






# Childhood Cance

- Every day, there are almost 700 new cases of childhood cancer around the world. (250,000 new cases of cancer each year in children under the age of 20.)
- Childhood Cancer is the leading cause of death by disease in children in the United States. (Every day, 250 children around the world die from cancer.)
- Childhood Cancer treatment is no longer just chemotherapy and radiation.
- A cure is not enough. Surviving childhood cancer brings its own set of complications. (Two-thirds of childhood cancer patients will have long lasting chronic conditions from treatment.)
- Data and collaboration will lead to cures.
- Families often have to travel for cancer treatment. (Not every town has access to treatments.)
- Children, like gold, are precious and strong. (In 1977, a group of parents chose gold because it symbolizes how precious children are and their resiliency.)
- There is hope.
- Cups, miles and donations lead to cures.


