
had breakfast watching the many birds devour the seeds in the feeder. A busy morning for a retired guy.







"How are Lions Clubs formed?"

A group of individuals need to gather 20 members to officially form a club through Lions Clubs International. The club name MUST include the name of the geographical area, such as Montoursville; or may include areas around that town not being serviced by a Lions Club, such as Pleasant Gap Area Lions; or if a Lioness Club becomes a Lions Club the Lioness can include the Lioness name, such as Jersey Shore Area Lioness Lions Club.



"What is a Multiple District?"

Is created when a new district grows and it becomes large enough to develop sub-districts. The original single district 14 is now sub-divided into 17 sub-districts with alphabetical titles, such as District A; District B; etc.



"Where Does the 14 Come From?"

After the Lions formed in 1917, they started extending Lionism and we became the 14th District created was Pennsylvania. As the single district grew A represented the Philadelphia and B represented Pittsburgh. Since then we have grown into 17 sub districts.




