

There is estimated to be little or even no growth leading up to 2030, in part because Pennsylvania has a low birth rate with an increasingly older population, although migration to the area should remain stable. (left click to open the stats) The 2020 population is estimated to surpass the 13 million milestone."

As the Multiple District 14, we should be focusing on Specialty Groups and Ethnic Groups. Our statistics in these areas identifies there is a need for both.

According to www.worldometers.info, the definition of minority or minority group is a subgroup of the population with unique social, religious, ethnic, racial, and or other characteristics that differ from those of a majority group.

Take time to research your districts geographically to locate areas where there is not a Lions Club. Don't miss a beat to becoming familiar with those living residents.

Contact the governing council and ask to speak at a meeting to introduce the possibility of forming a Lions Club. Identify specific needs, such as walking around the area. Ask questions to drum up answers that will help you identify the specifics needs of the community.

Are there ethnic groups in the area? Pennsylvania's largest ethnic groups are Hispanic and Latino Americans at 18%, according to the previous census of 2020. District A recently developed an ethnic club: Montgomery County Nepalese Lions Club.

If there are ethnic

groups in your district, ask to attend their social events to address the possible formation of a Lions Club to have liability insurance, access to grants to improve specific areas of need, and the connection towards developing leadership skills.

Hearing from a few Lions stating the courses that are available to Lions has also assisted them in handling delicate situations at work. These are life skills, whether they are for work or at home.

Lions are a family. Let's pull all the 'instruments together for the better.' It is needed now more than ever. Let's band together, hold our heads high and be PROUD to be a LION!!



These funds support a wide variety of membership efforts and activities, from a unique membership drive to a team building exercise, to recruit more members and to improve the experience of current Lions.

3 Types of Grants

Standard Membership Development Grant

To ensure global representation, Lions Clubs International has allocated the following amounts to each Constitutional Area, based upon membership size.

Districts may apply for a maximum amount of US\$5,000 and multiple districts may apply for up to US\$10,000 for a Standard Membership Development Grant. If your district requires more funds, please consider applying for a Special Initiatives Membership Development Grant or a Large-Scale Membership Development Grant. Click here for more information about Standard Membership Development Grant criteria.

<u>Large-Scale Membership Development</u> Grant

If a Large-Scale Grant is desired, you must complete a Large-Scale Membership Grant application. This grant has a 3-year duration. The maximum amount for a selected Large-Scale Grant applicant is \$15,000 per year for three years, or \$45,000 total. Large-Scale Grants may have a retention or recruitment component, or both.

Special Initiatives Membership Development Grant

Grants that fall into the Special Initiatives Category may include:

- Replicas of previously successful grants.
- Grants targeting clubs with demographics targeted for expansion, such as men-only clubs or clubs with less than 15 members.
- Grants in excess of grant amount allotted for a single CA.
- Grants targeting special initiatives/areas/types of clubs identified by the LCI Board.
