdays. It allowed many of the vendors to take part in both markets.

To become "accredited" with the Alberta Government, 80% of the vendors must "make it, bake it, or grow it". There must also be no animals within the market bounds and to that end Bearspaw Market has a dog sitter who is

just outside the gates of the market who, for a few dollars, will look after people's dogs as they shop.

On September 15th, Bearspaw Lions Ward, Steve and Mike kept a close eye on the roasting pig at the 25th anniversary BBQ.




