

PIP Judge Brian Stevenson Contest

District Club Recognition Program

Policy Objective:

Increase district clubs' efficiency by promoting recruitment, keeping members, monthly membership and activity reports and interclub visits using contest and appreciation awards for the most deserving clubs.

Responsibility:

The district governor's cabinet approves this policy and the Recognition Program coordinator is responsible for its application. For 2018-2019, the Recognition Program coordinator is Lion Bill Stecewicz.

Application:

Admissibility

All the Lions clubs in the District are admissible and are automatically entered in the contest.

Timeline

From July 1st to March 31st of each year except for the PU-101 produced for April 10th and the registration to the Multiple District Convention for April 10th.

Appreciation Awards

Appreciation awards will be left to the discretion of the district governor's cabinet and given at the annual Multiple District Convention.

Procedure

The winning clubs will have tallied the most points in accordance with the preestablished criteria.

Rewards

One prize will be awarded to the top club in each zone. One prize to be awarded to the zone chairperson whose zone will have tallied the most pro-rata point average.

Scoring

1. LCI Monthly Membership and Activity Reports

For each monthly report received by the Program coordinator on or before the end of each month.

Membership	+25 per report
Activity	+50 per report
For all reports received after month end	+0 per report

2. Finances

District dues paid on or before Oct. 5 and Feb. 15	+50
District dues paid after Oct. 5 and Feb. 15	+0
MD C dues paid on or before Oct. 5 and Feb. 15	+50
MD C dues paid after Oct. 5 and Feb. 15	+0
LCI invoicing owing less than \$50 US on Oct. 5 and Feb. 15	+20
LCI invoicing owing \$50 US or more	+0

(as per the 60 days or more column on the monthly recap sent by LCI)

3. Zone Meetings

The presence of the club president, secretary and membership chairperson or their substitutes at each zone meeting +10
Points/officer/meeting

4. Yearly Club Officer Report (PU101)

Completing the PU-101 at MyLCI on or before April 10 th	+50
After April 10 th	+0

5. District Convention

Registration received on or before Oct. 5 (President, secretary, treasurer, lion tamer, tail twister, Membership Chair)	+20 points per person
All other members registered	+5 points per person

6. Contributions

Contributions (minimum \$100) must be remitted and mentioned on the monthly activity report:

LCIF	+50
LFC Canadian Dog Guides	+50
LOAF	+50
CNIB	+50
STARS	+50
Eye Research-Royal Alex Hospital Regional Eye Centre	+50
ALERT/LOAF (BC Forest Fires or ALERT operations)	+50

7. Community Projects (Centennial Projects) with some examples:

Used eyeglass collecting and hearing aids CLERC (sight)	+100
Food drive, Christmas baskets, feed the poor (hunger)	+100
Peace Poster Contest, Project Pride (youth)	+100
Youth projects (school, youth homes, cultural activities etc.)	+100

Environment (recycling, highway/river clean-up, tree planting)	+100
Childhood Cancer (walks or runs)	+100
Health projects towards diabetes	+100

A maximum of 100 points for each case regardless of the number of projects.

8. Zone Chair Official Visits

For actual presence (as a percentage of the total number of club members attending the official visit) as indicated on the activity reports.

90% plus = +40 80-89% = +30 70-79% = +20 60-69% = +10

9. Interclub Visits

Interclub activities – interclub visits with the participation of at least 3 members.
Maximum of 100 points +50

Representation activity – participate in another club’s activity or fundraiser (charter night, golf tournament, oyster feed etc.) +10

Points per person/activity. Maximum 100 points.

10. District Governors’ Official Club Visit

For actual presence as indicated on the activity reports (as a percentage of the total number of club members attending the visit).

90% plus = +40 80-89% = +30 70-79% = +20 60-69% = +10

11. Membership June 1 to March 31

For every new member +10

For every member dropped (except for health, death or transfers) -15

12. Web Presence

Building a website or a presence on Facebook. Must be maintained. +100

13. On-line Training (for each course completed before March 31)

5 points to the member club. Scoring supplied by the District GLT.

Maximum of 100 points.
